NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING Interstate Highway 35W Frontage Roads From Dale Earnhardt Way to South of the IH 35E/ IH 35W Interchange Denton County, Texas CSJ 0081-13-065

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will conduct a public meeting for the purpose of soliciting comments on proposed improvements to Interstate Highway (IH) 35W from Dale Earnhardt Way to south of the IH 35E/ IH 35W Interchange in Denton County, Texas., a distance of approximately 12.3 miles. The meeting will be held on Thursday, May 16, 2019 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Argyle Middle School, located at 6601 Canyon Falls Drive, Roanoke, Texas 76262. Representatives from TxDOT and project consultants will be available to answer questions about the proposed project. The meeting will be held in an open house format from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. with no formal presentation.

The proposed project consists of the construction of the northbound and southbound frontage roads for IH 35W from Dale Earnhardt Way in the City of Fort Worth to south of the IH 35E/IH 35W interchange in the City of Denton, Texas. The frontage roads would consist of one 12-foot wide inside travel lane, and one 14-foot wide outside shared-use lane with two-foot wide curb offsets, and a six-foot wide sidewalk in both directions. Other improvements would include changing the IH 35W ramp configuration from a conventional diamond to a reverse diamond (X ramp), and flipping the Farm-to-Market (FM) 1117 (Cross Timber Road), Old Justin Road, and John Paine Road/ Allred Road interchanges so that the IH 35W mainlanes cross over these streets. The existing right-of-way (ROW) width ranges from 300 to 700 feet. The proposed ROW width would range from 390 to 460 feet. The proposed project would require additional ROW.

Maps showing the proposed project's location and preliminary geometric design will be available for viewing at the public meeting. This information will also be on file and available for public inspection at the TxDOT Dallas District Office, 4777 E. Highway 80, Mesquite, TX 75150. Project information also will be available online at www.keepitmovingdallas.com under "Upcoming Public Hearing/Meeting".

All interested persons are invited to attend the Public Meeting. Written comments from the public regarding this project are requested and will be accepted for a period of 15 calendar days following the meeting. Written comments may be submitted either in person at the public meeting, by mail to the TxDOT Dallas District Office, Attention: Nelson Underwood, P.E., 4777 E. Highway 80, Mesquite, TX 75150-6643, or by email addressed to Nelson.Underwood@txdot.gov. Written comments must be postmarked on or before May 31, 2019 to be included in the documentation of the public meeting.

The public meeting will be conducted in English. Persons interested in attending the meeting who have special communication or accommodation needs, such as the need for an interpreter, are encouraged to contact the TxDOT Dallas District Public Information Office at (214) 320-4480 at least two working days prior to the public meeting. TxDOT will make every reasonable effort to accommodate these needs. 

El Departamento de Transporte de Texas (TxDOT) llevará a cabo una reunión pública con el fin de solicitar comentarios sobre las mejoras propuestas para la autopista interestatal (IH) 35W desde Dale Earnhardt Way al sur del intercambio IH 35E / IH 35W en el condado de Denton, Texas, una distancia de aproximadamente 12.3 millas. La reunión se llevará a cabo el jueves 16 de mayo de 2019 de 6:00 p.m. a las 8:00 p.m. en Argyle Middle School, ubicada en 6601 Canyon Falls Drive, Roanoke, Texas 76262. Los representantes de TxDOT y los consultores del proyecto estarán disponibles para responder preguntas sobre el proyecto propuesto. La reunión se llevará a cabo en un formato de casa abierta de 6:00 p.m. a las 8:00 p.m. Sin presentación formal.

El proyecto propuesto consiste en la construcción de vías de acceso norte y sur para IH 35W desde Dale Earnhardt Way en la ciudad de Fort Worth, al sur del intercambio IH 35E / IH 35W en la ciudad de Denton. Las vías de acceso consistirían de un carril de viaje de 12 pies de ancho y otro carril de uso compartido de 14 pies de ancho en el exterior, con retallas de dos pies de ancho entre el carril y la acera, aceras de 6 pies en ambas direcciones. Otras mejoras incluirían cambiar la configuración de rampa IH 35W de un diamante convencional a un diamante inverso (rampa X), y voltear los intercambios Farm-to-Market (FM) 1117 (Cross Timber Road), Old Justin Road y John Paine Road / Allred Road para que IH 35W cruce por encima de estas calles. El ancho del derecho de paso (ROW) existente varía de 300 a 700 pies. El ancho propuesto de ROW sería de entre 390 a 460 pies. El proyecto propuesto requeriría ROW adicional.

Los mapas que muestran la ubicación del proyecto propuesto y diseño geométrico preliminar estarán disponibles para ver en la reunión pública. Trump ramps up attacks on probe

Democrats are calling for

concern that Barr will order unnecessary censoring of the report to protect the president. The House Judiciary Committee, led by Rep. Jerry Nadler of New York, is poised to try to compel Barr to turn over an unredacted copy as well as the reports underlying investigative files.

The Justice Department announced Monday that it expects to release the redacted version Thursday morning, sending the findings of the nearly two-year probe to Con-

gress and making them avail-able to the public. Mueller officially concluded his investigation late last month and submitted the confidential report to Barr. Two days later, the attorney general sent Con-gress a four-page letter that de-tailed Mueller's "principal con-clusions."

In his letter, Barr said the
special counsel did not find a
criminal conspiracy between
Russia and Trump associates
during the campaign.

However, contrary to
Trump's false claim, Mueller
did not reach a conclusion on
whether Trump obstructed justice. Instead, Mueller presented
evidence on both sides of that
question. Barr said he did not
believe the evidence was sufficient to prove that Trump had
obstructed justice, but he noted
that Mueller's toam did not exonerate the president.

Portions of the report being
released by the Justice Department will be redacted to protect
grand jury material, sensitive intelligence, matters that could affect ongoing investigations and
damage to the privacy rights of
third parties, the attorney general has said.

They have painted House Democratic investigations as partisan overreach and have targeted news outlets and indi-vidual reporters they say have promoted the collusion story. The president himself seethed at a political rally that the whole thing was an attempt to tear up the fabric of our great democra-or.

He has told confidants in recent days that he was certain the full report would back up his claims of vindication but was also convinced the media would manipulate the findings in an effort to damage him, accord-ing to two Republicus close to the White House not authorized to speak publicly about private conversations. In the waiting game's final days, the White House continued to try to shape the narrative. "There was no obstruction, which I don't how you can in-terpret that any other way than total exoneration,' press secre-tary Sanders said on Fax News Sunday. also convinced the media would

Strong storms continue sweep through country

Strong storms, including

more than a dozen confirmed
tormadoes and flooding, killing
at least eight people, injuring
dozens and flattening much of a

been asleep when the tree fell at 1:43 a.m. An 82-year-old man who was in the home was taken to a hospital with injuries that were not life-threatening. In Shelity, Ohio, the Nation-al Weather Service said an EF2 tornado with winds of up to 125 mph touched down Sunday. No deaths were reported, but Rich-land County emergency officials said several homes and busi-nesses were damaged and that at least six people were injured in the city roughly 90 miles southwest of Cleveland. The weather service says an EFO tornado with maximum winds of about 70 mph also swept through part of Clark County in western Ohio on Sunday, about 40 miles west of Columbus, and damaged some mobile homes.

mobile homes. Storms on Monday spawned a tornado watch and flooded roadways in some areas of New Jersey, causing a roof to collapse at an apartment complex in Camden.

Seliger's announcement came alongside a reworked bill, that was unwelled Monday with a handful of technical changes and one notable concession. As updated, SB 2 will force cities, counties and other taxing entities to receive veter approval before raising 3.5% more property tax revenue than the previous year—a change from the 2.5% trigger originally proposed. School districts would still face the 2.5% threshold under the version of the bill approved Monday.

version of the bill approved Monday.

Revenue generated on new construction does not count to-ward the threshold. And small taxing units, with sales and property tax levies under \$15 million annually, will need to opt into some of SB 2's provi-sions in an observer.

opt into some of SB 2's provisions in an election.

Municipal leaders and law-makers like Seliger, a former mayor, have called the 2.5% figure punitively low and said it would cripple local governments' ability to provide public safety services. A I percentage point increase is unlikely to appease them; the Senate and House deadlocked at higher thresholds of 4% and 6%, respectively, in 2017.

But a long-shot bid to replace the 3.5% figure with 6% did not advance Monday. Other amend-ments — which would have exempted hospital districts, community colleges and certain municipal services from parts of the property tax legislation — all failed, largely on party-line votes.

And when state Sen. Beverfy Powell, D. Burleson, described the possible effects of \$8.2 on her local cities and counties, it prompted the author of the legislation, Sen. Paul Bettencourf, R-Houston, to respond: "This is where my teddy bear becomes a grizzly bear." Her amendment was not adopted.

One successful change came from Sen. Pete Flores, R-Pleas-anton, who proposed allowing the money counties spend on indigent defense to be partly ex-cluded from the revenue growth calculation.

What he could preserve, however, was the "reputation of the Texas Senate" as a deliberative and celli-gial boot; He vone to allow the bill to be debated, awarting the need for the "nuclear option," and criticized Patrick for even floating the idea in a lengthy speech on the Senate floor.

We have a way to do things that I think is important. It underscores that we must be willing to compromise, said Seliger, an Amarillo Republican who has clashed with Patrick in the past. 

after lawyers from the Justice Department and the office of the special coun-sel, Robert Mueller, finish blacking out secret grand

jury testimony, classified information, material relat-ed to continuing investiga-tions and other sensitive information.

tions and other sensitive information.

Barr, who was sworn in as attorney general in February, said in a letter to congressional judiciary committee leaders last month that the report "sets forth the special counsel's findings, his analysis and the reasons for his conclusions" in his inquiry into possible links between the Trump campaign and Russia's election interference and whether President Donald whether President Donald Trump illegally obstructed the investigation.

"Everyone will soon be able to read it on their own," Barr said of the

Barr and Rod J. Rosenstein, the deputy attorney general, set off a firestorm when they concluded that Trump had not committed "an obstruction-of-justice offense" in lieu of a deter-mination from Mueller himself. Some prosecutors who worked for Mueller

himself. Some prosecutors who worked for Mueller have said Barr did not accurately represent their findings.

Under the special counsel rules, the attorney general can decide whether to share the report with the public and how much of it to release. But Democrats have shown an unwillingness to rely on willingness to rely on

Barr's judgments.
The House Judiciary
Committee voted to authorize a subpoena to compel Barr to turn over an unredacted copy of the special counsel's report as well as its underlying investigative files.






Photograph 3: Public Meeting Outdoor Directional Signage.




Photograph 4: Attendees signing in at the Public Meeting Registration Table.






Photograph 8: Project Location Map Exhibit Board.




Photograph 9: Comment Area.
