Furthermore, no Flood Study or revision to the existing flood study has been performed by TxDOT contrary to City policy and no assessment of the increased flow on changes in channel velocity, flood elevations, Floodplain area and loss of developable lands has been determined. SCHEDULE: TxDOT is indicating that this project is anticipated to be Ready to Let in the Winter of 2023, yet final design is unfunded, and the project is not even listed on their 10 Year Construction Plan. Goliad, Rockwall, TX 75087. I am representing the Mayor and City Council this evening. The Mayor and Council had several obligations this evening and are unable to attend. But, I am here to represent their continuing support for the SH 205 Project and specifically the "John King Route" which has been the preferred route for SH 205 since before John King Blvd was actually built by the City in 2006 – 2009. During the bond election of 2005 in which voters approved the funding for John King Blvd., John King Blvd was always envisioned and planned to serve as a "bypass" for the current SH 205 route and the roadway initially built to four lanes, was planned and right-of-way was then secured for it to ultimately be a 6-lane roadway. Much discussion during that time was held as to the prospect of exchanging the current SH 205 route for the John King Route. Certain factors related to the exchange having to do with the TxDOT facilities policies ultimately caused that exchange to be delayed. Four years ago, when TxDOT began the planning work for the huge project for reconstruction of SH 205 from Lavon to Terrell the "John King Route" for SH 205 could and was reconsidered by the City, by the Rockwall County Road Consortium, and by TxDOT. The City actively sought this reconsideration and, finding it the most advantageous for Rockwall, formally supported the John King Route for SH 205. That support continues. It is the City's desire; however, to work with TxDOT and its residents to ensure that improvements to John King be accomplished in the most non-invasive ways possible for residents and property owners in accordance with TxDOT standards along the route. As there has been no acknowledgement of receipt or reply I am attaching a copy of the letter and resubmitting as a second request.* Please acknowledge receipt and a response or an estimated time for a response. In addition I would like to add another concern and supporting photographs. The area of John King/205 between Phelps Lake Drive and East Old Quail Run Road includes a double curve bridge three intersections and limited lines of sight based on curves before and after the curved bridge. There have been and continue to be incidents of vehicles departing the roadway causing damage to vehicles and signs. Fortunately there have not been injuries, however one of the most recent incidents resulted in an SUV with a mother and two young children leaving the roadway after the bridge and ending up in the trees down an embankment. The SUV impacted the East Old Quail Run curb and road sign before entering the treeline. The East Old Quail Run intersection was constructed as a one way out only design but is a two way intersection with a "No Trucks" sign. This results in vehicles having to come to a near stop before exiting John King/205 with following traffic on the bridge at speed and with no warning. There is no deceleration lane and the curves limit line of sight. My question is does this entire portion of John King/205 meet Texas State standards? Poor sight lines, speed and the design of the exit at East Old Quail Run Road make this hazardous. As the turn was originally constructed as a one way out only design, vehicles must come to a near stop before turning. This growth is creating ever greater demands on area roadways and causing undesirable congested conditions within multiple cities. The proposed reconstruction and widening of John King Boulevard, as well as the roadway's designation as the State Highway (SH) 205 corridor through the city of Rockwall, will provide much- needed regional north-south connectivity east of Lake Ray Hubbard while also improving traffic conditions for Rockwall County residents. The implementation of the project has two construction phases; interim and ultimate. The interim phase improvements, including improved connections to existing SH 205 (Goliad Street), signalized intersections, continuous sidewalks, and a grade-separated rail crossing, will bring much needed safety improvements to the corridor. The designation of John King Boulevard as SH 205 will encourage regional passenger and freight movements to bypass the downtown Rockwall area. The ultimate phase improvements, including an additional 14-foot wide outside shared-use lane, will improve the corridor's overall vehicle capacity. The North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) requests consideration to be given to other elements of Mobility 2045: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan for North Central Texas, such as the planned Regional Veloweb. The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is proposing improvements to John King Boulevard from the junction of SH 205/John King Boulevard (South Goliad Street) to north of John King Boulevard (Collin County Line) in Rockwall County, Texas. As a result, John King Boulevard would be re-designated as SH 205 and incorporated into the state highway system. No improvements to existing SH 205 within these limits are proposed. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting a public hearing on the proposed project. The hearing will be held on Thursday, September 19, 2019 at Liberty Hall in the Rockwall County Courthouse, 1111 East Yellow Jacket Lane, Rockwall, Texas 75087. Displays will be available for viewing at 6:00 p.m. with the formal hearing starting at 7:00 p.m. The purpose of the hearing is to present the planned improvements and to receive public comment on the proposed project.

The existing John King Boulevard facility is a divided, four-lane urban roadway within a typical 110 to 120foot wide right-of-way (ROW). There are two 12-foot wide travel lanes in each direction with dedicated left turn lanes at the majority of the median breaks. The typical median width varies between 41 and 46 feet. Discontinuous sidewalks currently exist along portions of the corridor on the both sides of the roadway.

The proposed project would widen John King Boulevard to an ultimate six-lane, divided, urban highway that would be designated as SH 205 from the junction of SH 205/John King Boulevard (South Goliad Street) to north of John King Boulevard (Collin County Line) in the city of Rockwall, Texas. The total length of the proposed project is approximately 7.6 miles within a proposed ROW width that varies between 110 to 1,000 feet. Construction of the proposed improvements would involve interim and ultimate phases. Interim improvements would include reconstruction of the existing John King Boulevard connections to SH 205, signalized intersections, construction of a grade separated railroad crossing between Justin Road and Airport Road, and the extension of left turn lanes at median openings. In addition, continuous sidewalks would be constructed along the corridor and would be 5 feet wide on the east side of the roadway and 8 feet wide on the west side. The ultimate construction phase would include inside widening and restriping to provide a 14-foot wide outside shared-use lane and two 11-foot wide travel lanes in each direction. The typical median width would be reduced to approximately 18 feet and dedicated left turn lanes would be maintained at the median breaks. Other construction activities would include drainage improvements and utility relocations.

Although additional ROW is required, no residential or non-residential structures would be displaced. Information concerning services and benefits available to affected property owners and information about the tentative schedule for ROW acquisition may be obtained from the district office at the address listed below.

Portions of the proposed project area and construction work would occur in the Federal Emergency Management Agency designated 100-year floodplains of Thompson Branch, Squabble Creek, Buffalo

Creek and Little Buffalo Creek. The hydraulic design for this project would be in accordance with current Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and TxDOT design policies. Approximately 0.08 acre of streams and 0.35 acre of wetlands associated with Waters of the United States would be permanently filled and authorized under a United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Section 404 Nationwide Permit 14 with pre-construction notification to the USACE.





# Abbott appoints experts to safety commission

rtgarrett@dallasnews.com AUSTIN - Gov. Greg Abbott on Monday appointed 27 people to a newly created Texas Safety Commission that will

create an "immediate action plan" for the state after the Aug. 3 mass shooting by a white supremacist in El Paso. Following up on the pledge

massacre to name a group that would hold "roundtables with experts," Abbott announced the commission would meet Thursday at the state Capitol in Austin and in El Paso on Aug. 29.

He has charged the panel with devising strategies "to provide community healing, combat the rise of extremist groups and hateful ideologies,

#### keep guns out of the hands of deranged individuals, and combat domestic terrorism, including cybersecurity threats," said a release from the governor's office.

Abbott named to the group himself, Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick, Speaker Dennis Bonnen and seven other lawmakers - including five El Paso Democrats.

He appointed eight members from local, state and federal law enforcement agencies, including Assistant Dallas Police Chief Lonzo Anderson, and Superintendent Juan Martinez of the Clint school system in El Paso County.

In addition, Abbott tapped representatives of Facebook, Google and Twitter; psychologist Susan Fletcher of Plano; University of Texas law profes-

Scruggs, president of Texas Gun Sense, a group that advocates strengthening gun laws; state health and human services czar Courtney Phillips; and pastor Tory Mayo of The Well, a nondenominational church in Austin.

Abbott's release said that "portions" of the two upcoming commission meetings "will be open to the press."

In a written statement, the Republican governor said the state "will not relent" as it tries to help El Paso heal and keep all Texans safe.

The plan will "address the link between mental health challenges and gun violence in our communities," he said.



The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is proposing improvements to John King Boulevard from the junction of SH 205/John King Boulevard (South Goliad Street) to north of John King Boulevard (Collin County Line) in Rockwall County, Texas. As a result, John King Boulevard would be re-designated as SH 205 and incorporated into the state highway system. No improvements to existing SH 205 within these limits are proposed. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting a public hearing on the proposed project. The hearing will be held on Thursday, September 19, 2019 at Liberty Hall in the Rockwall County Courthouse, 1111 East Yellow Jacket Lane, Rockwall, Texas 75087. Displays will be available for viewing at 6:00 p.m. with the formal hearing starting at 7:00 p.m. The purpose of the hearing is to present the planned improvements and to receive public comment on the proposed project.

The existing John King Boulevard facility is a divided, four-lane urban roadway within a typical 110 to 120- foot wide rightof-way (ROW). There are two 12-foot wide travel lanes in each direction with dedicated left turn lanes at the majority of the median breaks. The typical median width varies between 41 and 46 feet. Discontinuous sidewalks currently exist along portions of the corridor on the both sides of the roadway.

The proposed project would widen John King Boulevard to an ultimate six-lane, divided, urban highway that would be designated as SH 205 from the junction of SH 205/John King Boulevard (South Goliad Street) to north of John King Boulevard (Collin County Line) in the city of Rockwall, Texas. The total length of the proposed project is approximately 7.6 miles within a proposed ROW width that varies between 110 to 1,000 feet. Construction of the proposed improvements would involve interim and ultimate phases. Interim improvements would include reconstruction of the existing John King Boulevard connections to SH 205, signalized intersections, construction of a grade separated railroad crossing between Justin Road and Airport Road, and the extension of left turn lanes at median openings. In addition, continuous sidewalks would be constructed along the corridor and would be 5 feet wide on the east side of the roadway and 8 feet wide on the west side. The ultimate construction phase would include inside widening and restriping to provide a 14-foot wide outside shared-use lane and two 11-foot wide travel lanes in each direction. The typical median width would be reduced to approximately 18 feet and dedicated left turn lanes would be maintained at the median breaks. Other construction activities would include drainage improvements and utility relocations.

Although additional ROW is required, no residential or non-residential structures would be displaced. # **Decomisan 200** armas en medio de ola de crimen

Alcalde crea comisión cívica para reducir delitos violentos en la ciudad

Una operación de la policía de Dallas durante el verano en algunos barrios y contra ciertas actividades delictivas -actos violentos con armas de fuego y entre pandillas- ha logrado reducir el número de delitos violentos, categoría que creció en los primeros cinco meses del año, anunció el jefe de policía interino David Pughes.

Dallas ha estado registrando incrementos porcentuales de dos dígitos en atracos y asaltos agravados con relación al mismo periodo del año pasado.

El número de homicidios aumentó en mayo. La policía reportó 40, un total mensual que no se veía en la ciudad desde principios de los 90.

Pero en los últimos meses los delitos violentos han mostrado una baja. Los totales de un mes a otro indican una reducción de 5% en julio y de 3.5% en agosto.

La campaña de verano se basa en datos duros, lo que implica usar mapas detallados de las actividades ilícitas para que los comandantes distribuyan sus recursos y dirijan sus acciones contra blancos específicos.

"Estamos yendo a los lugares donde nuestros analistas de inteligencia nos dicen que se está dando la violencia, donde actúan las pandillas, donde se concentran los delitos con armas y drogas", dijo Pughes.

Líderes de la policía de Dallas se entrevistaron con el consejo editorial de The Dallas Morning News hace pocos días.

La reunión, previamente programada, tuvo lugar dos días después de que una niña de 9 años fuera asesinada el 14 de agosto cuando un pistolero de 19 años, en una riña con otro hombre por una canción de rap, disparó contra un apartamento equivocado en Roseland Townhomes, en la cuadra 3500 de Munger Avenue, cerca de Cityplace.

El lunes, el alcalde Erik Johnson anunció la creación de una comisión especial de comunidades seguras para reducir la violencia en la ciudad.

"Creo en el enfoque de la Policía de Dallas contra las pandillas, armas y drogas como algo inteligente y necesario para reducir el crimen violento en nuestra ciudad", dijo Johnson.

La comisión estará encabezada por el pastor Michael Bowie, de St. Luke Community United Methodist Church, René Martínez, un veterano activista ligado a la educación y Alan Cohen, presidente de Child Poverty Action Lab.

La policía de Dallas ha notado un drástico aumento de violencia de pandillas en toda la ciudad, alimentada en parte por los medios sociales y peleas por territorio, drogas y armas.

Pughes dijo que se destinarán más recursos a Roseland, y que se emplearán oficiales en turno y fuera de turno de trabajo para reforzar el equipo de seguridad privado que ya está ahí.

"Además, hay algunas medidas preventivas que estamos implementando en lo que respecta a obtener información de la comunidad que ahora no estamos recibiendo", dijo.

#### **Contra los puntos** más conflictivos

En la iniciativa de verano contra la criminalidad lanzada el 20 de mayo la policía ha concentrado sus acciones en ocho puntos de cuatro de las siete zonas de patrullaje: noreste, sureste, centro sur y suroeste.

Los resultados de la iniciativa muestran una proliferación de armas ilegales en esas comunidades, dijo Pughes.

La policía ha confiscado más de 200 armas durante la campaña, "y aún así los delitos con armas de fuego aumentaron un 25% en las zonas designadas", dijo.

"Es preocupante para mí que seguimos decomisando armas y no podemos incidir en el

número de armas. Eso se debe a lo fácil que es conseguirlas".

"Estábamos hablando con nuestros agentes encubiertos y ellos nos dicen que es más fácil comprar armas que comprar drogas en la ciudad de Dallas", dijo.

#### Escasez de oficiales

El uso eficiente de los recursos es un gran problema para el Departamento de Policía de Dallas, que ha tenido dificultades para dotarse de personal.

The existing John King Boulevard facility is a divided, four-lane urban roadway within a typical 110 to 120-foot wide right-of-way (ROW). There are two 12-foot wide travel lanes in each direction with dedicated left turn lanes at the majority of the median breaks. The typical median width varies between 41 and 46 feet. Discontinuous sidewalks currently exist along portions of the corridor on the both sides of the roadway.

proposed project would widen John King Boulevard to an ultimate six-lane divided, urban highway that would be designated as SH 205 from the junction of SH 205/John King Boulevard (South Goliad Street) to north of John King Boulevard (Collin County Line) in the city of Rockwall, Texas. The total length of the proposed project is approximately 7.6 miles within a proposed ROW width that varies between 110 to 1,000 feet. Construction of the proposed improvements would involve interim and ultimate phases. 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The project is needed because the existing

<sup>1</sup> facility is inadequate to meet the anticipated future <sup>2</sup> increase in traffic demand resulting in reduced <sup>3</sup> mobility. The purpose of the project is to improve <sup>4</sup> traffic mobility and reduce congestion throughout the <sup>5</sup> corridor.

The existing John King Boulevard facility is
 a four-lane divided urban roadway comprised of two
 twelve-foot travel lanes in each direction within a
 typical 110 to 120-foot-wide existing right-of-way.
 Dedicated left turn lanes exist at the

<sup>11</sup> majority of the median breaks, and sidewalks are <sup>12</sup> currently discontinuous along the project's corridor.

The interim phase of construction would reconstruct the northern and southern termini to tie existing John King Boulevard into State Highway 205 to create a continuous movement between the two roadways and construct a new underpass under the Dallas Garland and Northeastern Railroad between Justin Road and Airport Road.

These locations are identified by the yellow boxes on the map. Improvements also include drainage design accommodations and signalized intersections as warranted.

In addition, turn lane bays at existing
 median openings will be lengthened to accommodate TxDOT

design criteria. Continuous sidewalks will also be 1 2 constructed along the corridor and would be six feet 3 wide on the east side and eight feet wide on the west 4 side of the roadway. 5 The proposed right-of-way width would remain 6 relatively similar to the existing right-of-way 7 footprint and would vary between 110 feet and 120 feet. 8 In the ultimate phase of construction, 9 inside widening and re-striping would occur within the 10 existing median to provide one fourteen-foot-wide 11 outside shared use lane and two eleven-foot-wide travel lanes in each direction. 12 13 The typical median width would be reduced to 14 18 feet and dedicated left turn lanes would be 15 maintained at the median openings. 16 The utilities within the corridor that 17 require relocating would be adjusted prior to 18 construction to accommodate the proposed improvements. 19 The SH-205 Middle Project is anticipated to 20 be ready to let by winter of 2023 and is anticipated to 21 be constructed in phases. 22 "Letting" is when TxDOT notifies the 23 construction community that a project is ready to be bid 24 Construction on a project begins after the letting on. 25 process is complete. The total estimated cost for the

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1	ultimate project is approximately \$62 million.
2	This concludes the project information and
3	design portion of the presentation. I will now turn the
4	hearing over to Samantha Kannenberg who will provide an
5	overview of the environmental evaluation for the
6	proposed SH-205 Middle Project.
7	MS. KANNENBERG: Thank you, Jeremy. Prior
8	to December 16, 2014, the Federal Highway
9	Administration, or FHWA, reviewed and approved documents
10	prepared under the National Environmental Policy Act
11	known as NEPA.
12	However, on December 16, 2014, the Texas
13	Department of Transportation assumed responsibility from
14	FHWA to review and approve certain assigned NEPA
15	environmental documents.
16	Environmental studies were conducted for the
17	proposed SH-205 Middle Project to support environmental
18	clearance in accordance with NEPA. These environmental
19	analyses are necessary to identify, avoid, and minimize
20	effects to the human and natural environments.
21	Technical environmental documentation was
22	approved for further processing by TxDOT and was
23	coordinated with other public agencies.
24	Notices for this public hearing were
25	advertised in The Dallas Morning News, El Dia, and the

Rockwall Herald; on the TxDOT.gov Web site under hearings and meetings schedule; and on KeepitmovingDallas.com under public hearings and meetings.

The TxDOT public information office also prepared a news media release to advertise the public hearing. The TxDOT technical reports are available tonight for your review at the environmental table and are also available at the TxDOT Dallas District office.

<sup>10</sup> The technical documentation for this project <sup>11</sup> addresses the potential environmental impacts identified <sup>12</sup> during the preliminary engineering of the proposed <sup>13</sup> project.

These areas of potential impacts include natural, social, and cultural resources. This slide shows a list of all resources that were evaluated during the environmental analyses. The following slides include a summary of those findings.

A total of approximately 16.3 acres of new
 right-of-way and 0.7 acre of permanent easements would
 be required to complete the proposed improvements. No
 residential or commercial displacements are anticipated.

No public facilities, such as recreational
 facilities, churches, schools, or cemeteries would be
 displaced as a result of the construction of the

1 proposed project. 2 All right-of-way acquisition would be 3 completed in accordance with the Uniform Relocation 4 Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 5 1970 as amended. 6 There are representatives at the 7 right-of-way table to assist you with information on the 8 process that TxDOT will follow for right-of-way 9 acquisition. 10 Brochures, including two booklets titled 11 "The Purchase of Right-of-Way" and "Relocation 12 Assistance" are also available for you at the 13 right-of-way table here tonight. These booklets contain 14 detailed information to inform you of your rights and 15 provide information about TxDOT right-of-way acquisition 16 procedures. 17 TxDOT historians evaluated a total of 18 fourteen historic-age structures constructed prior to 19 1977 and found that none of them met eligibility 20 criteria for listing on the National Register of Historic Places or NRHP. 21 22 Properties that were surveyed for 23 archaeological resources did not contain any findings of 24 artifacts or archaeological sites that meet NRHP 25 eligibility criteria or warrant designation as a state

1 antiquities landmark. 2 Additional surveys for archaeological 3 resources on unsurveyed properties would be completed 4 after right-of-way acquisition. 5 Section 4(f) of the U.S. Department of 6 Transportation Act provides protection for public park 7 and recreation lands, wildlife and waterfowl refuges, 8 and significant historic and archeological sites. 9 Hickory Ridge Park is a Section 4(f) 10 resource that would be impacted by the construction of a 11 sidewalk within the park. However, the proposed use 12 meets the requirements for a Section 4(f) exception 13 finding. 14 A traffic noise analysis was conducted in 15 accordance with TxDOT's FHWA-approved 2011 guidelines 16 for analysis and abatement of roadway traffic noise. 17 Based on the analysis, six receivers are 18 expected to be impacted by noise. Noise abatement 19 options were considered for these receivers in 20 accordance with TxDOT and FHWA criteria. 21 However, it was determined that a noise 22 barrier for the affected receivers could not be 23 constructed due to right-of-way constraints and utility 24 Therefore, noise barriers are not proposed conflicts. 25 for the project. We can assist you with any questions

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1	regarding the noise study during the recess.
2	Portions of the project corridor are
3	situated within FEMA designated 100-year flood hazard
4	areas. These flood hazard areas are associated with
5	Thompson Branch, Squabble Creek, Buffalo Creek, Little
6	Buffalo Creek, and their associated tributaries.
7	Hydraulic design for this project would be
8	in accordance with current TxDOT policies. The proposed
9	project would result in permanent fill of approximately
10	0.08 acre of streams and 0.35 acre of wetlands and
11	special aquatic sites associated with waters of the U.S.
12	Regulated activities would be authorized
13	under a Clean Water Act, Section 404, Nationwide Permit
14	14 with preconstruction notification to the U.S. Army
15	Corps of Engineers. Compensatory mitigation would also
16	be required.
17	In conclusion, the studies, analyses, and
18	evaluations performed indicate the proposed project
19	would cause no significant environmental impacts.
20	The public comment period for the proposed
21	project ends on October 4, 2019. Following this
22	hearing, documentation of this public hearing will be
23	reviewed by TxDOT for final environmental clearance and
24	design approval.
25	If there are no major issues arising from

this hearing that cannot be addressed in a reasonable
time frame, final environmental clearance is expected in
the winter of 2020.

As mentioned earlier, the project corridor has an anticipated ready-to-let date in winter of 2023. The project is anticipated to be constructed in multiple phases.

This concludes the environmental evaluation
 portion of the presentation. I will now return the
 hearing to Lacey.

lanes. However, it was planned and right-of-way was
acquired to ultimately become a six-lane roadway.

Much discussion during the time of the bond
election and after that was given to the idea of
exchanging right-of-way between TxDOT and the City of
Rockwall for the existing Goliad Street and John King
Boulevard.

<sup>11</sup> Certain factors related to that exchange <sup>12</sup> having to do primarily with TxDOT facilities policies <sup>13</sup> ultimately caused that exchange to be delayed.

Some four years ago when TxDOT began the process of planning the much larger project from -- for State Highway 205 reconstruction from Lavon to Terrell, this provided an opportunity for the City of Rockwall, Rockwall County Road Consortium, and for TxDOT to reconsider that exchange and reconsider the idea of the John King route for State Highway 205.

The City actively sought and recommended a finding that it would be the most advantageous for the City of Rockwall and formally supported the John King route for State Highway 205, this Middle Project, on several occasions.

1 That work continues. It is the City's 2 desire, however, to work with TxDOT and with the 3 residents along this route, the improvements for John 4 King so that those improvements be accomplished in the 5 most noninvasive ways possible for residents and 6 property owners in accordance with TxDOT standards and 7 along the entirety of the route. 8 Thank you for the opportunity to address you 9 on behalf of the City of Rockwall and its mayor and 10 council. 11 MS. RODGERS: Thank you, sir. Next is Jim 12 Turner followed by Bob Wacker. 13 14 15 presentation, you state the projected purpose of this is 16 to improve the mobility and increase capacity. 17 I, as one, fail to comprehend how coming off a highway at 55 miles an hour, immediately going through 18 19 two school zones and seven stoplights is going to 20 increase mobility over what we have now. 21 It seems like there has to be a better 22 solution. I understand the need to move traffic from 23 south to north, but you're putting it right through the 24 middle of not just downtown, you're going to put it 25 right through the middle of neighborhoods and many new

1 neighborhoods that are going to be developed. 2 In all due respect to Mr. Crowley's 3 comments, this has always indeed been called the 205 4 Bypass and replacement are two separate words bypass. 5 when I went to school, but that's for everybody's 6 interpretation I guess. A bypass is a totally different 7 concept than a replacement. 8 And the last comment I have, and I 9 appreciate your noise studies, but I would caution you 10 on those because noise studies today have no meaning to 11 what will be there by the time this road is built and 12 developed. 13 There are several hundred new homes going to 14 be built right along John King and the City has allowed 15 those developers to back right up to the edge of the 16 easement without any sound walls, without anything but a 17 dirt berm. 18 And many of those homes will have backyards 19 that look directly on to this road. And under city 20 requirements their back fences are wrought iron open 21 fence. 22 So I would say it's very important when you 23 look at this (indiscernible) and look beyond what we 24 have today. Thank you. 25 MS. RODGERS: Thank you, Mr. Turner. Next,



#### **DRAINAGE:**

A portion of the John King Drainage Area south of the UP/DGNO Railroad that currently drains to the south is being redirected north to an existing culvert near Station 861+00 and into Squabble Creek.

Squabble Creek has been designated by the City of Rockwall as a sensitive drainage basin in which ALL new development and runoff must be detained to pre development conditions. TxDOT does not indicate that this is being done and their Environmental review has determined that there is no impact at this existing culvert outfall due to the increased runoff from their proposed 5'x2' culvert discharge.

Furthermore, no Flood Study or revision to the existing flood study has been performed by TxDOT contrary to City policy and no assessment of the increased flow on changes in channel velocity, flood elevations, Floodplain area and loss of developable lands has been determined.

#### **SCHEDULE:**

TxDOT is indicating that this project is anticipated to be Ready to Let in the Winter of 2023, yet final design is unfunded, and the project is not even listed on their 10 Year Construction Plan.

#### SH 66 INTERSECTION:

TxDOT continues to propose intersection and turn lane storage improvements at existing SH66 while indicating the future alignment of SH66 that has already been adopted by the City of Rockwall and TxDOT.



During the bond election of 2005 in which voters approved the funding for John King Blvd., John King Blvd was always envisioned and planned to serve as a "bypass" for the current SH 205 route and the roadway initially built to four lanes, was planned and right-of-way was then secured for it to ultimately be a 6-lane roadway. Much discussion during that time was held as to the prospect of exchanging the current SH 205 route for the John King Route. Certain factors related to the exchange having to do with the TxDot facilities policies ultimately caused that exchange to be delayed.

Four years ago, when TxDot began the planning work for the huge project for reconstruction of SH 205 from Lavon to Terrell the "John King Route" for SH 205 could and was reconsidered by the City, by the Rockwall County Road Consortium, and by TxDot. The City actively sought this reconsideration and, finding it the most advantageous for Rockwall, formally supported the John King Route for SH 205. That support continues.

It is the City's desire; however, to work with TxDot and its residents to ensure that improvements to John King be accomplished in the most non-invasive ways possible for residents and property owners in accordance with TxDot standards along the route.

Thank you for the opportunity to address you on behalf of the City of Rockwall and its Mayor and City Council.


#### Mr. Enders,

After receipt of the TXDOT Public Hearing notice I wrote a letter with questions and concerns on 19 August. As there has been no acknowledgement of receipt or reply I am attaching a copy of the letter and resubmitting as a second request. Please acknowledge receipt and a response or an estimated time for a response.

In addition I would like to add another concern and supporting photographs. The area of John King/205 between Phelps Lake Drive and East Old Quail Run Road includes a double curve bridge three intersections and limited lines of sight based on curves before and after the curved bridge. There have been and continue to be incidents of vehicles departing the roadway causing damage to vehicles and signs. Fortunately there have not been injuries, however one of the most recent incidents resulted in an SUV with a mother and two young children leaving the roadway after the bridge and ending up in the trees down an embankment. The SUV impacted the East Old Quail Run curb and road sign before entering the treeline.

The East Old Quail Run intersection was constructed as a one way out only design but is a two way intersection with a "No Trucks" sign. This results in vehicles having to come to a near stop before exiting John King/205 with following traffic on the bridge at speed and with no warning. There is no deceleration lane and the curves limit line of sight. My question is does this entire portion of John King/205 meet Texas State standards? If not why are there not changes and improvements annotated on the improvement plan.

Thanks for your email response. I realize that I had too much in my email as you asked for me to send suggestions to improve the roadway and I thought I had done that. So here is a stand alone comment/recommendation to improve the middle section of 205.

Recommend improvements to reduce hazards on section of John King Boulevard/future State Highway 205 between Phelps Lake Drive and East Old Quail Run Road.

?

This section of roadway includes three intersections (two with crossovers and two without merge/acceleration/deceleration lanes) and a series of curves including a double curved bridge. Lines of sight are reduced by the curves and the bridge barriers. The most hazardous area and location of numerous incidents of vehicles leaving the roadway is at the intersection of John King/205 and East Old Quail Run Road (right arrow). Poor sight lines, speed and the design of the exit at East Old Quail Run Road make this hazardous. As the turn was originally constructed as a one way out only design, vehicles must come to a near stop before turning. Traffic following at speed has no warning and minimal sight distance to avoid the turning vehicle.

Recommend that this intersection of John King/205 and East Old Quail Run be redesigned and modified to allow deceleration/merge out of traffic as well as acceleration/merge into traffic function. Recommend signage warning traffic of the hazard. Recommend LOS studies to inform of signage and speed limits on this section of roadway.

Submitted by the Regional Transportation Council and the North Central Texas Council of Governments, together serving as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Dallas-Fort Worth area, on September 30, 2019


Rockwall and Collin County continue to experience a significant portion of the extensive population growth occurring within the North Central Texas region. This growth is creating ever greater demands on area roadways and causing undesirable congested conditions within multiple cities. The proposed reconstruction and widening of John King Boulevard, as well as the roadway's designation as the State Highway (SH) 205 corridor through the city of Rockwall, will provide much-needed regional north-south connectivity east of Lake Ray Hubbard while also improving traffic conditions for Rockwall County residents.

The implementation of the project has two construction phases; interim and ultimate. The interim phase improvements, including improved connections to existing SH 205 (Goliad Street), signalized intersections, continuous sidewalks, and a grade-separated rail crossing, will bring much needed safety improvements to the corridor. The designation of John King Boulevard as SH 205 will encourage regional passenger and freight movements to bypass the downtown Rockwall area. The ultimate phase improvements, including an additional 14-foot wide outside shared-use lane, will improve the corridor's overall vehicle capacity.

The North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) requests consideration to be given to other elements of *Mobility 2045: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan for North Central Texas*, such as the planned Regional Veloweb. These plans identify an off-street shared-use path within the highway right-of-way for much of the SH 205 corridor. This planned off-street shared-use path is also identified by the *Rockwall County Open Space and Trails Master Plan* and the *City of Rockwall Parks, Recreation & Open Space Master Plan*. Such shared-use paths are expected to comply with the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) guidance for the development of bicycle facilities, with a minimum width of 10 to 14 feet, and will provide safer and more comfortable accommodations for bicyclists along roadways with high speed traffic than on-street 14-foot-wide outside shared-use lanes.

Today, the Dallas-Fort Worth area is the fourth-largest metropolitan area in the United States with over 7 million people. By 2045, the region is projected to have a population of over 11 million. Additional roadway capacity will be needed at numerous strategic locations to meet the growing demand from both passenger vehicles and truck freight movements. The recommended roadway improvements to this section of John King Boulevard are consistent with *Mobility 2045: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan for North Central Texas.* Because of the regional importance of this project, NCTCOG is willing to provide any assistance in the planning, design, and implementation of this project.

I am concerned about the proposed right of way acquisition indicated on your Schematic Plan from Tract R-804 at the Justin Road intersection. TxDOT personnel at the hearing could not provide our consultant with any specific design detail or analysis supporting their need except to say for slope purposes.

As the Pastor for Rockwall Friendship Baptist Church, the Owner of this property, I can tell you that we are currently in design and City approvals to develop this property. Our Site Plan which has been approved by the City and Grading Plan indicate that we will be matching grade along this portion of John King and that no such taking for slope purposes will be required.

Furthermore, the City has directed us to construct a portion of Justin Road extending east from John King in accordance with their Thoroughfare Plan and development policy.
