- Become TxDOT Pre-Certified (unless exempt NLC)
- Check current status (yearly renewal through CCIS)
- Have status re-evaluated when changes occur
- Become Administratively Qualified (unless exempt)
- Develop Marketing Material
- Be familiar with TxDOT Projects and Procedures



### Steps to Successful Teaming (cont'd.)

- Meet and become familiar with the firm(s) you intend to team with
- Meet and become familiar with TxDOT District Engineers
- Join local Engineering Societies and/or Organizations
- Establish a "Reputation of Excellence"
- Be "Aggressive" in pursuing work
