#### **Study Goals**



Address roadway capacity and geometry for existing and future traffic



Address increased crashes along the corridor due to continued population growth



Provide safer access to adjacent properties



Balance regional and local needs (mobility vs. access)

#### **Project Purpose and Need**



### **Project Need:**

The proposed project is needed to improve safety and meet future travel demands from projected population growth and traffic volumes.

### **Project Purpose:**

The proposed project's purpose is to improve safety and mobility to accommodate for future traffic volumes.

#### **Environmental Review – Right-of-Way**

#### Proposed Right-of-Way (ROW)

- Approximately 6.46 acres of new ROW would be required for the Schematic and Environmental section.
- Potential displacements include four residences and one non-residential structure.
- All ROW acquisition would be completed in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended.



Feasibility Study (north section) - \$57 million Feasibility Study (south section) - \$31 million

Schematic & Environmental – Approximately \$15.3 million

\*Funding has not yet been identified. Costs are subject to change.
