Net office leasing struggling

"For the last three quarters, the number of square feet of sublease space has remained flat," he said. "The real spike happened second and third quarter of last year."

About 9 million square feet of the surplus business space is on the market

"We have seen activity pick up across several submarkets, with inquiries, tours and proposals," said Matt Schendle, Cushman & Wakefield executive managing director. "Additionally, we are very optimistic about the second half of the year and 2022, with pent-up demand and inbound relocations."

Office vacancy rates in D-FW headed higher in the last year as the pandemic sent workers home. As of last week, only about 38% of area office workers were back in their buildings, according to the latest report by Kastle Systems.

The decline in office usage

About a third of the office space being built is leased, according to Cushman & Wakefield estimates.

has put a flood of surplus business space on the market in D-FW, with more than 9 million square feet of office sublease space being offered to tenants.

Just over 5 million square feet of offices were under construction in North Texas at the end of the first quarter, Cushman & Wakefield estimates. Most of the new buildings are

on the way in the Legacy business park and Frisco market and Dallas' Uptown district.

About a third of what is being built is already leased, according to estimates.

"We will see a few speculative building starts this year, but I don't think you are going to see the same volume you did previously because of the hesi-

tance in the development community," Baty said. "We still have quite a bit of vacant space to fill."

"Companies are just now starting to get going again," he said. "It's not like there has been rush of demand for new space over the last year."

Tyler Technologies buys ReadySub

Seattle-based platform helps school districts manage substitutes

Plano-based Tyler Technologies will add nearly 1,000 school districts to its client portfolio with the acquisition of cloud-based school logistics platform ReadySub.

Seattle-based ReadySub provides a digital platform for schools to manage absences, substitute teacher availability and scheduling. The company

employs 10 staff members who will remain in Seattle, according to Tyler Technologies.

The acquisition comes as a shortage of substitute teachers in Texas schools is hampering educators across the state. Teachers who get sick during the COVID-19 pandemic or who have to isolate can require on-the-spot stand-ins and substitutes as districts struggle to keep classrooms fully staffed.

The ReadySub platform works on smartphones and tablets and allows substitute teachers to make themselves known to school districts that

are looking for an extra hand, according to a release.

"We plan to build integrations with our school administration products, providing more value to districts as we help them implement all-in-one workflows," Tyler Technologies president and CEO Lynn Moore said in a statement. "This supports our Connected Communities vision as we work with clients to tie together these disparate processes."

Tyler Technologies said ReadySub's platform can help school districts more reliably retain substitute teachers

through automating scheduling and payroll processes. ReadySub's nearly 1,000 school district clients will help Tyler expand past the 2,000 U.S. school districts it already serves.

Tyler, which supplies tech solutions to the public sector, has grown quickly in recent years through acquisitions and software development.

It recently announced its largest acquisition ever with a \$2.3 billion deal to buy Kansas-based government payments company NIC Inc.

Investor buys Dallas post office building

Top four floors were turned into luxury apartments in 2011

A Plano-based investor has bought one of downtown Dallas' most historic properties. The 91-year-old U.S. Post Office and Courthouse building at 400 N. Ervay St. just sold.

In 2011, the upper four floors of the downtown landmark were converted into 78 luxury apartments. Since 2016, the rental units have

been owned by an out-of-state investor, Boston-based Berkshire Group.

Now the apartment community has been bought by a company created by Plano-based Wolfe Investments LLC, county records show.

The purchase was financed with a \$13.5 million loan handled by Virginia-based GreyStone Servicing Co.

A year ago, the property was put up for sale and commercial real estate firm JLL marketed the building. When the building went on the market, the apartments were more than 90% leased with

rents averaging almost \$1,800 a month.

There's a rooftop deck and ground-floor retail space.

And the U.S. Postal Service also operates its downtown branch in the building — just as it did when it was built in

1930.

Yellen urges end to 'tax competition'

She seeks to soften fallout from proposed U.S. corporate hike

WASHINGTON — U.S. Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen on Monday urged the adoption of a minimum global corporate income tax, an effort to offset any disadvantages that might arise from the Biden administration's proposed increase in the U.S. corporate tax rate.

Citing a "30-year race to the bottom" in which countries have slashed corporate tax rates in an effort to attract multinational businesses, Yellen said the Biden administration would work with other advanced economies in the Group of 20 to set a minimum.

"Competitiveness is about more than how U.S.-headquartered companies fare against other companies in global merger and acquisition bids," Yellen said in a virtual speech to the Chicago Council on Global Affairs. "It is about making sure that governments have stable tax systems that raise sufficient revenue to invest in essential public goods."

The speech was Yellen's highest-profile so far on international affairs, and came just as the spring meetings of the World Bank and International Monetary Fund began in a virtual format.

"It is important to work with other countries to end the pressures of tax competition and corporate tax base erosion," Yellen said.

Sen. Pat Toomey, R-Penn., said that Yellen's proposal was

unlikely to make much progress overseas. He also said Republicans should reverse any corporate tax hike if they regain a congressional majority in upcoming elections.

"Spoiler alert: This effort will likely fail and even if there is some sort of agreement, it will be non-binding because it is not a treaty," Toomey said.

President Joe Biden has proposed hiking the U.S. corporate tax rate to 28% from 21%, partially undoing the Trump administration's cut from 35% in its 2017 tax legislation. Biden also wants to set a minimum U.S. tax on overseas corporate income, and to make it harder for companies to shift earnings offshore. The increase would help pay for the White House's ambitious \$2.3 trillion infrastructure proposal.

Also on Monday, Biden said he is "not at all" concerned that a higher corporate tax rate would cause some U.S. companies to relocate overseas, though Yellen's proposed global minimum corporate tax is intended to prevent that from happening.

According to the Tax Foundation, a right-leaning think tank, the Trump administration's corporate tax reduction lowered the U.S. rate from the highest among the 37 advanced economies in the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development to the 13th highest. Many analysts have argued, however, that few large U.S. multinationals paid the full tax.

es to more clients and building meaningful relationships with those who seek financial guidance from our team of dedicated professionals."

The company will continue to maintain a presence in the markets it now serves, including its existing bank and wealth management headquarters in Irvine, Calif., according to First Foundation.

Mixed-use pitched for old Fry's site

California firm plans apartments, offices, a hotel and retail space

A California-based developer is working on plans for a new mixed-use project in Plano.

The 19-acre development would be on the site of the former Fry's Electronics store between Bush Turnpike and Plano Parkway, just east of U.S. Highway 75.

Bay West Development is seeking zoning to replace the vacant Fry's store with two five-story apartment buildings, a six-story office building and an eight-story hotel.

"This request includes 833 units on two lots," according to details of the apartments in-

cluded in the zoning request. "This proposed development appears to be providing a similar product to the existing multifamily development to the east across Executive Drive, not really adding variety."

"The proposed development is mid-rise residential and may be at a higher density, but is very similar in location and form."

The two apartment buildings would be at the north end of the property on Plano Parkway.

At the south end of the site, the office building would include 123,600 square feet of space.

The hotel would face Bush Turnpike.

In February, San Jose, Calif.-based Fry's said it was closing all its locations, which includes North Texas stores in Plano, Dallas, Arlington and Irving.

The Fry's store site is just across Bush Turnpike from the massive CityLine mixed-use project, which has high-rise offices, apartments, a hotel and retail space.

Bay West Development is located in the San Francisco Bay Area and dates to the late 1970s. The company has a track record of buying and building multifamily residential, office, industrial and retail projects.

"The company has chosen to concentrate its efforts in urban areas where high concentrations of talented young people in the fields of technology, multimedia, and biotech are based and where a prominent amount of knowledge-based economic factors exist," Bay West says on its company website.

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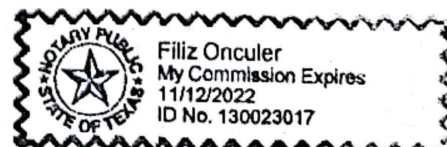

Pasajeros usan mascarillas en el Aeropuerto Internacional Dallas Fort Worth. Los CDC determinaron que quienes ya se pusieron sus dosis de la vacuna no enfrentan restricciones para volar.

Menos restricciones

Las aerolíneas han comenzado a flexibilizar algunas restricciones, incluida la apertura de los asientos del medio que antes tenían que permanecer vacíos debido a la pandemia. Solo queda Delta Air Lines, que extendió esta precaución hasta el 30 de abril.

Las aerolíneas también están volviendo a ofrecer localidades y bebidas después de detener el servicio el año pasado para limitar el contacto entre los asistentes de vuelo y los pasajeros.

La nueva guía de CDC dice:

- Las personas completamente vacunadas pueden viajar dentro de Estados Unidos sin hacerse la prueba del coronavirus ni ponerse en cuarentena. La gente aún debe usar una mascarilla, distanciarse socialmente y evitar las multitudes.
- Para viajes internacionales, la agencia informó que las personas vacunadas no necesitan hacerse una prueba de covid-19 antes de partir, aunque algunos destinos pueden requerirla.
- Las personas vacunadas aún deben obtener una prueba de covid-19 negativa antes de abordar un vuelo de regreso a Estados Unidos y deben hacerse otra prueba entre 3 a 5 días después de regresar. No necesitan ponerse en cuarentena. La agencia señaló la posible introducción de variantes de virus y las diferencias en la cobertura de la vacuna en todo el mundo como guía cautelosa sobre viajes al extranjero.

Los CDC citaron investigaciones recientes sobre los efectos de las vacunas en el mundo real para actualizar su recomendación.

La agencia ya había dicho que las personas completamente vacunadas podían visitar sin usar mascarillas ni distanciarse socialmente a otras personas también vacunadas. También dijo que las personas vacunadas pueden visitar a personas no vacunadas de un solo hogar en condiciones similares, siempre que las personas no vacunadas tengan un riesgo bajo de contraer una enfermedad grave si se infectan.

Personas con vacuna completa contra covid-19 pueden viajar de nuevo

Nueva York — Los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades actualizaron sus recomendaciones sobre cuidados en la pandemia, las cuales permiten que personas completamente vacunadas puedan viajar dentro Estados Unidos, sin tener que hacerse la prueba de coronavirus y sin tener

que entrar en cuarentena después. La agencia sigue recomendando usar mascarilla y distanciamiento social.

Previamente, la agencia recomendaba evitar los viajes innecesarios incluso para personas vacunadas, pero señaló que actualizaría su guía a medida que más personas se vacunarán y se acumularán pruebas sobre la protección que brin-

dan las vacunas. "Todos los días se obtienen más datos", dijo el doctor Ali Khan, decano de la Facultad de Salud Pública de la Universidad de Nebraska.

Khan dijo que la actualización a estas recomendaciones refuerza la seguridad y la eficacia de las vacunas y es otro incentivo para que las personas se vacunen.

Según los CDC, casi 100 millones

de personas en Estados Unidos, o alrededor del 30% de la población, han recibido al menos una dosis de la vacuna contra covid-19. Se considera que una persona está completamente vacunada dos semanas después de recibir la última dosis requerida de vacuna.

CDC sigue recomendando que personas no vacunadas eviten viajes innecesarios.

Existen protecciones para evitar desalojos

Un constable (o alguacil ministerial) del condado de Dallas está asegurando a los residentes de West Dallas y del este de la ciudad que su oficina manejará desalojos por renta no pagada "en cumplimiento con las guías de la Corte Suprema de Texas y de los CDC", días después de que *The Dallas Morning News* y *Al Día* reportaran sobre un desalojo ilegal de una madre y sus tres hijos.

El constable del Precinto 5, Michael Orozco, no citó específicamente el desalojo de Jonny McKinley en su comunicado del jueves, pero definió de "manera detallada", cómo quiere que sus agentes manejen estos casos en su jurisdicción. Su oficina no mencionó el caso que fue objeto del reportaje en *The News*.

"Es de vital importancia que todas las reglas o leyes federales, estatales y locales sean cumplidas, y que se provea a cada parte con la capacidad de seguir con sus recursos legales y reparaciones de manera acorde, y que siempre seamos imparciales y justos con todas las partes involucradas", dijo Orozco en su comunicado.

"Quiero aprovechar este momento para asegurar a mis conciudadanos los procedimientos de mi departamento en lo que se refiere a desalojos durante la pandemia de covid-19".

El viernes, McKinley, de 29 años y sus tres hijas en edad escolar fueron desalojadas de su apartamento en el norte de Dallas ubicado en

Tribeca en la Creek luego de haber incumplido el pago de renta por un mes y medio.

El abogado de McKinley, Mark Melton, dijo "la corte, el constable y el casero se equivocaron" porque McKinley sí les dio una declaración de los CDC antes de su desalojo a todas las partes involucradas.

El constable Ben Adamcik, cuyo Precinto 3 estuvo involucrado en el desalojo de McKinley, dijo esta semana que su dependencia "no tenía información que incluyera una declaración de los CDC". El juez Al Cercone dijo a *The News* que su oficina sí recibió la declaración de McKinley pero consideró que era responsabilidad del dueño de casa de cancelar su desalojo y reestablecer su contrato de arrendamiento.

Cuando *The News* empezó a hacer preguntas sobre el caso de McKinley, el casero lo reconsideró y reestableció su contrato.

Orozco envió su directiva a todos sus agentes en el Precinto 5 para reforzar cómo deben actuar cuando un residente, de conocimiento de las protecciones federales bajo las órdenes de los Centros para el Control y Prevención de Enfermedades.

Si el inquilino le da a los agentes una copia de la declaración de los CDC, Orozco dijo que su oficina "dará por terminado el proceso de sacar los bienes del inquilino y el desalojo debe quedar suspendido hasta que la corte revise la declaración".

Llevar dosis a las casas de aquellos con dificultades para movilizarse

El primer programa de vacunación a domicilio entre residentes de Dallas comenzó esta semana luego de haber sido retrasado debido al pedido federal de pausar la distribución de las vacunas de Johnson & Johnson.

Personal de Dallas Fire-Rescue y la Asociación de Enfermeras Visitadoras de Dallas ahora darán las vacunas de Moderna a los residentes que son parte del programa Meals on Wheels, dijo Rocky Vaz, director de manejo de emergencias de la ciudad. Moderna requiere dos dosis espaciadas en cuatro semanas para obtener el máximo de su efectividad.

El programa debía usar vacunas de

Dosis en casa

Para vacunarse contra covid-19 llame a la Ciudad de Dallas al 214-670-4636. Pida servicio a domicilio si no puede movilizarse hasta un centro de vacunación.

Johnson & Johnson a partir del martes, pero la ciudad suspendió el programa horas antes de lo que debía empezar debido al anuncio de la FDA y los CDC de que había inusuales casos de trombosis en seis mujeres.

Más de 7 millones de dosis de esa vacuna han sido administradas en Estados Unidos.

“No vamos a poder vacunar tanta gente en ocho semanas como habíamos pensado, pero era importante para nosotros empezar a vacunar personas que no pueden salir de sus casas lo más pronto posible”, dijo Vaz.

Unas 300 dosis de Moderna en el sitio de vacunación de la ciudad en The Potter's House serán utilizadas para este

programa, explicó. Alrededor de 60 personas diarias recibirán sus inyecciones de lunes a viernes.

El plan continuará por las próximas semanas y las vacunas de Johnson & Johnson pueden ser reconsideradas si es que la FDA y los CDC dan luz verde a que se pueda retomar esas dosis, añadió Vaz.

Ninguno de los casos de trombosis o coágulos sanguíneos se dieron en Texas, en donde se han aplicado 500,000 de estas dosis. El estado ordenó que los proveedores suspendan la administración de vacunas de Johnson & Johnson pero recomendó que se las mantenga almacenadas.

La Asociación de Enfermeras Visitadoras de Texas son parte del esfuerzo de vacunación a domicilio en otras ciudades del condado de Dallas como DeSoto y Duncanville, y de otras iniciativas para vacunar adultos mayores en otras partes del estado.

Planean retomar Johnson & Johnson

Washington — Estados Unidos tomará medidas para reanudar la aplicación de la vacuna para covid-19 de Johnson & Johnson en los próximos días, posiblemente con restricciones o advertencias más amplias después de informes de algunos casos muy raros de coágulos sanguíneos, informó el domingo el principal experto en enfermedades infecciosas del gobierno.

En una serie de entrevistas a programas de noticias, el doctor Anthony Fauci dijo que se tomará una decisión una vez que los asesores de los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades de Estados Unidos (CDC, por

sus siglas en inglés) se reúnan el viernes para analizar si se reanuda la aplicación de la vacuna de J&J, que es de dosis única.

“Me sorprendería mucho si no tenemos una reanudación de alguna forma para el viernes”, dijo. “Realmente no anticipo que vayan a querer extenderlo un poco más”.

Fauci, quien es el asesor médico en jefe del presidente Joe Biden, cree que los reguladores federales podrían reanudar la aplicación de las vacunas con restricciones de edad o género o con una advertencia general, para que se aplique de una manera “un poco diferente a como se hacía antes de la pausa”.

La vacuna de J&J ha estado

en el limbo después de que los CDC y la Administración de Medicamentos y Alimentos (FDA) dijeron la semana pasada que necesitaban más evidencia para decidir si algunos casos de coágulos estaban relacionados con la inyección y, de ser así, qué tan grande era el riesgo.

Los casos son inusuales: seis reportados entre más de siete millones de inyecciones de la vacuna de J&J. Los coágulos se encontraron en seis mujeres de entre 18 y 48 años. Una persona murió.

Fauci dijo que dudaba muy seriamente de que Estados Unidos detuviera permanentemente el uso de la vacuna de J&J.

“No creo que eso vaya a su-

ceder”, dijo. “La pausa fue para echar un vistazo, asegurarnos de que conocemos toda la información que podamos tener dentro de ese periodo de tiempo y también advertir a algunos de los médicos que podrían ver a personas, particularmente mujeres, que tienen este evento adverso en particular, que las traten correctamente”.

La gran mayoría de personas vacunadas con esta vacuna han tenido efectos secundarios leves o ninguno. Las autoridades enfatizaron que no han encontrado indicios de problemas de coágulos con las vacunas covid-19 más utilizadas en Estados Unidos, que son las de Moderna y de Pfizer.



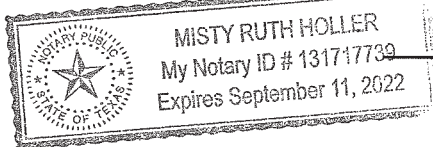

The legend of Sam Houston

The year was 1854, and the nation was bitterly divided once again over slavery.

Sam Houston, a U. S. Senator for Texas, was in the middle of the debate, faced with a choice between his political career and the future of the nation.

The vote was on the politically explosive Kansas-Nebraska Act. For years, Congress had walked the delicate tightrope trying to balance the interests between North and South. Increasingly, the slavery question dominated every political argument, and Congress tried to avoid discussing it just as much. But this new legislation reopened the festering wound.

The act, introduced in January 1854, was a cynical political play by Sen. Stephen Douglas of Illinois to try to make Chicago the hub of the transcontinental railroad. This meant that all railroads going to the West Coast would be routed through Chicago, meaning a fortune for the city and the state. Other potential hubs included Memphis, Tennessee, and New Orleans, Louisiana, which would include more southerly routes through more populated areas, including Texas.

Douglas initially proposed organizing the entire area from the border of the Indian Territory (present-day Oklahoma) to the border with British Canada into the Nebraska and Kansas Territories. This area was the last unorganized remnant of the Louisiana Purchase, and the 1820 Compromise had for-

bidden slavery in the area. Douglas called for the compromise's repeal by allowing slavery into the new territories while territorial voters decided the final status of slavery.

The nation had 16 free states and 15 slave states in 1854 plus five territories that would come in as free states in the future. Texas was the slave state admitted. With no more pro-slavery territories, southerners were increasingly worried about being outnumbered and surrounded. Immediately, sharp opposition to the bill arose. Southern politicians rallied around it as their last chance to bring a slave state into the union, except Houston. Houston had been a protégé of President Andrew Jackson and was an ardent Unionist. He had fought for the nation in the War of 1812 as a young man, bled for Texas to free it from Mexico and to bring it into the United States, and served Texas proudly as its U. S. senator and former president.

Houston demanded the 1820 Compromise be upheld and the act rejected. As Houston characterized the choice, "Our children are either to live in after time in the enjoyment of peace ... or the alternative remains for them of anarchy, discord, and civil broil." Houston voted against the demands of Texas and southern politicians—the only southerner to vote against the legislation—and faced bitter criticisms in letters and newspapers across

the region.

Houston's conscience was clear, regardless of the consequences. He told his wife that the criticism "falls off me like water off a duck's back."

While Houston was popular with the people of Texas, this was a time before the Seventeenth Amendment and U. S. Senators were still chosen by the state legislatures. Though Houston's term would not expire until 1858, legislators immediately voted not to return Houston to a third term. In 1858, Supreme Court Chief Justice John Marshall was elected by legislators to replace him.

The Kansas-Nebraska Act passed, it was a disaster. It completely destabilized the sense of compromise that existed between North and South. Kansas would erupt into its own civil war with hundreds dead as pro-slavery and anti-slavery forces fought for control of the territory. As it was, 86 members of the House of Representatives in both of the major parties lost their seats because of their support for the Kansas-Nebraska Act. America now headed headlong into the coming civil war.

Houston, however, would not be stopped. In 1859, the people elected him as the state's seventh governor with a landslide 57% of the vote.

The story became another example of Houston's patriotism and legendary integrity. The story was later featured in John F. Kennedy's Pulitzer Prize-winning work Profiles in Courage in 1956. Sometimes integrity is more important than ambition or popularity.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

The word community evokes different definitions for different people, but I think the one that is most important is this one: "a feeling of fellowship with others as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, or goals." In a non-partisan municipal election, this is the way community should be defined.

Unfortunately we have a cabal of candidates led by a mayoral candidate who has spread misinformation and has outright lied about their service to the community. This group seeks to further divide the community that has sustained our city since its inception, and that I believe will carry it into the future. Their alignment to a particular political party and continued endorsement chasing do nothing to promote community, and only drive an already deep wedge further into the bedrock of what has

made Plano the best place to live, work, and get an education.

Furthermore, these behaviors indicate that their focus is not on Plano, but on Austin and Washington, neither of which have the same needs or problems as our city. These goals and interests are not shared by all of Plano's citizens but the cabal seems to think so since they are only speaking to a small proportion of residents. Campaigning outside of Plano is pointless since those folks can't vote in our election, and currying favor with folks who can't vote here doesn't win you a prize—this isn't a Prom Queen election.

We need a compassionate, focused problem-solver who will be fully committed to attending to the needs of Plano's citizens first while building community within the city and with its neighbors. We need a leader who

has demonstrated a sound commitment to improving our city through servant leadership, and I believe that person is John Muns.

We must encourage our neighbors to get out and vote in this election. It is far too important to sit this one out. We cannot afford to have a part-time leader as mayor, and we certainly cannot afford to have part-time leaders as council members. We need a principled leader with a proven history of service to the community, who has a vested interest in the success of all citizens, not just a select segment who choose to align themselves with a particular political party. John Muns will be an outstanding leader and will serve our city with the care, courage, and compassion that is needed to move us into our future.

Texans have an opportunity to stockpile on emergency supplies as the 2021 Emergency Preparation Supplies Sales Tax Holiday continues until tomorrow. This tax holiday, authorized by the Texas' Comptroller's office, was created for the purpose of incentivizing emergency preparation for the COVID-19

pandemic and other natural disasters.

Until April 26 at 11:59 p.m., Texans can engage in tax-free transactions of emergency items such as power generators, batteries, first aid kits, fire extinguishers, smoke detectors, radios, tarps, lanterns and ladders. Despite the Texas Comptroller's office specifically mentioning COVID-19 as an example of a natural disaster, face masks

and disinfectants do not qualify for tax exemption.

As a means of encouraging social distancing, the Texas Comptroller's office is extending this tax holiday to all orders made via ecommerce, phone or mail, provided that the transaction is finalized during the exemption period. Sherlock Holmes opens Friday The game is afoot at Theatre Rocks!

ENNIS - Disappearances, murder, kidnapping in Victorian England, by way of the Theatre Rocks stage.

A new, family-friendly adaptation of "Sherlock Holmes: The Adventure of the Priory School" opens Friday at the theatre located at 505 NW Main St. in Ennis.

The script by H. Lee McMillan is based on one of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's own favorite tales featuring his famous detective.

A fast-paced headmaster, Thorncroft Huxtable (Rocky Carter of Mesquite), seeks help from Sherlock Holmes (Andrew Williams of Red Oak) in solving the disappearance of the young son of the Duke of Holderness (Paul D. Perry of Milford).

Neither the duke's secretary, James Wilder (Roland Carter of

Mesquite) nor the local Constable (Ethan Binder of Ennis) seems too pleased to have Holmes and Watson poking around in the attic.

Rx drug take back Saturday

ELLIS COUNTY - Local law enforcement, Reach Council, DPR/Impact Communities, and the DEA will partner to host the semi-annual Prescription Drug Take Back Event on Saturday, April 24.

Officers will collect unused and expired prescription and over-the-counter medications at the following locations:

The Prescription Drug Take Back is part of a national effort by the Drug Enforcement Administration to reduce the availability of unmonitored medications in home medicine cabinets.

This April marks the 20th DEA take-back day that helps prevent prescription abuse and theft by riding homes of potentially dangerous, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

This past October Americans turned in 985,392 lbs. (492.7 tons) of prescription drugs at 4,587 sites operated by the DEA and more than 4,153 of its state and local law enforcement partners.

Accepted medicines, in addition to unused and outdated prescriptions, are over-the-counter pills and liquid medications, as well as pet medications. Officers will not be able to accept inhalers or injection needles.

The service is anonymous and free of charge.

Dallas District Bicycle Program

Bicycling is an inexpensive and efficient form of transportation. Riding a bicycle may help reduce traffic congestion and improve air quality within our community. Bicycling can also improve your health and well-being through regular exercise. Every transportation agency, including TxDOT, has the responsibility to improve conditions and opportunities for bicycling and to integrate bicycling into our transportation systems.

It is TxDOT's policy to consider bicyclists in the development of transportation projects, as part of design, construction and maintenance of state roadways and in the development of federally funded transportation projects. Bicycles are considered to be vehicles and bicyclists are required to adhere to the rules of the road.

The TxDOT Dallas District works with local entities, such as cities and counties, to identify bicycle and pedestrian connectivity projects, and to implement and improve safety and connectivity between current and planned regional transportation networks. The planning and development process is typically guided by standards and guidelines based on leading practices and feasibility for developing bicycling and walking facilities. For information on project requirements for Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodation, click [here](#).

TxDOT involves the general public on bicycle-related matters through public involvement and its Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC).

Public Involvement generally includes Public Meetings, Public Hearings, and Notices providing opportunities for public comment. These activities are generally handled at the TxDOT District level on a reoccurring basis in accordance with Texas Administrative Code - Title 43, Part 1, Chapter 25, Subchapter D, Rule § 25.55 (b).

In the consideration of pedestrian and bicycle accommodations, public input (when applicable) as well as bicycle and pedestrian accommodation plans produced by city, county, and metropolitan planning organizations shall be considered. Local bicycle and pedestrian interest groups can also be contacted for public input.

TxDOT's BAC is an 11-member committee approved by the Texas Transportation Commission. Members are selected to serve a 3-year term (September 1 through August 31). TxDOT makes an announcement annually to its 25 District Bicycle Coordinators to seek new BAC members. TxDOT and the Commission strive for a committee that is geographically balanced and professionally diverse, as well as knowledgeable about bicycle accommodations and about transportation and transportation funding. TxDOT has a Statewide Bicycle Coordinator and designated District Bicycle Coordinators in each of its 25 districts that serve as a local point of contact on bicycle-related issues. In addition, large Metropolitan Planning Organizations, like the North Central Texas Council of Governments, have staff to support the consideration of bicyclists as part of regional transportation planning.

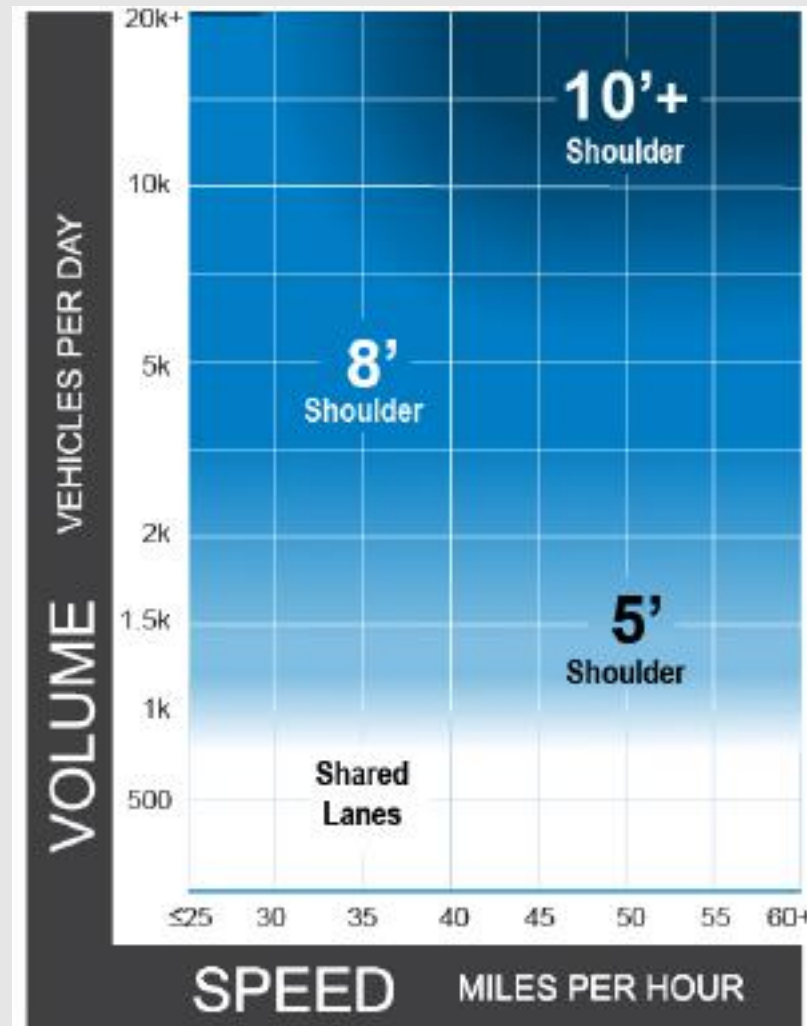

SLIDE 1 - Introduction Slide

Welcome to the virtual public hearing for the Bicycle Use on the State Highway System presented by the Texas Department of Transportation, Dallas District. We appreciate your interest in this program and welcome each of you.

Please note that this presentation can be paused at any point to allow you more time to review the slides.

SLIDE 2 - Virtual Public Hearing in Response to Public Health

Due to the COVID-19 outbreak, along with our commitment to protecting public health, TxDOT is conducting this virtual public hearing to minimize in-person contact.

This presentation will cover the same information that the Dallas District would have shared at a live hearing. However, the comment process will be different and that will be explained shortly. All project information and supplemental materials can be found on the project website.

SLIDE 3 - Public Hearing Purpose

The purpose of this public hearing is to provide information on transportation projects that might affect bicycle use, plans, policies, and programs for the TxDOT Dallas District and NCTCOG, and to receive public comment, as well as provide a general overview of the guidelines the TxDOT Dallas District follows when identifying the need for bicycle facilities along a state highway.

SLIDE 4 – Texas Administrative Code/Federal Highways Administration

Requirements

This public hearing is being held in compliance with both federal and state laws, which are listed on this slide. Following the end of the public comment period that ends May 21, 2021, the Department will proceed with the preparation of the final public hearing summary report. Your statements and comments will be addressed in this documentation and will be given full consideration in moving forward in developing, planning and programming of our bicycle projects. The public hearing summary report and comment response form will be posted to the Dallas Bicycle Program website once they are prepared.

SLIDE 5 – Planning and Designing Bicycle Facilities

Connectivity is an important aspect of the planning, development, and construction of effective bicycle routes. The District works with NCTCOG and local entities, such as cities and counties, to identify bicycle and pedestrian projects that improve safety and connectivity between current and planned regional transportation networks.

TxDOT relies on guidelines and standards that are outlined in the TxDOT Roadway Design Manual, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (or AASHTO) bicycle and pedestrian design guides, and the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices as the primary resources for planning, designing and operating bicycle and pedestrian facilities.

The National Association of City Transportation Officials (or NACTO) Urban Bikeway Design Guide builds upon the flexibilities provided in the AASHTO guidelines to provide additional recommendations to help communities plan and design safe and convenient accommodations for pedestrian and bicyclists. FHWA supports the use of these resources to further develop non-motorized transportation networks, particularly in urban areas.

SLIDE 6 – TxDOT’s Policy – Urban, Urban Core, Suburban, and Rural Towns

TxDOT also recently updated its design guidelines, which it released in an April 2021 memo entitled “Bicycle Accommodation Design Guidance.” This memo outlines guidelines for bicycle and pedestrian accommodations to be taken into consideration during transportation project planning moving forward.

As stated in the memo, for all types of projects within an urban, urban core, suburban, and rural town setting, TxDOT will provide the recommended bicycle accommodations based on traffic volumes and posted speed limits, as determined by the graph shown on the next slide. Pedestrian accommodations would be designed to meet Texas Accessibility Standards and Americans with Disabilities

Act Accessibility Guidelines requirements.

Bicycle accommodations for bridge projects would include a minimum 5-foot clear space from the adjacent motor vehicle travel lane, with additional separation for roadways identified on the Texas Bicycle Tourism Trails Example Network.

SLIDE 7 – TxDOT’s Policy – Urban, Urban Core, Suburban, and Rural Towns

This slide shows a graph depicting how the recommended bicycle facility is selected for the urban, urban core, suburban, and rural town context. As you can see, the recommended accommodation includes additional separation between motorists and bicyclists as traffic volumes and speeds increase.

SLIDE 8 – TxDOT’s Policy – Rural Areas (Excludes Rural Towns)

For projects within rural areas, excluding rural towns, where project scoping or environmental studies indicate the need for bicycle accommodations, TxDOT will provide the recommended bicycle accommodations based on traffic volumes and posted speed limits, as determined by the graph shown on the next slide. In some cases, including for roadways indicated in TxDOT’s Bicycle Tourism Trails Study, an 8-foot wide shoulder, shared use path or other locally preferred facility type may be provided.

Bridge projects in rural areas would include the same facilities provided in urban areas.

SLIDE 9 – TxDOT’s Policy – Rural Areas (Excludes Rural Towns)

This slide shows a graph depicting how the recommended bicycle facility is selected for rural areas, excluding rural towns. As shown, shared lanes are recommended for roadways with low speed and low traffic volumes. As speed and traffic volumes increase, increased shoulder widths are proposed to accommodate bicyclists.

SLIDE 10 – Bicycle Accommodation Information

To learn more about TxDOT’s Bicycle and Pedestrian program, please visit the website shown on this slide. This website provides information on the planning and design, funding opportunities, and various other resources about bicycle and pedestrian accommodations and safety, as required by U.S. Department of Transportation and TxDOT policy.

SLIDE 11 – TxDOT Dallas District Projects

The next two slides show the Dallas District projects included in this public hearing. These projects are being funded, designed and constructed in partnership with the City of Dallas. Both will be environmentally cleared once the public comment period ends and can then proceed to letting and construction.

SLIDE 12 – City of Dallas CTC Hi Line Trail

The City of Dallas Circuit Trail Connector Hi Line Trail is located in central Dallas. This project would include approximately 1 mile of bike lanes and shared use paths and will connect to the Katy Trail in two locations and run parallel to the Trinity

Strand Trail. A 12-foot wide trail would be added into the raised median and connect to other sidewalk crossings along Hi Line Drive and the travel lanes along Victory Avenue would be narrowed to accommodate bike lanes. Throughout the project area, intersection improvements, landscaping and irrigation, lighting, signs and signal improvements and lane striping would be implemented. A temporary construction easement will be required at the northwest corner of North Houston Street and Victory Avenue. No new right of way will be required.

The Hi Line Trail project cost is approximately \$18.8 million and uses federal and local funding. The project is anticipated to let in the summer of 2021 and construction will be complete in early 2023.

SLIDE 13 – City of Dallas Union Bikeway

The City of Dallas Union Bikeway is located in downtown Dallas. This project would include approximately ½ mile of bike lanes and sidewalks between Houston Street and North Harwood Street at Woodall Rodgers Freeway, including along Nowitzki Way, Field Street, Ashland Street and Harwood Street. The project will connect Klyde Warren Park to Houston Street, near where the Katy Trail ends.

Along Nowitzki Way, the eastbound outside travel lane would be converted for bicycle use to include two 4.5-foot wide bike lanes (one in each direction). Along Field Street, the existing sidewalk would be widened to eight feet. Along Ashland Street, the travel lanes would be narrowed and two 4.5-foot wide bike lanes (one in each direction) would be added on the southbound side of the street. Along

Harwood Street, the outside eastbound lane would be converted to two 4.5-foot wide bike lanes (one in each direction). A temporary construction easement will be required along Field Street. No new right of way is required.

The Union Bikeway project costs approximately \$1 million and uses federal and local funding sources. The project is anticipated to let in the summer of 2021 and be complete in the summer of 2022.

SLIDE 14 – Dallas District Staff

This slide identifies the personnel with the Dallas District whose responsibilities include ensuring successful planning, development, and constructions of these bicycle and pedestrian facilities.

Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Dallas-Fort Worth Region



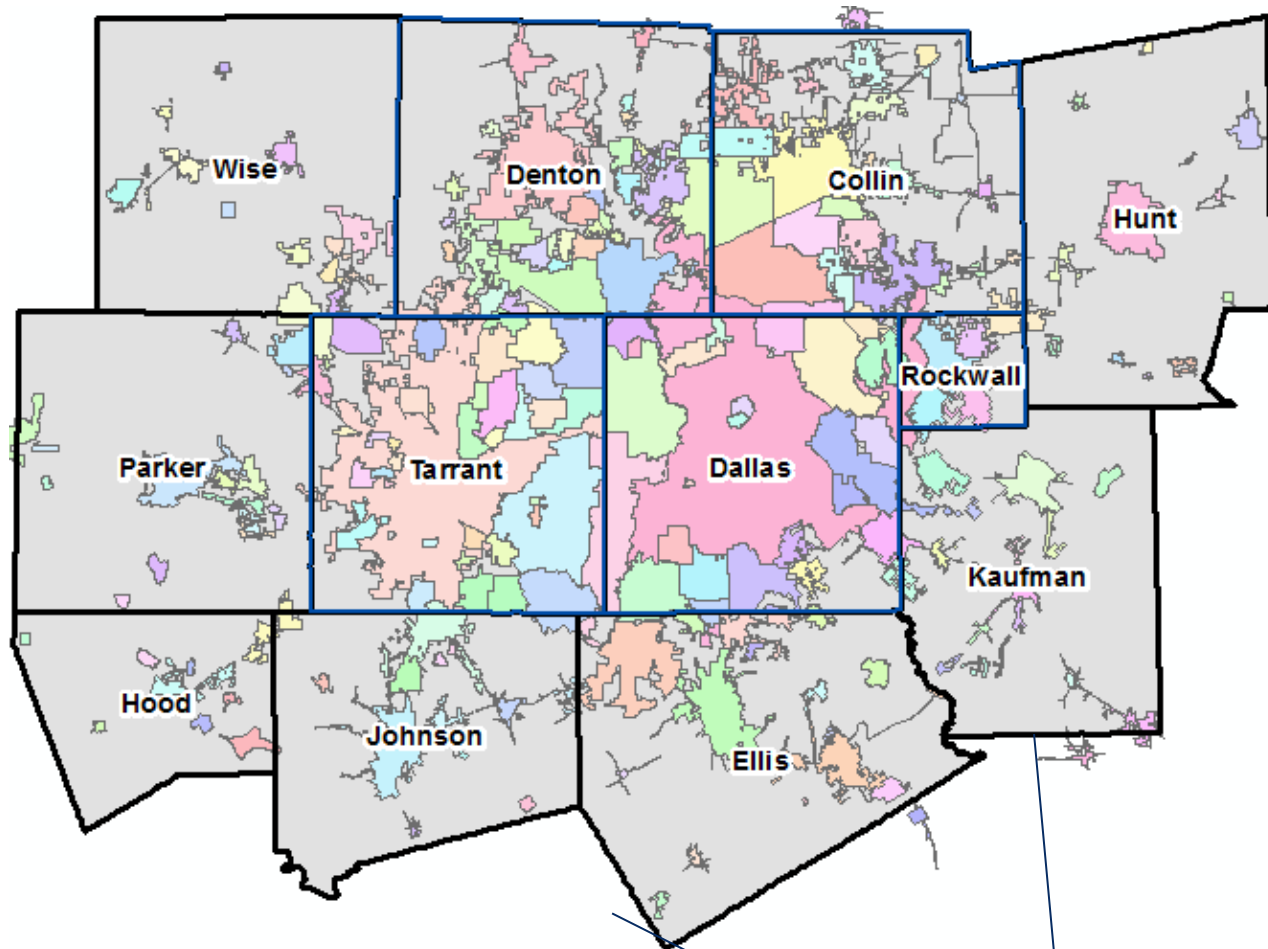

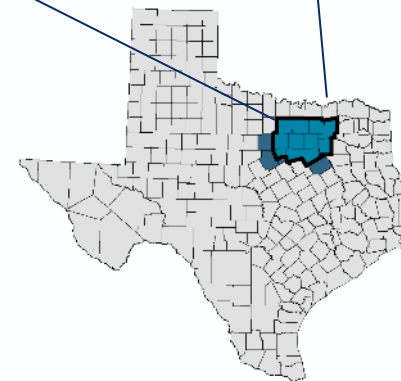

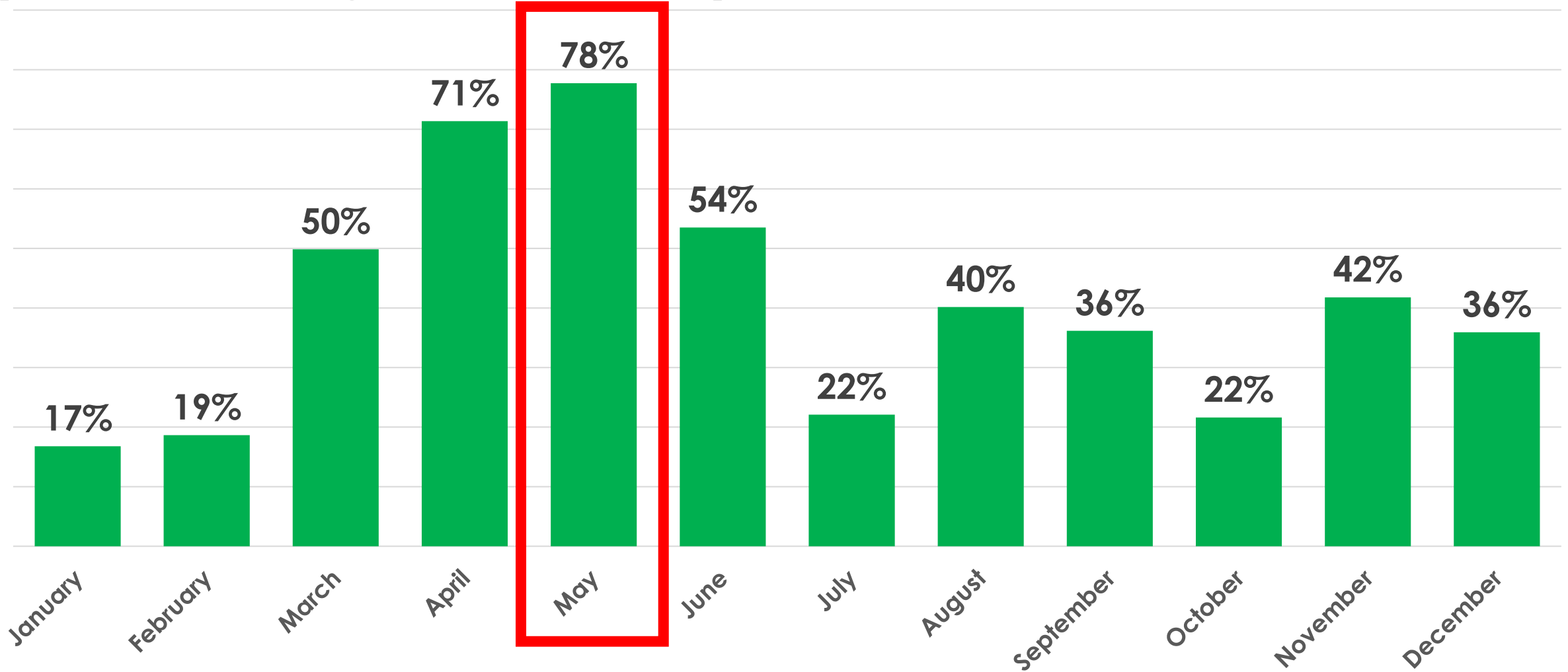

(Percent Change 2019 vs 2020)

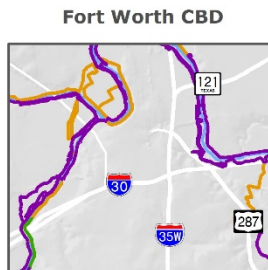
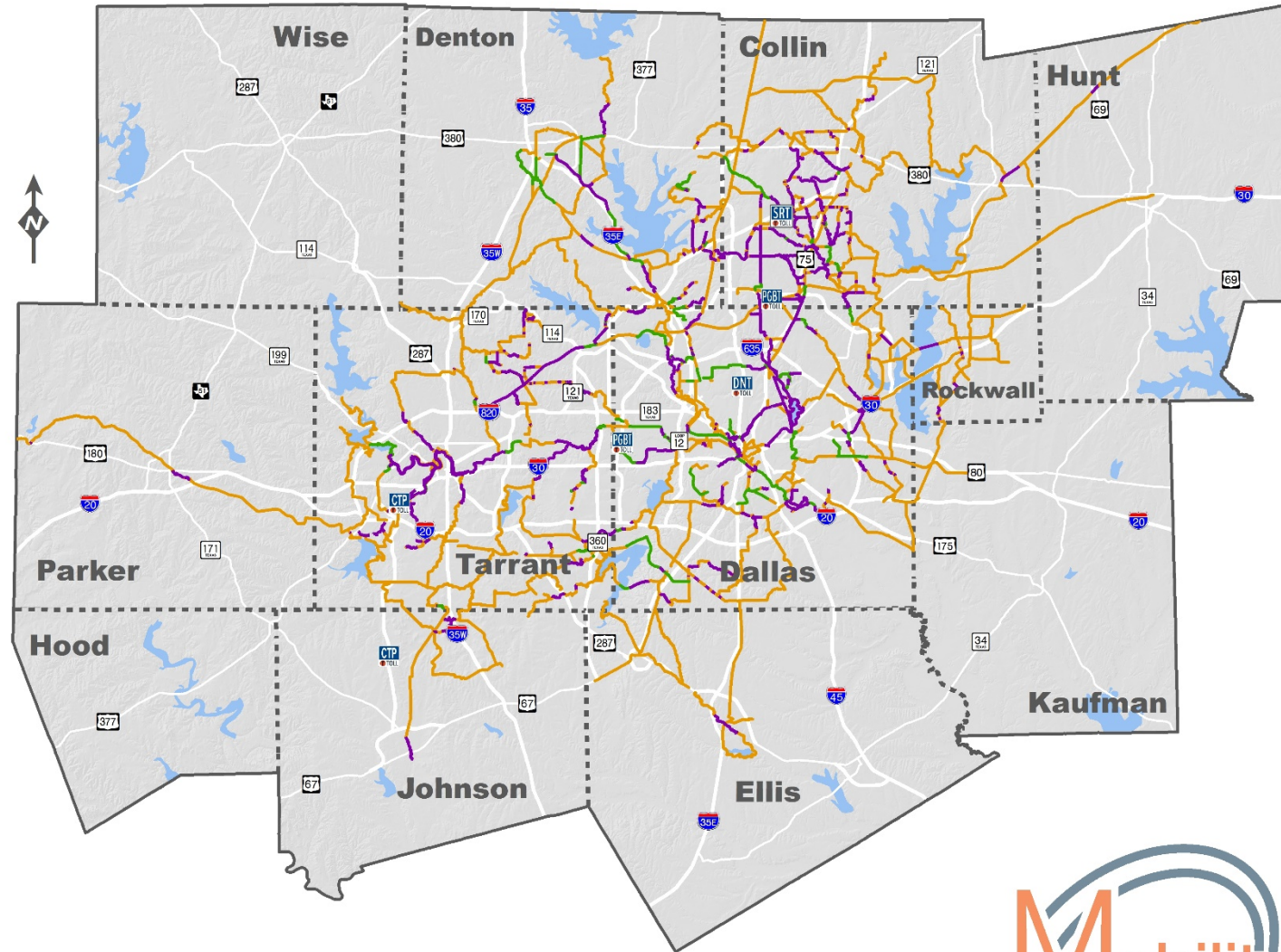

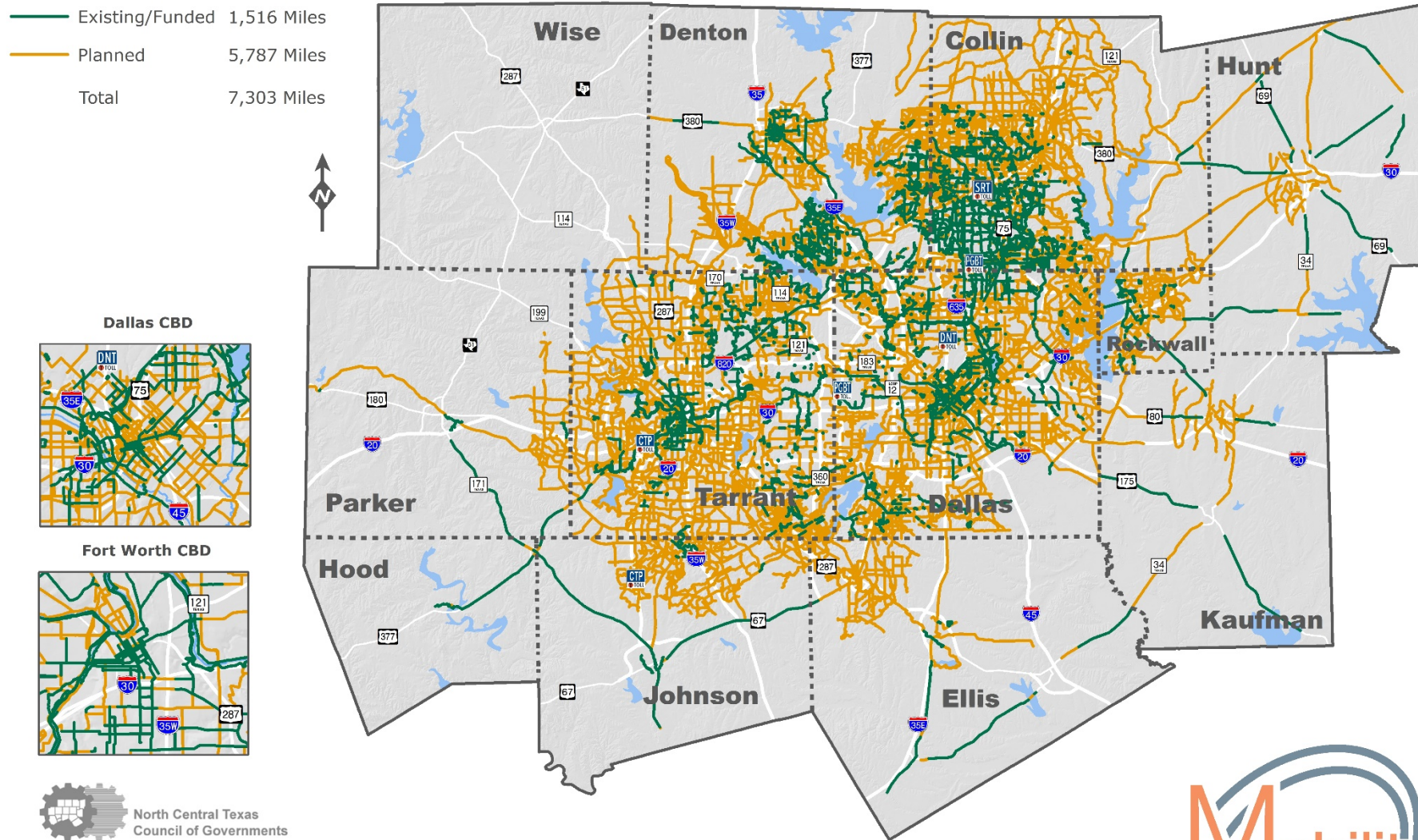

Trails and On-Street Bikeways Network

Many cities and counties in the region have developed and adopted bicycle master plans, trail master plans, or a combination of both. Various communities are also developing plans for local pedestrian networks and programs to provide safe routes to schools. Numerous cities and transportation agencies have adopted local policies for bicycle accommodations to encourage bicycling as a form of transportation. The number of locally adopted community bicycle and trail master plans in the region grows each year. These documents were used in the development of [Mobility 2045](#) to ensure regional connectivity and continuity.

The active transportation network in the region consists of 7,303 miles of regional shared-use paths (Regional Veloweb), supporting community shared-use paths, and the on-street bikeway network (including on-street wide shoulders in rural areas) in various stages of development. This network plays a key role in supporting Mobility 2045 and the implementation of the multimodal Complete Streets and transit infrastructure that assist in safely accommodating all travelers throughout the region. **Local trails** make up 775 miles of this network, with many more planned.

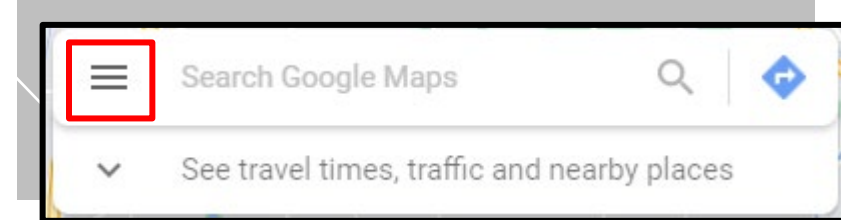

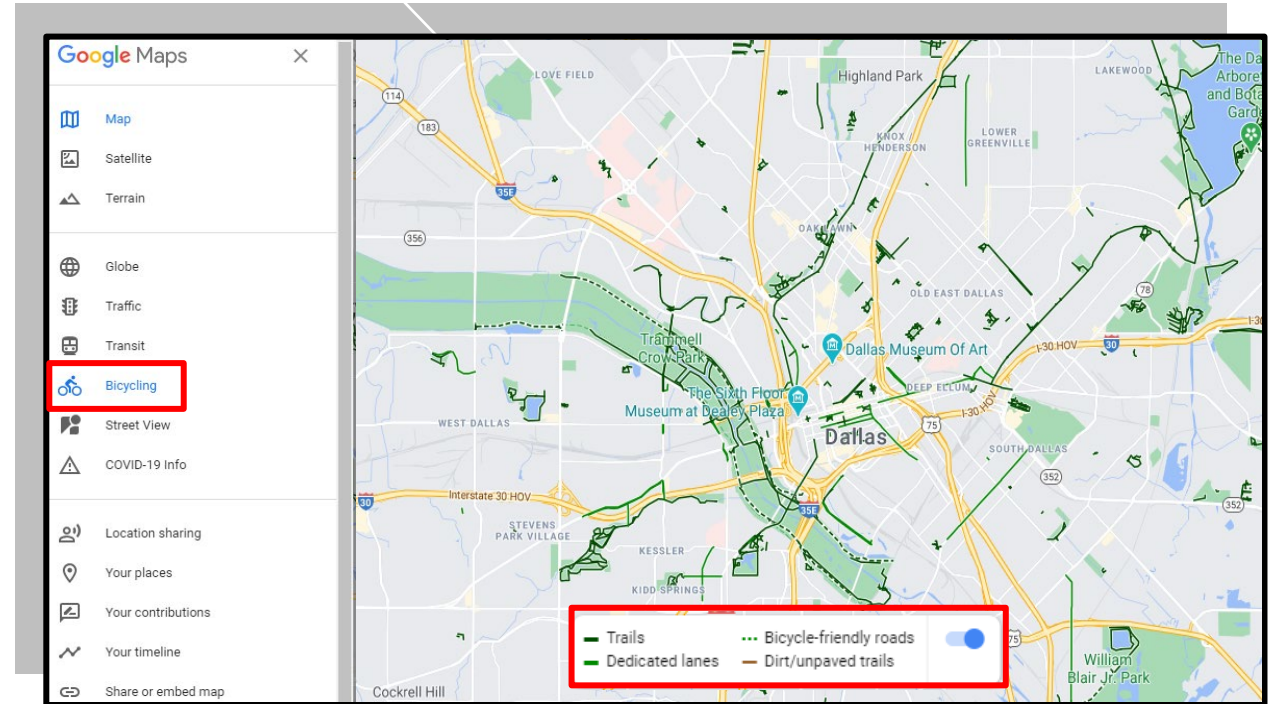

SLIDE 1 - Introduction Slide

Hello, I am Kevin Kokes, and I want to thank you for being here today. I am a program manager with the Sustainable Development Team in the Transportation Department of the North Central Texas Council of Governments. Our team at the Council of Governments oversees active transportation planning for bicycle and pedestrian facilities across the twelve-county Dallas-Fort Worth Metropolitan Planning area.

Today I will provide a brief overview of trails and on-street bikeway planning for our metropolitan area, and I will also highlight several regionally significant trail corridors that are in various stages of planning, engineering design, and construction. Each of these trails includes a partnership for implementation by the Council of Governments, local communities and TxDOT.

SLIDE 2 – Texas Metropolitan Planning Organizations

The Council of Governments serves as the transportation planning organization for the twelve-county Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan planning area, which is one of 25 located around the state of Texas, there are more than 420 metropolitan planning organizations around the country.

The map on this slide identifies the location of our Dallas-Fort Worth planning area, located within the state.

SLIDE 3 – North Central Texas Council of Governments

This slide identifies how our region is divided between three TxDOT districts. The Fort Worth TxDOT District is located on the west, the Dallas District is located on the east, and Hunt County is included within the Paris District.

Today's public hearing for TxDOT includes the Western and Eastern Subregions for the Fort Worth and Dallas Districts.

SLIDE 4 – North Central Texas Council of Governments

The Council of Governments planning area encompasses more than 200 cities, ranging from rural towns to urban areas. In addition to the two largest cities of Dallas and Fort Worth there are 13 other cities with more than 100,000 residents in population.

In 2020, our population across the region was estimated to be 7.6 million residents. By 2045, our population across the region is expected to grow by nearly 4 million additional residents, to over 11.2 million people.

As a regional planning organization, the Council of Governments works collaboratively with, but does not make decisions for, individual municipalities and

agencies. TxDOT, cities, and counties manage construction projects, also local governments make land use decisions and school districts make school siting decisions.

SLIDE 5 – Monthly Trail Usage

The COVID-19 pandemic had significant impact on transportation in 2020, leading to a significant decrease in the travel volumes of nearly every mode of transportation including personal vehicles, rail and bus transit, and commercial airlines. However, walking and bicycling travel on trails in the Dallas-Fort Worth region experienced significant increases in 2020 when compared to 2019.

As shown on this slide, in 2020 the significant increases began early in the year before COVID shelter in place restrictions occurred, and then steadily increased later in the year with a dramatic peak of increase in trail usage of more than 70% during the months of April and May.

Strong increases in trail usage occurred throughout the remaining months of 2020.

SLIDE 6 – Regional Veloweb

The next series of slides identify trails and on-street bikeways included in the metropolitan transportation plan adopted by the Regional Transportation Council. This plan serves as the guide for investing in transportation infrastructure across our planning area.

This slide identifies the Regional Veloweb network of nearly 1,900 miles of trails.

These are prioritized trails intended to provide connections between cities and counties across the region.

This map identifies the regional network, which is in various stages of development, of either existing, funded, or planned facilities.

SLIDE 7 – Community Shared-Use Paths

The map on this slide identifies Community Shared Use Paths with nearly an additional 3,000 miles of trails in various stages of development. These trail corridors are more local in nature and tend to be located in suburban communities that are experiencing new growth in previously undeveloped areas. These trails provide connections to the Regional Veloweb network.

SLIDE 8 – On-Street Bikeway Network

The map on this slide identifies on-street bikeways in various stages of development by local communities based on their adopted master plans. More than 2,400 miles of these facilities are identified in the plan, typically consisting of bikeways such as on-street striped bike lanes.

SLIDE 9 – Combined Regional Veloweb, Community Paths, and On-Street Bikeway Network

All together the combined network of Regional Veloweb, Community Paths, and

On-street Bikeways will result more than 7,300 miles of facilities. About 1,500 miles exist today, however about 80% of this total combined network is still in the planning stage and is expected to be completed by 2045.

SLIDE 10 – TxDOT’s Bicycle Tourism Trails Study

In addition to the regional trails and bikeway network, there is also a statewide network of bikeways identified by TxDOT’s Bicycle Tourism Trails Study and represented on this slide. Bonnie Sherman highlights this statewide network in her presentation about bicycle planning across the state of Texas.

Of note on this slide are several trail corridors of regional significance that extend through our Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area and will one day provide connections to major cities around the state and to neighboring states.

SLIDE 11 – Ellis County (Midlothian-Waxahachie Regional Trail)

Okay, so now what you all have been waiting for, and that is the highlights of several regional trail corridors that are under various stages of development in our region. The first corridor that I will highlight is located in Ellis County, and is a corridor that will stretch from Midlothian to Waxahachie.

SLIDE 12 – Ellis County (Midlothian-Waxahachie Regional Trail)

Recently, the Council of Governments, in partnership with the cities of Midlothian and Waxahachie completed preliminary engineering for the nearly 10-mile alignment that will stretch between the two cities.

The map on this slide identifies the sections of the trail that will be completed within in each city's jurisdiction.

In April of this year, federal transportation funding was approved by the Regional Transportation Council for the first two phases of construction of this trail. A northern phase will begin in Midlothian and extend southward from Midlothian Parkway. A southern phase will connect at Getzendarner Park in Waxahachie and extend north to FM 875.

The TxDOT Dallas District will be coordinating with both cities on these trail construction projects.

SLIDE 13 – Fort Worth Bomber Spur Trail

The next regional trail corridor I will highlight is located in western Fort Worth and is known as the Bomber Spur Trail, which is a rails to trails project.

SLIDE 14 – Fort Worth Bomber Spur Trail

Preliminary engineering for a portion of this trail corridor was completed earlier this year from Vickery Boulevard near the intersection of SH 183 on the south, northward to Calmont Avenue, which is located just south of Interstate 30.

Ultimately when this entire Bomber Spur corridor is complete, it will form a large trail loop combined with the West Fork Trinity Trail and the Clear Fork Trinity Trail connecting residents in western Fort Worth to downtown.

SLIDE 15 – Fort Worth Bomber Spur Trail

Preliminary engineering was completed for a 3.1 mile stretch of this trail, which provided design schematics, opinions of construction costs, and identified locations for bridges and safety measures at roadway crossings. This engineering effort was a partnership by the Council of Governments, City of Fort Worth, and Streams & Valleys.

This past month, the Regional Transportation Council approved funding to construct this first phase of trail from Calmont Avenue on the north to Camp Bowie/US377 which will include a new trail bridge over that roadway. As a result, the TxDOT Fort Worth District will be coordinating with the City of Fort Worth to implement this section of trail for construction.

SLIDE 16 – Cotton Belt Regional Trail

The next regionally significant trail I will highlight is the Cotton Belt Regional Trail. This is a corridor stretching nearly 55 miles from near downtown Fort Worth, through the mid cities in Tarrant County, through northern Dallas County, and into southern Plano in Collin County.

SLIDE 17 – Cotton Belt Regional Trail

This slide identifies the number of cities, counties, and rail transit stations that will ultimately be connected by the entire Cotton Belt Trail corridor.

Currently, the City of Grapevine and TxDOT are completing construction on a section of the trail near downtown Grapevine and has engineering design underway for the next phase of the trail heading eastward along the TexRail corridor leading into DFW Airport.

Also of note is the Dallas Area Rapid Transit Agency currently has engineering design underway for nearly 24 miles of the Cotton Belt Trail that ultimately implement phases from DFW Airport to Shiloh Station in Plano. Sections of that trail alignment are anticipated to open with the Silver Line Commuter Rail project and ultimately connect with nine rail stations managed by DART.

SLIDE 18 – Denton to Dallas Regional Veloweb Trail

Another significant trail corridor in the region extends from downtown Denton to downtown Dallas. This is a nearly 52-mile trail alignment as identified on this map, and provides connections to numerous rail stations, historic downtowns, and major employment centers in Denton County and Dallas County.

SLIDE 19 – Denton to Dallas Regional Veloweb Trail

This slide identifies the trail alignment that connects with many cities across the two counties including nearby connections to rail stations in the DCTA and DART rail networks.

This past year, preliminary engineering was completed on an eight-mile stretch of

the trail corridor from the DCTA Hebron Station in southern Lewisville extending to the Campion Trail near the border of Coppell and Irving.

The Regional Transportation Council recently awarded funding for construction of the trail section in southern Lewisville connecting to Carrollton. As a result, this project will be implemented by the city in collaboration with the TxDOT Dallas District.

SLIDE 20 – Fort Worth to Dallas Regional Veloweb Trail

The last regional corridor to be highlighted today is the Fort Worth to Dallas Regional Trail which extends nearly 66 miles in total from downtown Fort Worth to downtown Dallas.

SLIDE 21 – Fort Worth to Dallas Regional Veloweb Trail

This trail corridor extends through five cities in Tarrant and Dallas counties, with nearly 13 miles of the trail funded for construction. These sections of the trail are expected to be complete and open by late 2023. Both the Fort Worth and Dallas TxDOT Districts are coordinating with the cities in this corridor for construction on these phases.

SLIDE 22 – Regional Collaboration

As noted on this slide, the trail through the five cities is a long-term vision that is finally becoming reality. This trail has been included in the Metropolitan

Transportation Plan since 1996.

SLIDE 23 – Trail Branding

An upcoming effort that will begin by summer of 2021 involves the development of a unified trail name and branding for effort this regional trail corridor. The five cities and the Council of Governments are coordinating this trail branding effort, with the goal to have signage installed by the time the entire trail opens in late 2023. This slide identifies examples of what this branding and signage may look like.

SLIDE 24 – Regional Network

SLIDE 25 – Trails and Bikeways in Google Maps

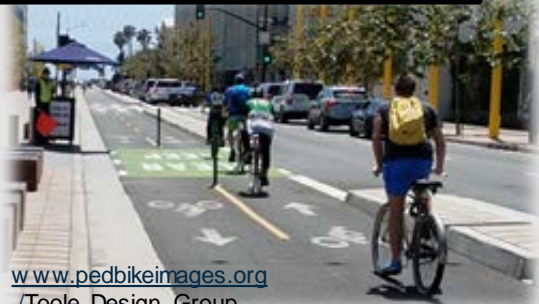

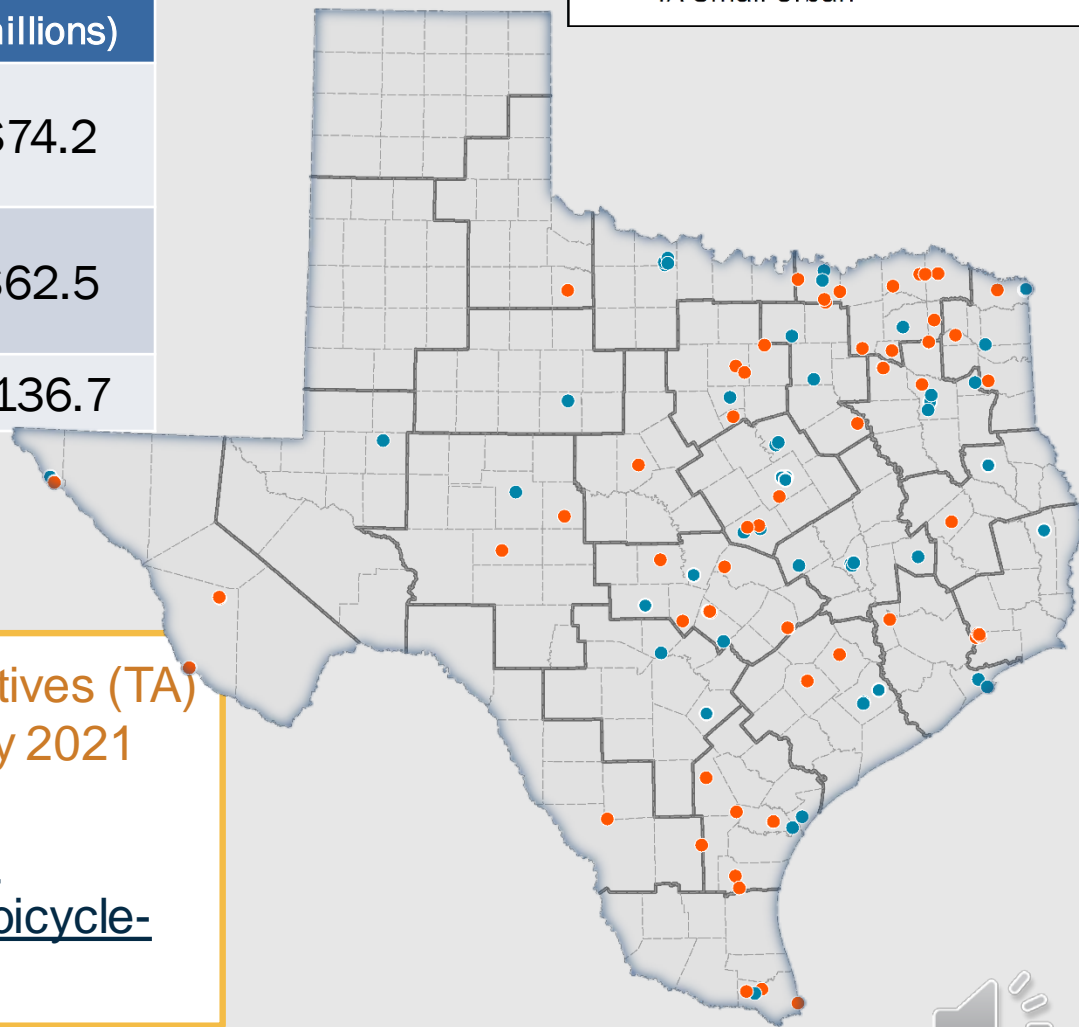

VIRTUAL PUBLIC HEARING SCRIPT

Slide 1: Hello! I'm Bonnie Sherman and I'm TxDOT's statewide bicycle and pedestrian program manager. I wanted to share a few of the exciting efforts to support bicycling across the state that are underway. If you'd like to learn more about TxDOT's statewide Bicycle and Pedestrian Program, go to txdot.gov and type the word "bicycle" in the search box.

Slide 2: TxDOT has a long-standing committee of citizen who advise the department on policies that affect bicycling and walking including the design, construction, and maintenance of highways. This year, the committee was formally expanded to include pedestrian issues, so TxDOT will be specifically targeting recruitment efforts this year on representatives of pedestrian and accessibility needs. We accept applications from interested members of the bicycling and pedestrian community annually in May. Visit with your District Bicycle & Pedestrian Coordinator or check our website to learn more.

Slide 3: One exciting project TxDOT developed with its Bicycle Advisory Committee is the Texas Bicycle Tourism Trails Study. This study identified a potential network of long-distance bikeways to support tourism and economic development across the state. We envision this network as being collaboratively developed, incrementally over time, through local, state, federal, and nonprofit partnerships. A link to the study and maps is included on this slide. Some trail projects presented here today coincide with the bicycle tourism network.

Slide 4: Recently, TxDOT has been working with members of the Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee to generate recommendations on how to better address the needs of bicyclists and pedestrians when developing roadway projects, including data collection and developing TxDOT District bike plans. This group is also generating guiding principles based on best practices in bikeway design that are informing updates to TxDOT's design guidance as well as other policies and procedures to come.

Slide 5: Last month, TxDOT updated its bicycle accommodations guidance as part of a series of revisions to the state's roadway design manual. The new bikeway design guidance is intended to assist engineers in determining safe and comfortable bicycle accommodations that are appropriate to the land use context and roadway characteristics and accommodate the interested but concerned bicyclists. The guidance was developed based on national research, standards, and guidelines that are rapidly evolving. Projects that are still in the early stages of development must comply with the new guidance, so you will begin to see more separated bike facilities and shared use paths included in TxDOT roadway projects across the state in the near future, replacing the shared lane concepts of the past.

Slide 6: Lastly, my office administers the Statewide Transportation Alternatives Program. TxDOT's TA Program, as it's called, provides federal funding to build walking and bicycling infrastructure in small and

medium-sized communities located outside of major metro areas. Local entities are eligible to apply for these funds. We opened a competitive call for projects in early 2021 and received applications from every TxDOT District in the state. Projects are anticipated to be identified for funding later this fall. In the past, we have funded a number of bicycle and pedestrian projects from the DFW area. Thank you for taking the time to visit this hearing and learn about what's ahead for bicyclists and pedestrians in your community!

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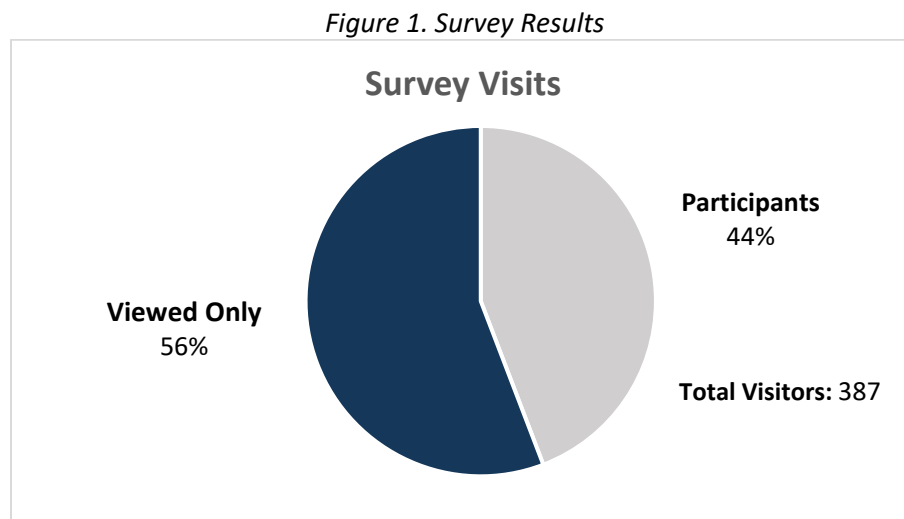


G. MetroQuest survey results

Introduction:

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) utilized an online engagement survey (MetroQuest) from May 6, 2021 to May 21, 2021 to gather public input for the Dallas District's Bike Plan within the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) region. The survey was part of a virtual public hearing for bicycle use on the state highway system. An in-person meeting to obtain public input was not held due to COVID-19 restrictions on in-person meetings and the safety of the public. A link to the online survey remained active on the TxDOT project webpage throughout the duration of the survey period.

The survey had a total of 387 visits over the 15-day active period. Out of those visits, 171 visitors participated in the survey (44%), and 216 of the visitors viewed but did not interact with the survey (56%). **Figure 1** shows the share of visitors who participated in the survey and those who only viewed.



Questions included in the survey can be found on the online engagement survey screen shots in **Attachment A**. The components of the survey included: Barriers to Biking, Mark it on the Map, Bike priorities, and an optional demographics questionnaire. Results for each section are summarized below.

Barriers to Biking

The survey began with a question asking the respondents to rank what they considered the most significant barriers to bicycling. This public input is used by TxDOT and NCTCOG to investigate measures to improve safety and accessibility for bicyclists in the region. Participants were asked to choose their top three barriers from the list found below. Participants only ranked their top three concerns; remaining concerns were not ranked.

- No Bike Parking
- Bad Driver Behaviors
- No Designated Space
- Traffic
- Limited Access
- Disconnected Bikeways
- Poor Pavement Conditions

Table 1 depicts the average ranking for each of the seven barriers as it was ranked among a participant's top three concerns. Since participants ranked their top three concerns from one, being their highest concern, to three, being their third highest concern, a lower Ranking Average equates to being of higher concern.

As indicated in **Table 1**, Bad Driver Behavior ranked highest among participants' concerns for the listed barriers. Bad Driver Behaviors, No Designated Space, and Disconnected Bikeways were placed among the top three concerns out of all possible barriers. Disconnected Bikeways was observed most frequently within the top three concerns.

Mark it on the Map

An interactive map page was provided where participants were asked to drop markers to identify places within the Dallas District that might be problematic for a bicyclist or need specific attention. Participants were able to input five different marker types. The five markers included Starting Point, Destinations, Intersection Issues, Bike Issues, or Bike Barriers. While placing markers, participants were asked to comment on the specifics of what they have encountered at that location. **Table 2** shows the number of times each type of marker was identified on the interactive map and the number of comments left for each marker.

Bike issues were identified the greatest number of times (133) out of the proposed constraints, and Starting Point had the fewest number (46). In addition to being identified the most, Bike Issues also had the most comments. Locations mapped by participants in the Mark it on the Map screen, as well as the comments pertaining to the locations, will be shared by TxDOT with applicable municipalities so they could examine the identified constraints.

Bike Priorities

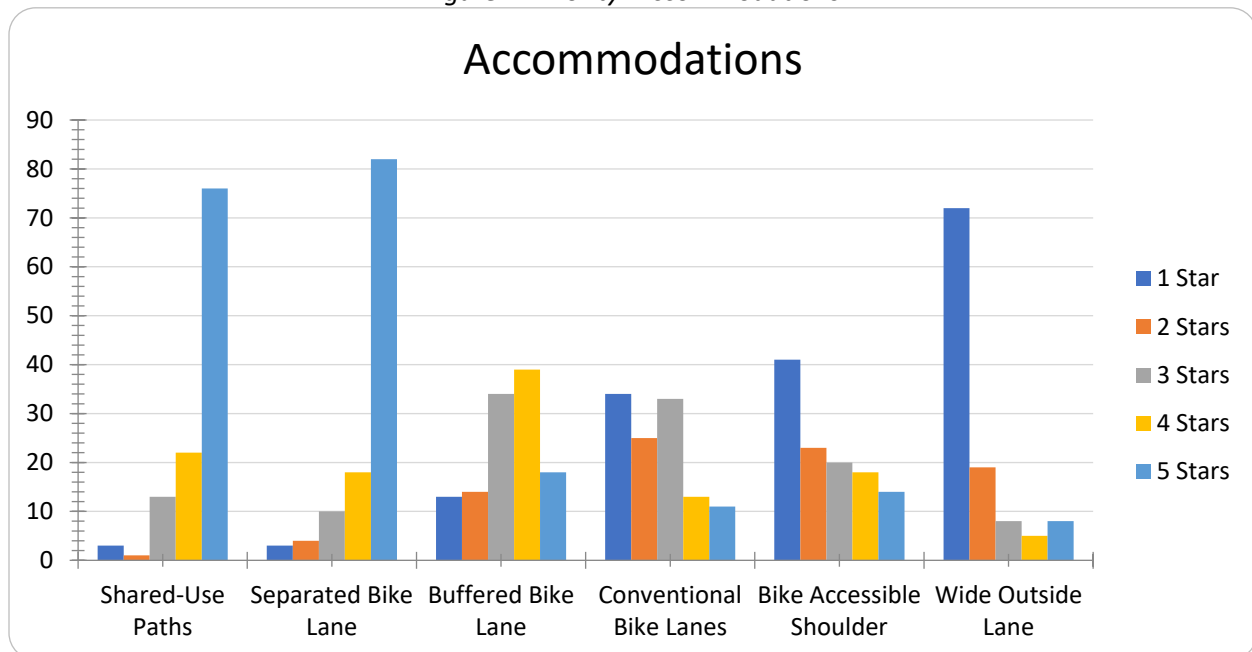


Figure 3. Priority: Safety

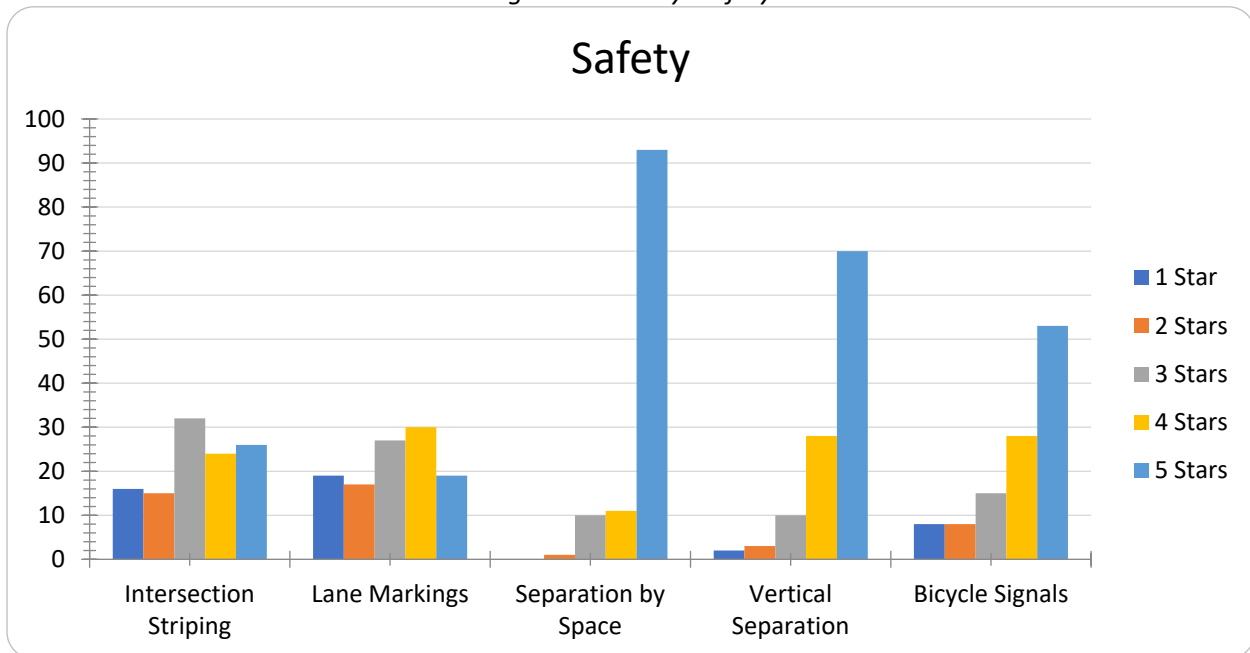
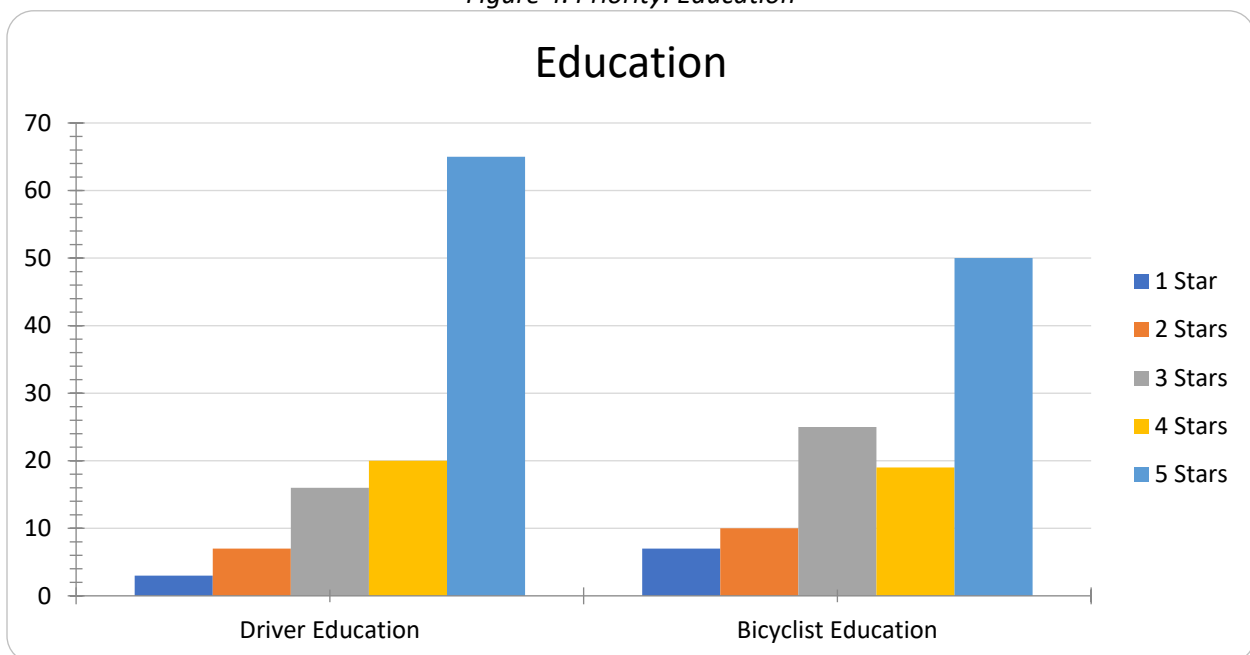


Figure 4. Priority: Education

Survey participants were asked to rate items in three different categories: Accommodations, Safety, and Education. Within each of the three categories are a set of sub-topics that the participants rated from 1 (least preferred) to 5 (most preferred) stars based on preference for the consideration. In the Accommodations category, the survey asked participants to rate their comfort levels while using several bikeway facilities. In the Safety category, the survey asked participants to rate the value of several safety measures. In the Education category, the survey asked participants to rate where the focus of planned education materials should be placed. **Figure 2**, **Figure 3**, and **Figure 4** show the results of the participant's priorities within the three categories.

Figure 2. Priority: Accommodations

Survey results reveal strong respondent preferences within each of the three categories listed. The Accommodations table shows that respondents largely gave Separated Bike Lanes and Shared-Use Paths 5-Star ratings while Wide Outside Lane was largely given a 1-star rating. The Safety graphic shows that Separation of Space, Vertical Separation, and Bicycle Signals have the highest number of 5-star ratings among the safety measures, and Lane Markings having the lowest amount of 5-star ratings. User preferences are similar between the Accommodations category (Shared-Use Paths, Separated Bike Lanes) and the Safety category (Separation by Space, Vertical Separation). The Education figure shows that

participants value both Bicyclist and Driver Education with 5 stars as the most popular rating, with approximately 15 more 5-star ratings for Driver Education.

Optional Demographics Questionnaire

The last section of the survey asked participants to provide optional demographic information, which included questions on how often participants ride their bike (see **Table 3**).

Most survey respondents (52%) indicated that they ride their bike two (2) or three (3) days a week, with the second largest group of respondents (28%) being those that ride four (4) or more days a week. A few survey participants (2%) indicated that they never ride.

The optional demographics questionnaire also asked participants what their destinations are when riding. Results are summarized in **Table 4**.

When asked about destinations when riding, 43% of participants identified Health or Exercise as their reason to ride. The second largest group of respondents (31%) identified recreation. Work and Shopping/Errands were both listed as destinations by 11% of survey participants. Entertainment was not designated as a ride destination by survey participants.

Comment Summary

Each step of the survey allows the participant to leave an optional comment. This gives a participant the opportunity to provide more specific responses and added detail to the question and tasks within the survey. **Table 5** below depicts the distribution of comments among the survey sections.

The stats shown in **Table 5** show that most comments came from the Mark it on the Map section, containing almost 70% of total comments. Bike Ranking received the least number of comments, making up 3% of the total. The Demographic Wrap Up statistic reflects the open ended “Additional Comments” section on the last page of the survey, which is where participants could leave a final comment that does not pertain to one specific component of the bike plan or survey.

Conclusion:

Within a 15-day survey period from May 6, 2021 to May 21, 2021 the on-line MetroQuest survey for the NCTCOG region received 387 visitors. Of the 387 visitors, 171 (44%) participated and responded to the different survey questions and tasks, while the others (56%) only viewed the survey's contents. Bad Driver Behavior was identified as the biggest barrier for bicyclists, and Limited Access was of least concern. The Mark it on the Map activity provided 122 comments and 133 possible Bike Issue locations. Under the Bike Priorities section, Separated Bike Lanes and Shared-Use Paths largely received 5-star ratings under the Accommodations category. Separation of Space received the largest number of 5-star ratings among the Safety category. Driver Education and Cyclist Education received large shares of 5-star ratings under the Education category. About half (52%) of the participants who filled out the optional questionnaire identified that they ride their bike two (2) or three (3) times per week; 28% of those who filled out the optional questionnaire identified that they ride their bike four (4) or more times per week. Ride destinations are largely comprised by Health and exercise (43%) and recreation (31%) purposes. A total of 744 comments were gathered from the 387 visitors, with most comments originating from the Mark it on the Map section. Locations mapped by participants in the Mark it on the Map screen, as well as the comments pertaining to the locations, will be shared by TxDOT with applicable municipalities so they could examine the identified constraints.


