We are still using the "older" current precertification categories for Wave 3.</p> <p>PEPS will not be using the new categories until enough consultants have had time to get precertified in these categories, which will be later this year.</p>

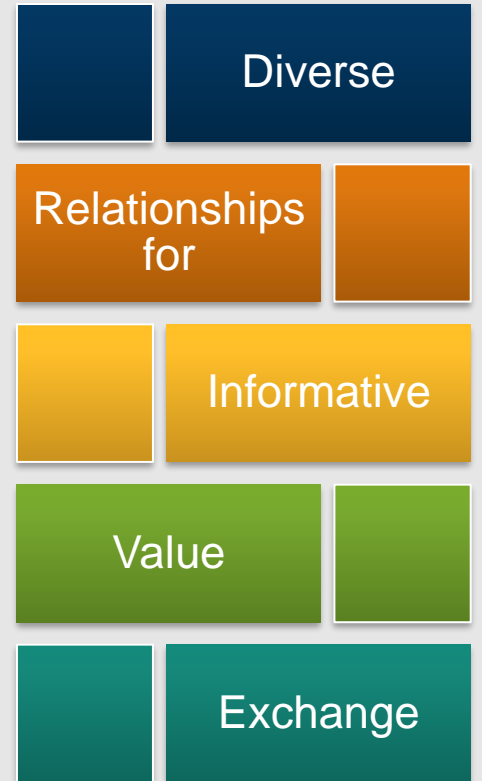

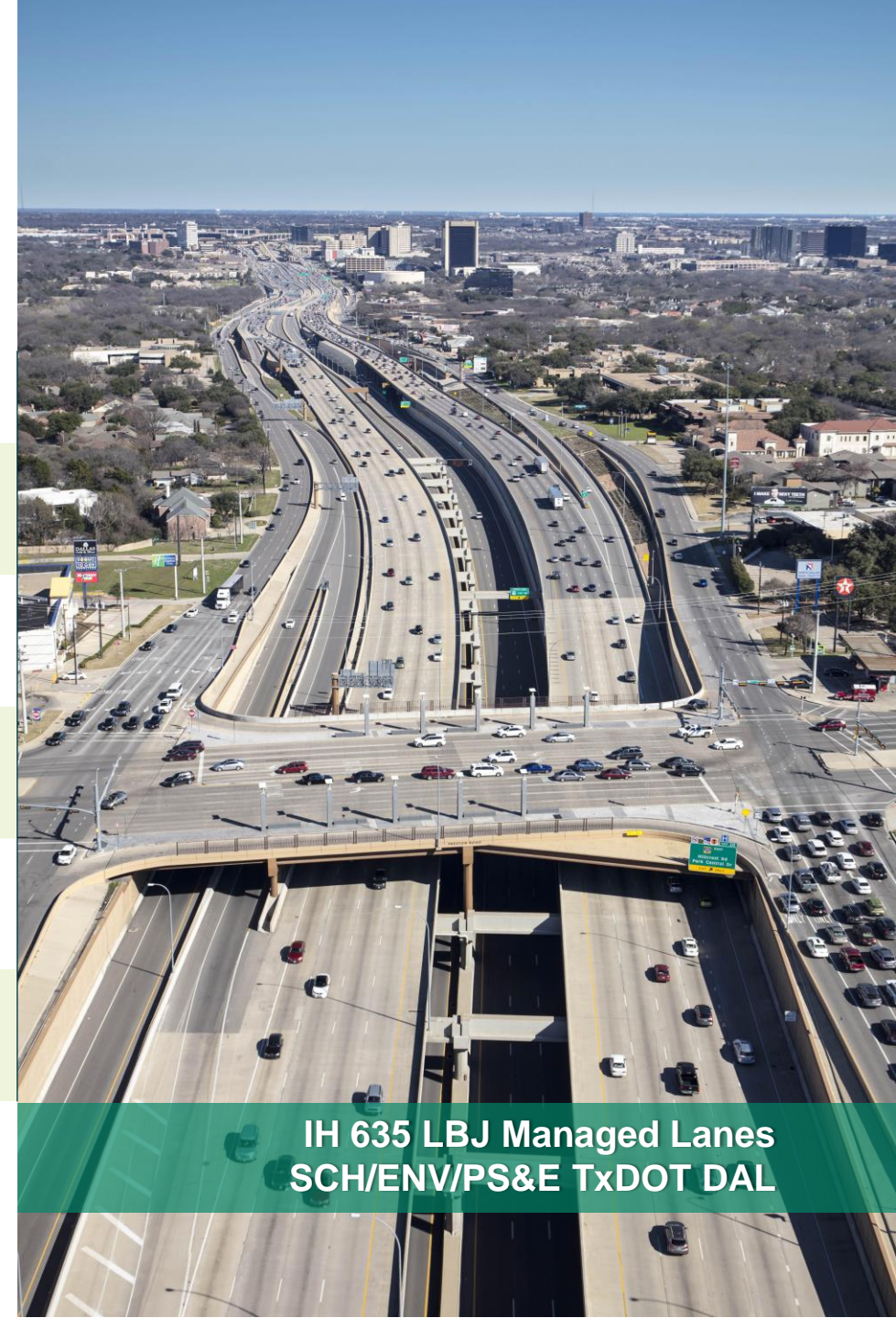

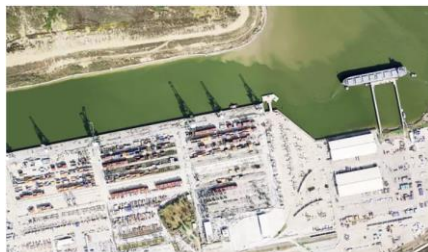
