GET YOURSELF ESTABLISHED AND APPROVED WITH THE VARIOUS GC'S OR ENTITIES AND MAINTAIN IT.
CONSIDER THAT YOUR FIRST CONTRACT – GET YOURSELF IN THEIR SYSTEMS SO IT IS EASY FOR THEM TO CONTRACT WITH YOU AND PUT YOU TO WORK.

CLOSING:

Your relationships can lead to opportunities. Specifically, peripheral services that you may not have championed as part of your offering but make sense to undertake.

Take advantage of the AGC, TxDOT and all the Regional Contractor Associations

Attend pre-bids, review bidders lists and attend outings the various organizations have. Even if you don't play golf, you can go and network at a golf tournament for example. Stay connected.
