1	Ahrens, Todd	10/18/2018	Verbal Comment	I feel the project is a bit shortsighted by going to four lanes versus six. If you're going to build it, just do it right and do it once. This is going to be a pain for everybody in this room and then some, so just go ahead and do the six and be done. I'm not quite sure how you guys haven't qualified us for the six. When I drive 78 Lavon, they've got almost, seems like almost eight lines of concrete up there and there's not half the amount of traffic and semi traffic up there that we have between Terrell and Rockwall connecting at two interstates. We've got big businesses like Mrs. Baird's bread and they run semi-trucks constantly down this road, back and forth all day long. And Rockwall business park is only getting bigger and this is the direct corridor for them to get to 80 and 20. So I think if you're talking about a finish date of 2026, I think by 2026, that's eight years from now, this road will more than qualify for six lanes. I also look at the safety hazard of this only being two lanes on each side with a curb. There's no safety lane for anybody to pull onto with the curb there, like up on John King. So if my wife or my kids or me get a flat tire, where am I going? There's no place for me to go. And for the first responders, you're talking about if somebody can't get off the side of the road or they can't pull an accident off the side of road into a median or into another lane, now you're going to start plugging up everything that is going north or south anyways. So I just ask that you reconsider doing the six lanes and coming in here, getting in our hair for five, six, seven, eight years, and then moving on to another project so you don't have to come back and start over again. Thank you for your consideration.	Based on the traffic projections within the proposed project limits, a six-lane facility is not warranted at this time. The Texas Department of Transportation's (TxDOT) is committed to making improvements to State Highway (SH) 205 that will improve its operational efficiency as well as safety. Incorporating a median would improve the safety along SH 205 by providing a buffer between opposing traffic. The final location of median openings, including any additional median openings, will be evaluated as the project progresses in final design through ongoing coordination with cities and counties  TxDOT will also reinvestigate if a Two-Way Left-Turn Lane (TWLTL) is a more appropriate design at some locations along SH 205 instead of a raised median.  "Safety lanes" otherwise known as shoulders are provided on high speed roads and rural roads. SH 205 is being reconstructed as an urban roadway with lower design speeds. Standard design for urban roads does not include shoulders. Usually on urban roads there are enough driveways where vehicles and pull off the roadway if needed.  While it is not possible to provide median openings at every requested location, such will be considered when safety and design standards permit in accordance with the TxDOT's Roadway Design Manual and Access Management Manual. The final design will also evaluate the need for any additional turn lanes, as warranted.

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4	Budhwani, Karim & Saher	10/31/2018	Written Comment	My wife and I just moved into our newly built home in June of 2018 (R-581). Our property will be directly impacted by this project. The entire purpose of moving out to this area was for the peace, quiet, and land. We specifically chose our lot for the size, location, and shape. With the size of the land we acquired, we were far enough away from the traffic on the current SH20Sh to where we wouldn't hear a lot of the traffic. With this project, however, TXDOT wants to take away 25-30 feet from our property to contribute to a six-lane highway. Our concerns with this are:  1. We understand for widening the road a little but not to the point to where it needs to be 6 lanes. On top of that, not only is it being widened to an extreme six lanes, but it's also supporting a bicycle/walk/jog path. This will cause more accidents and possibly extreme fatalities with the number of trucks that drive by. Through the duration of the time that we have been living here, we have yet to see a single cyclist or a person walking or jogging along 205. Most people do that within their neighborhood.  2. Across the highway from us, there are sites with 10-15 acres of land. I propose acquiring more land from the East side of SH205 rather than the West side when it comes to the neighborhood of Chisholm Ranch Estate.  3. When we attended the public hearing, we were advised that the sound study was based off a model rather than a live sound study. With the number of trucks that go by throughout the day and night, this project should require a live study to determine the impact.	Transportation improvements are needed on SH 205 in the proposed project area to meet the increasing transportation demands caused by rapid suburban development in surrounding areas. Population growth has resulted in increased traffic demands within the SH 205 corridor. Improvements are also needed to improve operational efficiency and safety for vehicles traveling on SH 205. In addition, the proposed project is consistent with local and regional plans. The proposed project includes outside 14-foot wide shared-use lanes (one in each direction) and 5-foot wide sidewalks throughout the SH 205 corridor, which improves safety for non-motorists.  The alternatives analysis process considered multiple roadway alignments during project development. An evaluation process was used to identify a preferred alternative that minimized impacts to the extent possible in the corridor. Factors considered during the alternatives analysis included safety, mobility, access, ROW impacts, environmental impacts, costs, and public input. Various roadway alignments were considered at this location before the current alignment was identified as the preferred alternative. This alignment has been further refined and optimized during development of the schematic to minimize the impacts to this property as much as possible. In order to avoid impacting property R-581, the alignment would have to be shifted to the east, which would impact multiple adjacent businesses, residences, and ponds on the east side of SH 205. This alternative was evaluated during our alternatives analysis and was determined not to be preferred for the proposed roadway alignment at this location. This notice advises the public that a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) is available for public review and that TxDOT will be conducting a public hearing on the proposed project. **The hearing will be held on Thursday, October 18, 2018 at Chisholm Baptist Church located at 1388 South SH 205, Rockwall, Texas 75032**. Displays will be available for viewing at 6:00 p.m. with the formal hearing starting at 7:00 p.m. The purpose of the hearing is to present the planned improvements and to receive public comment on the proposed project.

The proposed project would widen SH 205 from US 80 in Terrell to the junction of SH 205/John King Boulevard (South Goliad Street), a distance of approximately 13.07 miles, within the cities of Rockwall, McLendon-Chisholm and Terrell, Texas. Phased construction of SH 205 includes interim and ultimate improvements. Interim improvements would include constructing a four-lane urban roadway with an inside 12-foot wide travel lane (one in each direction) and an outside 14-foot wide travel lane (one in each direction) for shared use by bicycles and vehicles. Five-foot wide sidewalks would be constructed on each side of SH 205 throughout the proposed project limits. A 42-foot wide median would divide the northbound and southbound lanes. In the ultimate phase of construction, inside widening would occur within the 42-foot median and an additional 12-foot wide lane would be constructed in each direction with an 18-foot median remaining.

The existing facility is an undivided two-lane roadway (one lane in each direction) consisting of 12-foot wide travel lanes and 10-foot wide shoulders within a typical 100 to 120-foot wide right-of-way (ROW). Proposed ROW width would vary from 120 to 700 feet wide throughout the project limits. The proposed project would potentially displace four commercial structures, a utility structure, the McLendon-Chisholm Fire Department office, one memorial structure, one barn structure and an abandoned gas station for a total of nine structures. Your statements and comments will be addressed in this documentation and will be given full 12 13 consideration in the preparation of the final 14 recommendation and design for the SH-205 South Project. After my initial comments, Jeremy will give 15 a detailed presentation concerning the location and 16 17 design features for the proposed improvements of the SH-205 South Project. 18 Samantha will then discuss the environmental 19 effects related to the project. At the conclusion of 20 the formal presentation, we will recess the hearing for 21 20 minutes and allow you the opportunity to review the 22 23 project design currently on display here tonight. 24 During the recess you are encouraged to ask

questions which the department representatives will

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address and answer.

Following the recess, we will reconvene the hearing and ask those persons who indicated on the verbal comment registration form they would like to make a statement to come forward to our floor microphone, state their name and address for the record, and provide comments, what they like or don't like, positive or negative concerning the project.

Following the registered speakers, anyone who did not register will also be given an opportunity to comment.

Please note that if you wish to make a verbal statement but would rather not do so from the floor, after we reconvene, you are invited to make your statement to the court reporter during the recess. You may also choose to use this time to complete one of our written comment forms.

The design schematic and environmental documentation for the proposed SH-205 South Project are available for inspection and reproduction at the Texas Department of Transportation, Dallas District office located at 4777 East US Highway 80 in Mesquite, 75150.

In addition, the design schematic may be viewed on the Internet at TxDOT.gov under hearings and meetings schedule and at keepitmovingdallas.com under

1 public hearings, slash, meetings. 2 At this time Jeremy will provide an overview 3 of the proposed design features for the SH-205 South 4 Project. Thank you, Ceason. 5 MR. MCGAHAN: TxDOT is proposing to reconstruct and widen SH-205 from US-80 to 7 the junction of State Highway 205 and John King Boulevard, a distance of 13.07 miles in Kaufman and 8 9 Rockwall Counties, Texas. 10 Transportation improvements are needed to 11 the SH-205 corridor to meet the increasing 12 transportation demands caused by rapid suburban 13 development in surrounding areas. 14 In addition, improvements to the corridor are needed to improve operational efficiency and safety 15 for vehicles traveling on SH-205. 16 17 The purpose of the proposed project is to 18 improve mobility and safety within the SH-205 corridor. 19 The proposed improvements for the project would be designed in accordance with the current TxDOT design 20 21 standards providing adequate capacity to facilitate stable traffic flow through the corridor. 22 23 Bicycle and pedestrian accommodations

included with the project would also improve mobility

and connectivity by providing for alternative modes of

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travel.

The existing SH-205 facility with the project limits is undivided two-lane roadway with twelve-foot-wide travel lanes and ten-foot-wide shoulders within a typical 100- to 120-foot-wide right-of-way.

The proposed project would widen SH-205 from a two-lane rural to an ultimate urban -- to an ultimate urban divided six-lane highway. Phased construction of SH-205 includes interim and ultimate improvements.

Interim improvements would include constructing a four-lane urban roadway with an inside twelve-foot-wide travel lane, one in each direction and an outside fourteen-foot-wide travel lane, one in each direction for shared use by bicycle and vehicles.

Five-foot-wide sidewalks would also be constructed on each side of SH-205 throughout the proposed project limits.

A 42-foot-wide median would divide the northbound and southbound lanes. The proposed right-of-way width would vary from 120 feet wide to up to 700 feet wide throughout the project limits.

However, the typical right-of-way width would be approximately 150 feet as shown in a typical section on the slide.

1 And improvements are also proposed at the 2 US-80 and SH-205 intersection to accommodate additional 3 turn lanes. Two dedicated left-turn lanes would be 4 constructed for southbound traffic on SH-205 turning eastbound onto US-80. 5 6 A right-turn lane would be reconfigured for westbound traffic on US-80 turning northbound onto 7 8 SH-205. 9 Six bridges over Bachelor Creek, Little High 10 Point Creek, High Point Creek, Berry Creek, Hackberry 11 Creek, and Brushy Creek would be reconstructed to 12 accommodate the widened roadway and for hydraulic 13 conveyance purposes. 14 In the ultimate phase of construction inside widening would occur within the 42-foot-wide median. 15 additional twelve-foot-wide lane would be constructed in 16 17 each direction with a typical 18-foot-wide median remaining. 18 Utilities such as waterlines, sewer lines, 19 gas lines, telephone cables, electric lines, and other 20

1 The proposed project is anticipated to be 2 let for construction in February of 2023 and would take 3 approximately three years to construct. The estimated 4 total cost for the project is \$163 million. 5 This concludes the design portion of the presentation. I will now turn the hearing over to 7 Samantha to provide an overview of the environmental 8 evaluation for the proposed SH-205 South Project. 9 MS. KANNENBERG: Thank you, Jeremy. Prior 10 to December 16, 2014, the Federal Highway 11 Administration, or FHWA, reviewed and approved documents 12 prepared under the National Environmental Policy Act known as NEPA. 13 14 However, on December 16, 2014, TxDOT assumed responsibility from FHWA to review and approve certain 15 assigned NEPA environmental documents. Environmental 16 17 studies have been performed for the proposed SH-205 18 South Project to determine whether any finding of no 19 significant impact would be appropriate in accordance with NEPA. 20 21 The environmental analyses are necessary to 22 identify, avoid, and minimize effects to the human and natural environments. Technical documentation of the 23 environmental studies was approved for further 24

processing by TxDOT and has been coordinated with other

25

1 public agencies. 2 Notices for this public hearing were 3 advertised in the Dallas Morning News, Al Dia, Rockwall 4 Herald Banner, and the Terrell Tribune. The TxDOT Public Information Office also prepared a news release 5 media -- excuse me, prepared a news media release to 7 advertise the public hearing. 8 The draft environmental assessment is available for your review at the environmental table and 9 10 is also available at the TxDOT Dallas District office. 11 The environmental assessment for this 12 project addressed the potential impacts identified 13 during the engineering and design phase of the proposed 14 project. 15 These areas of potential impacts include natural, social, and cultural resources as well as 16 17 potential impacts to adjacent and surrounding land use. This slide shows a list of all resources and 18 issues that were evaluated during the environmental 19 The following slides include a summary of the 20

Studies of potential impacts to cultural resources included a survey of historic-age properties such as residences, barns, and other structures as well as surveys for archaeological resources.

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more notable findings.

1 A total of 43 historic-age structures 2 constructed prior to 1978 were surveyed. 3 historians evaluated these structures and found that none of them met eligibility criteria for listing on the National Register of Historic Places or NRHP. 5 6 The surveys for archeological resources did not result in any findings of artifacts or archeological 7 8 sites that meet NRHP eligibility criteria or warrant designation as a state antiquities landmark. 9 10 Portions of the proposed project area are in 11 the FEMA designated 100-year plains of Bachelor Creek, 12 Terry Creek, Little High Point Creek, High Point Creek, 13 Berry Creek, Hackberry Creek, Brushy Creek, and Long 14 Branch. The hydraulic design for this project would 15 be in accordance with current FHWA and TxDOT policies. 16 17 The facility would permit the conveyance of the 100-year 18 flood without causing significant damage to the 19 facility, streams, or other properties. The proposed project would increase the base 20 21 flood elevation to a level that would violate applicable floodplains regulations and ordinances. 22 23 The proposed project would result in the permanent fill of approximately 0.52 acre of streams and 24 25 1.58 acres of wetlands associated with waters of the

1 U.S.

This regulated activity can be authorized under a Clean Water Act Section 404 Nationwide Permit 14 with preconstruction notification to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Compensatory mitigation would also be required.

A traffic noise analysis was conducted in accordance with TxDOT's FHWA approved 2011 Guidelines For Analysis and Abatement of Roadway Traffic Noise.

The analysis concentrated on model noise receivers from nearby residential neighborhoods.

Of the 127 represented noise receivers analyzed, four receivers are expected to be impacted by noise. Noise abatement and mitigation options were considered for these receivers in accordance with TxDOT and FHWA criteria.

However, it was determined that the construction of noise barriers for the affected receivers would exceed the construction cost criteria of \$25,000 per benefitted receiver.

As the cost for noise barriers would exceed the criteria and agency guidelines, noise abatement barriers are not recommended for this project.

We can assist you with any questions regarding the noise study during the recess.

1 Regarding the items summarized and other 2 potential impacts evaluated, the study's analyses and 3 evaluation performed thus far indicate the proposed 4 improvements would cause no significant environmental 5 impacts. 6 A total of approximately 92.2 acres of new 7 right-of-way and 1.4 acres for permanent drainage 8 easements would be required. The proposed improvements would require new right-of-way for both the east and 9 10 west side of SH-205 within the project limits. 11 The proposed project would result in the 12 potential displacement and/or relocation of four commercial structures, one utility structure, the 13 14 McClendon Chisholm fire department office, one barn, a memorial structure, and an abandoned gas station. 15 No public facilities such as parks, 16 17 recreational facilities, churches, schools, or 18 cemeteries would be displaced as a result of the 19 construction of the proposed improvements. All right-of-way acquisition would be 20 21 completed in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 22 1978 as amended. 23 24 There are representatives at the 25 right-of-way table to assist you with information on the

I'm not quite sure how you guys haven't 24

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qualified us for the six.

When I drive 78 Lavonne, they've got almost, seems like almost eight lines of concrete up there and there's not half the amount of traffic and semi traffic up there that we have between Terrell and Rockwall connecting at two interstates.

We've got big businesses like Mrs. Baird's bread and they run semi-trucks constantly down this road, back and forth all day long. And Rockwall business park is only getting bigger and this is the direct corridor for them to get to 80 and 20.

So I think if you're talking about a finish date of 2026, I think by 2026, that's eight years from now, this road will more than qualify for six lanes.

I also look at the safety hazard of this only being two lanes on each side with a curb. There's no safety lane for anybody to pull onto with the curb there, like up on John King.

So if my wife or my kids or me get a flat tire, where am I going? There's no place for me to go. And for the first responders, you're talking about if somebody can't get off the side of the road or they can't pull an accident off the side of road into a median or into another lane, now you're going to start plugging up everything that is going north or south anyways.

1 So I just ask that you reconsider doing the 2 six lanes and coming in here, getting in our hair for 3 five, six, seven, eight years, and then moving on to 4 another project so you don't have to come back and start over again. Thank you for your consideration. 5 6 MS. CLEMENS: Thank you. Is there anyone 7 else who would like to come forward to make a statement? 8 MR. FERIT: I'm Chris Ferit, and we're directly adjacent to the Highway 205. 10 I learned this evening that the noise 11 portion of the environmental study was based on a 12 computer algorithm as opposed to doing actual 13 measurements. 14 Given the number of 18-wheeler traffic that 15 we actually have that the gentleman just expressed, I question some of the assumptions that were made in that 16 17 study that was based on it. I would like to see some validations of 18 19 testing done with actual measurements, particularly in the neighborhood like our Long Branch neighborhood. 20 That's all I want to say. 21 22 MS. 1) With almost doubling the amount traffic in the next 20 years why would not they go with a 6 main lane main roadway? Only 4 main lanes seems like we will be right back to where we are now in only 20 years?

Did they give a reason for only building 4 main lanes?

2) In addition to the left turning lane that is being added to the intersection of 205 and Via Toscana will

there ever be a stop light? If no, why not?

3) In Appendix F on the Environmental Assessment there were the following items listed and I wanted to

know what was the result of the noise level that was produced and was it more or less than the rule to

determine whether or not it would qualify to have a noise barrier placed during construction? (Appendix

F: R66, R67, R68, R69, R71, R73, R74, R76)

For question 3, the citizen believes that the noise level is currently high throughout the subdivision and will be unbearable for those homes that border 205 once the lanes expand and the traffic increases, in addition to being uncomfortably high for the entire neighborhood. The citizen expressed concern that while the expanded lanes will be beneficial to manage traffic flow, the homeowners in the area would like to maintain the peaceful setting that they desired.

After reviewing the entire EA and attending the TxDOT meeting, I did review page 31-32 and page 35 that would pertain to this subject, maybe I missed it.

I look forward to hearing your feedback and/or direction of a reference for me to respond back to those who asked the 3 questions.





- 3. When we attended the public hearing, we were advised that the sound study was based off a model rather than a live sound study. With the number of trucks that go by throughout the day and night, this project should require a live study to determine the impact.





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

During SH 205 hearing meeting last night, I was informed that there are no current plans to provide sound walls adjacent to the Chisholm Ranch Estates subdivision abutting Highway 205 (bordered on east side by Hwy. 548.)

Prior to the meeting, others and myself met with the engineering and environmental representatives at which time we were informed that:

- 1. There are no future project plans in place to construct a sound and site wall within the current planning or budget framework.
- 2. The project sound study investigation was comprised of a model and not live data.

We believe that the increase in traffic and associated noise generated by doubling the traffic capacity will:

- Exacerbate the noise to an unhealthy and unacceptable level unless mitigation such as a sound wall is constructed.
- Further, many of the property values will almost certainly be negatively impacted by the intrusion of the roadway into the subdivision unless some mitigation such as a site wall and sound wall is erected.

For these and other reasons we the undersigned residents of Chisholm Ranch Estates, are requesting that:


