That is one subdivision. And the traffic all tends to come down Custer to get to 380, so the noise will only increase. The protocol used by the consultant, TXDOT, etc., to complete the model makes some very unrealistic assumptions to keep the results artificially low. And what we found is that the readings that I made — I took were seven percent higher, about four, almost five decibels higher than the 65-DB standard where above that you have to provide noise abatement in our — for the roadway.  So they were about seven percent higher. And then when you look at study averages compared to the averages of the readings I took, the study averages were — my readings, well, they were 20 percent higher than the study average.  They're way off. The readings I took were — were during the morning and evening rush hour, which is pretty painful when you're in the backyard. In our backyard, we cannot enjoy it during those periods of time.  And so I am requesting that we consider — reconsider putting noise abatement on this project. And I'm also — would like to — to address some of the things that were addressed earlier, which is the model is only as good as its assumptions. Construction of the proposed facility would be staged with the existing two-lane roadway first being expanded to four lanes. The proposed four-lane facility would consist of one 11-foot wide inside travel lane and one 14-foot wide outside travel lane in each direction with two-foot wide inside and outside curb offsets, 22-foot wide outside borders with five-foot wide sidewalks, and a 38-foot wide raised median. Expansion to the ultimate six-lane facility would occur at a later date. The ultimate six-lane facility would consist of two 11-foot wide inside travel lanes and one 14-foot wide outside travel lane in each direction with two-foot wide inside and outside curb offsets, 22-foot wide outside borders with five-foot wide sidewalks, and a 16-foot wide raised median. At various cross streets, the median would be reduced to accommodate a 10-foot wide left-turn lane, or 10-foot and 12-foot wide dual left-turn lanes and a 12-foot wide right-turn lane.

A 22-foot wide connector road would be constructed approximately 1,600 feet south of where the realigned section of FM 2478 connects with existing FM 1461. This road would connect the realigned section of FM 2478 to the existing FM 2478. A 10-foot wide left-turn lane would allow northbound motorists on the realigned section of FM 2478 to access the connector road and existing FM 2478. 



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

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this hearing, the department will proceed with the preparation of the final environmental documentation.

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Your statements and comments will be addressed in this documentation and will be given full consideration in the preparation of the final recommendation and design for the F.M. 2478 Widening Project.

Following my initials comments, Mr. Kurt Aungst will -- will give a detailed presentation concerning the location and design features of the proposed F.M. 2478 Widening Project. Mr. Chris Hagar will follow that with a discussion of the environmental study and right-of-way impacts related to the project.

At that time, we'll recess the hearing for 20 minutes and allow you the opportunity to view the project design currently on display here tonight. During the recess you are encouraged to ask questions, which the department representatives will address and answer.

Following the recess, we'll reconvene the hearing and ask those persons who indicated in the yellow verbal comment registration form that they would like to come to make a statement, to come forward to our floor microphone, clearly state their name and address for the record and provide comments, what they like or don't

like, positive or negative, concerning the project. 1 Following the registered speakers, anyone 2 who did not register will also be given an opportunity to 3 comment. 4 Please note that if you wish to make a 5 verbal statement but would rather not do so from the 6 7 floor microphone after we reconvene, you are invited to make your statement to the court reporter during the recess. You may also choose to use this time to complete one of our written comment forms. 10 At this time, Mr. Kurt -- Mr. Kurt Aungst 11 will provide an overview of the proposed design features 12 of the F.M. 2478 Widening Project. 13 MR. AUNGST: Thank you, Mr. Bur. Prior to 14 December 16th, 2014, the Federal Highway Administration 15 or FHWA reviewed and approved documents prepared under 16 the National Environmental Policy Act known as NEPA. 17 18 However, on December 16th, 2014, the Texas 19 Department of Transportation assumed responsibility from FHWA to review and approve certain assigned NEPA 20 environmental documents. 21 Environmental studies have been performed 22 for the proposed F.M. 2478 Widening Project to support an 23 environmental assessment determination in accordance with 24 25 NEPA. The environmental analyses are necessary to

identify, avoid, and minimize effects to the human and national environments.

Technical documentation was approved for further processing by TxDOT's Environmental Affairs
Division or ENV and has been coordinated with other public agencies. Notices for this public hearing were advertised in the Dallas Morning News, Al Dia, McKinney Courier Gazette, and the Prosper Press.

The TxDOT Public Information Office also prepared a news media release to advertise the public hearing. The environmental technical reports and draft environmental assessment are available here tonight for your review at the environmental table and are also available at the TxDOT Dallas District Office.

A design schematic has been developed showing typical cross-sections, roadway profiles, and proposed right-of-way boundaries. The design of F.M. 2478 Widening Project was developed cooperatively by the Texas Department of Transportation, the North Central Texas Council of Governments, which is the metropolitan planning organization for North Texas, and the Federal Highway Administration.

In addition, highway planning and construction requires close cooperation among all levels of government. The department has worked closely with

the local governments and has previously received input regarding the proposed design.

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The design schematic and environmental documentation for the proposed F.M. 2478 Widening Project are available for inspection and reproduction at the TxDOT Dallas District Office located at 4777 East Highway 80 in Mesquite, Texas 75150 and at the TxDOT Collin County area office located at 2205 South State Highway 5, McKinney, Texas, 75069.

In addition, the design schematic may be viewed on the internet at www.keepitmovingDallas.com under upcoming public hearings, slash, meetings.

The study area limits for the planned and proposed improvements extend along F.M. 2478 from U.S. 380 to north of F.M. 1461. The project limits extended approximately 3.174 miles within the city --Cites of McKinney and Celina and the Town of Prosper in Collin County, Texas.

A proposed project is needed to meet future travel demands stemming from projected population growth and traffic volumes and to bring the roadway up to current design standards.

Currently, F.M. 2478 is an undivided two-lane roadway with ten-foot wide travel lanes and no shoulders. The drainage is conveyed in open ditches

along both sides of the roadway. The usual existing 1 right-of-way widths are 90 feet from U.S. 380 to 2 F.M. 1461 and 100 feet from F.M. 1461 to the project terminus. 4 Currently, there are no existing bicycle 5 or pedestrians accommodations within the project limits. 6 7 The proposed project includes the reconstruction and widening F.M. 2478 from U.S. 380 to north of F.M. 1461. Proposed improvements would involve the expansion from a two-lane rural roadway to a six-lane divided urban 10 11 roadway. 12 Bicycle and pedestrian accommodations would be constructed as part of the proposed project. 13 The proposed right-of-way width varies from 138 to 217 14 feet with the usual right-of-way width of 150 feet. 15 Construction of the proposed facility 16 would be staged with the existing two-lane roadway first 17 being expanded to four lanes. The ultimate 13 expansion would consist of two 11-foot wide inside travel 14 lanes and 14-foot wide outside shared use lane in each 15 direction with a -- with 22-foot wide outside borders and 16 a 16-foot wide raised median. 17 The 22-foot wide outside borders would 18 19 accommodate the five-foot wide sidewalks. Turn lanes would be provided at various cross-streets. 20 21 Utilities such as water lines, sewer lines, gas lines, telephone cables, electrical lines, and 22 other underground and overhead utilities may need to be 23 adjusted. The adjustment and relocation of any utilities 24

would be managed so that no substantial interruptions

would occur while these adjustments are being made. 1 The proposed project is anticipated to be 2 let for construction in fall 2020 and will take 3 approximately two years to construct. The estimated 4 total cost for the four-lane roadway project is \$29.5 5 million. 6 7 This concludes the project information and design portion of the presentation. And we'll now turn the hearing over to Mr. Chris Hagar who will address environmental, right-of-way scheduling topics. 10 MR. HAGAR: Thank you, Mr. Aungst. 11 Environmental studies have been performed for the 12 proposed F.M. 2478 Widening Project to support 13 environmental assessment determination in accordance with 14 the National Environmental Policy Act also known as NEPA. 15 The environmental analyses are necessary 16 to identify, avoid, and minimize effects to the human and 17 18 natural environments. The technical documentation for 19 this project address the potential environmental impacts identified during the engineering and design phase of 20 this project. 21 These areas of potential impacts included 22 natural, social, and cultural resources as well as 23 potential impacts to adjacent and surrounding land use. 24 The proposed project would cross the 100-year floodplain 25

at the Rutherford Branch, a tributary for Rutherford 1 Branch, Wilson Creek, and a tributary to Wilson Creek. 2 The hydraulic design for this project 3 would be in accordance with current TxDOT policies. The 4 facility would permit the conveyance of the 100-year 5 flood without causing significant damage to the facility, 6 7 stream or other property. The proposed project would not increase 8 the base flood elevation to a level that would violate 9 applicable floodplain regulations and ordinances. 10 Temporary and permanent impacts to waters of the United 11 States would occur at four stream crossings. 12 Impacts would be authorized by the U.S. 13 Army Corp of Engineers under a Section 404, Nationwide 14 Permit 14 without a preconstruction notification. 15 The proposed project would not result in 16 direct impacts to known historical resources. 17 18 Implementation of the proposed projects would not require relocation or displacement of any National Register of 19 Historic Places or NHRP (sic) structures. 20 21 The proposed project would require a right-of-way from a parcel containing an historic-age 22 resource (Southern Pyramidal Roof Cottage) recommended 23 eligible for the NRHP. It was determined that the taking 24 of the property would not have an adverse effect on the 25

structure. A section 4(f) de minimus determination was made on April 9th, 2015.

A traffic noise analysis was accomplished in accordance with TxDOT's FHWA approved 2011 Guidelines for Analysis and Abatement of Roadway Traffic Noise. Results of the traffic noise analysis indicated that the proposed project would not result in traffic noise impacts. Therefore, noise barriers or other mitigation were not evaluated.

In conclusion, the studies, analyses, and evaluations performed thus far indicate the proposed improvements would cost no significant environmental impacts. A total of approximately 36.8 acres of new right-of-way and 0.6 acres for easements would be acquired.

The proposed improvements would require new right-of-way from both east and west sides of F.M. 2478 within the projects limits.

The proposed project would result in the potential displacement and/or relocation of one residential structure, three utility structures, slash, out buildings, and three miscellaneous structures. No public facilities such as parks, recreational facilities, churches, schools or cemeteries would be displaced as a result of the construction of the proposed project.

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All right-of-way acquistion would be completed in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Acquisition Policies Act 1970, as There are representatives at the right-of-way amended. table in the foyer to assist you with information on the process that TxDOT would follow for right-of-way acquisition.

Brochures, including two booklets titled The Purchase of Right-of-Way and Relocation Assistance are also available for you at the right-of-way table here tonight. These booklets contain detailed information to inform you of your rights and provide information about our right-of-way acquisition procedures.

Following this hearing, documentation of this public hearing will be reviewed by TxDOT for final environmental clearance and design approval. If there are no major issues arising from this issue -- hearing that cannot be addressed in a reasonable timeframe, final environmental clearance is expected during the summer of 2017.

As mentioned earlier, construction is anticipated to fall -- to begin in fall of 2020, and is expected to open to traffic in the fall of 2022.

Thank you for your attention. I will now return the hearing to Mr. Bur.

MR. BUR: Thank you, Chris. Before we 1 take a brief recess, I would like to mention that we will 2 not attempt to answer your questions while you have the floor during the opportunity for public comment. 4 5 This procedure is necessary so that everyone is given the opportunity to speak and because 6 7 your comments will be given due consideration. We'll be happy to answer your questions during the recess or even after this hearing. If you wish to have a verbal comment 10 recorded by the court reporter rather than speak when --11 when the -- when we reconvene, please do so during the 12 13 recess. All substantive comments and questions 14 will be fully considered and responded to in the project 15 record and made part of the final environmental 16 documentation for the proposed project. 17 The document will then be made available 18 19 for public review and copying at the TxDOT Dallas District Office located at 4777 East Highway 80 in 20 Mesquite, Texas 75150. 21 22 For the benefit of those who may have 23 arrived late, I would ask the members of the department, consultant team, and local government staff to stand. 24

Please stand.

They're available to answer your questions 1 and discuss your concerns regarding the project. 2 At this time, we'll take a 20-minute 3 recess and reconvene at 7:45 p.m. Thank you. 4 (Recess taken.) 5 Ladies and gentlemen, we are now MR. BUR: 6 7 reconvening tonight's public hearing. If you could please have a seat, we'll get started. 9 We have made our presentation on the latest available information on this project, and it is 10 now time for us to listen to your comments. 11 12 Again, please be aware that we are -- we will not attempt to answer your questions during this 13 comment period. Also, the guidelines of analysis shows that there's an alternative, and the alternative that is the average speed limit, and which probably would be 50 to 55 out there. And so I think that when you do the mitigation study, you need to take into consideration the proper speed limit.

The study also relies an averages due to the constant changes of the numbers and types and speed of traffic. What the average represents, the rush hour, the daily, monthly, yearly, each scenario would present different standards or different scenarios will present different results.

What needs to happen here is, in the technical reports, we need some information of what that input is. It's not defined. It's not clear what it is. It's not clear how it was obtained, and it's going into the computer model. And if you push trash in, you get trash out.

So I -- I think that it needs to be clarified as to what that is, so we can really comment on it. Because I can't comment on what I can't find.

The noise study software has numerous 1 inputs, and as I said, we need to have that in there in 2 terms of how it was determined, how it was calculated, and what the outputs are. 4 Finally, the report indicates that the 5 TxDOT will no longer be responsible for the noise 6 7 mitigation after this report is completed, the project is completed. That is going to be the responsibility of the local governments to impose controls to minimize those impacts. 10 And I think that the report should address 11 that and place more emphasis on that so that the local 12 jurisdictions understand their commitment to keeping the 13 noise at an acceptable level without mitigation. 14 MR. BUR: Thank you, Mr. Pruett. Tani 15 Pratt, please state your name and address for the record, 16 ma'am. 17 18 TANI PRATT: Tani Pratt. 5205 White 19 Spruce, McKinney, Texas. I'm coming up here because you're talking of doing the project in two years in -- in 20 2020. 21 Well, from now until then, we've had some 22 I have a -- a son who drives, and he drives 23 accidents. 24 this way. homes and made readings himself. And what we found is that the readings that I made -- I took were seven percent higher, about four, almost five decibels higher than the 65-DB standard where above that you have to provide noise abatement in our -- for the roadway.

So they were about seven percent higher.

And then when you look at study averages compared to the averages of the readings I took, the study averages were -- my readings, well, they were 20 percent higher than the study average.

They're way off. The readings I took were -- were during the morning and evening rush hour, which is pretty painful when you're in the backyard. In our backyard, we cannot enjoy it during those periods of time.

And so I am requesting that we consider -- reconsider putting noise abatement on this project. And I'm also -- would like to -- to address some of the things that were addressed earlier, which is the model is only as good as its assumptions.

And when you assume away ten miles per hour, and you change the speed from 55 to 45, that makes

the noise go down. If that was reality, then that would be great.

And I got a chance to talk to a consultant a few minutes here at the break that did the study or was involved in the study. And, basically, the study is -- their study was done during an ideal world, which doesn't exist on Custer Road.

I said, you know, try and tell me how you can enjoy our backyard when a cement truck goes down the road. He said, well, we don't -- we factor those kinds of things out of the study. And we also don't recognize the noise during the rush hour traffic.

And, I said, well, that's -- it's there.

I don't understand why you don't recognize it. So I'd really like to take a look at the model and see where they come up with some of the assumptions that were made.

Because they -- they really dumb down the noise level considerably. I have probably taken 20 readings up and down our neighborhood, and they're all in the high 60s, low 70s range, again, with 67 being the cutoff for requirements for noise abatement.

And they're significantly higher, again, the study, which averaged about 59.5 decibels. And I took the readings at the same place that the study was done. So I just -- I don't understand where these

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numbers come from.

And -- and make sure that not only those of us that choose to live in these communicates have the life that we wanted when we moved to these cities, but also that our property values will not decline rapidly based on the lack of -- of doing what is right for the citizens. Thank you.

Thank you, Mr. Denson. MR. BUR: Horowitz. Please state your name and address for the record, sir.

KEVIN HOROWITZ: Good evening. Kevin 1 I'm at 4321 Glacier Point Court. Horowitz. 2 And I'm going to echo what my neighbors 3 have just echoed. I'm actually the house on the very end 4 of our 1st Street and Custer. So my backyard is 5 6 160 feet from Custer Road, and that -- I'm sorry, the 7 back of my house is 160 feet from the back of Custer Road. 9 So the noise abatement is the issue of why we're here, as well. My wife and I, like our neighbors, 10 purchased this home. You know, it was a beautiful, very 11 unique lot, acre lot on a creek, not aware -- we were --12 we were aware that the Custer Road expansion would be 13 happening at some point in the future. 14 But we were also told by our builder and 15 by others that there would probably be some sort of noise 16 abatement that was done on Custer Road to be able to keep 17 18 the noise down. Being on the creek, as well, Wilson Creek, 19 Wilson Creek has actually got a very hard bottom. And so 20 there's a lot of echo that actually goes up through the 21 creek because of the noise coming off of the road and the 22 23 bridge in that area. And as Mr. Justice, my neighbor, has 24 pointed out to you, George Reeves has actually come. 25

I've met George from TxDOT. He's actually been in our 1 backyard on a couple occasions and taken his readings. 2 Those readings, by the way, are no way 3 going to attribute to really what is the future with the 4 road expansion as far as the amount of traffic and the 5 growth that's projected for both McKinney and the Prosper 6 7 area. 8 So we are very concerned obviously being as close as we are to Custer -- not -- Custer not as -not just from a right-of-way perspective and where the 10 road is actually going to through, which I got a better 11 understanding of that, you know, in the -- in the early 12 session here. 13 But we are more concerned about the noise 14 abatement level and something being done about that 15 for -- for not only ourselves being as close as we are 16 but for the rest of our community. Thanks. 17 18 (Applause.) Thank you, Mr. Horowitz. 19 MR. BUR: Phi1 Richardson. Phil Richardson, please state your name and 20 address for the record, sir. 21 PHIL RICHARDSON: My name is Phil 22 I live at 2548 Custer Road which is 4/10s of 23 Richardson. mile north of 380. 24 25 MR. BUR: Thank you.

PHIL RICHARDSON: The inconsistencies, lack of credibility, the incompetence, and partial intent on neglect is not unusual for this group of administering people. I lost my wife to death at the intersection of 380 and Custer Road while they were widening 380.

Now, that's 22 years ago, and now we're getting ready to plow up Custer Road. There's a section of Custer Road that's about 140 feet long in front of Ken Cook's house that has had seven accidents in six years, because of the dropoff because of the pavement is too far for cars to come back on the pavement.

So when they fight that incline and their tires get purchase on the pavement, they shoot across the road and either into the oncoming traffic or down into the drainage ditch.

And with the velocity that they travel on Custer road, become airborne and then turn over. Ken saved a young lady that did that about five years ago when her car ended up on my property line upside down and gasoline pouring everywhere.

No more than six months later, a lady by the name of Brown here in the Prosper community was driving her daughter home from school, and a plumbing truck did the same thing, jumped up on the road, crossed the road, and hit her head-on. And she was killed there.

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I can -- I can dictate seven other

BUR: Thank you, ladies. 15 MARYSSA APPLEWHITE: We're speaking on the 16 behalf of those who have had accidents at Prosper Trail 17 and Custer. We appreciate the fact that you are 18 19 addressing the installation of a light at this intersection. 20 21 But we stand in front of you today to request a temporary flashing light and removal of the one 22 right-hand turn on Prosper Trail at this time. 23 April 9th we were involved in a bad rollover accident. 24

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We are still dealing with the emotional

and physical effects of the accident. We are seven weeks 1 out of our wreck, and there have been more than three 2 major accidents at this intersection with the last one being a multi-vehicle accident. 4 5 CASSIDY LEVINGS: These numbers are only going to go up with the -- our fast growing population. 6 7 We are concerned about the amount of student traffic through the area. 9 No one should have to go through the ongoing emotional trauma that we deal with on a 10 day-to-day basis. Our lives and future are in your 11 hands. Thank you for your time. 12 (Applause.) 13 MR. BUR: Thank you, Ms. Levings and 14 Ms. Applewhite. Harrison Lewis, please state your name 15 and address for the record, sir. Thank you. 16 17 HARRISON LEWIS: My name is Harrison 18 Lewis. I live at 4340 Fisher Road in Prosper, Texas 19 7507. First, I'd like to state my absolute 20 opposition to a six-lane highway on Custer Trail. I 21 understand that there is a proposed bypass from 380, and 22 in my opinion, that would have been sufficient. And I 23 don't understand why you need two. 24

Secondly, I'd like to discuss the noise

35 condition at my home. The second floor of my home is 1 basically unusable because of the noise. And I do not 2 believe the assessment that I saw here today. I don't use several rooms -- rooms in my 4 I don't use my backyard because of the noise. It 5 is much greater than 67 deciliters -- decibels, excuse 6 7 me. Thirdly, I drive -- I live basically at 8 the intersection of 380 and Custer Road. I go to work 9 every day to save lives, but I fear for my life every 10 morning when I make a right-hand turn on Custer Road. 11 12 I think that there should be an immediate fix to that. When I moved to Prosper, I called TxDOT. 13 I called the City of McKinney and the City of Prosper, 14 and I told TxDOT. They didn't respond to me, that I 15 feared for my life. 16 Three years later, nothing has been done. 17 18 I'm terribly sad to hear young people and to hear

neighbors and talk about accidents on that road. As someone who sees people die every day, I think that its needless.

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You guys need to fix that immediately. (Applause.)

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

The Noise Study completed on the Custer Road Expansion is deeply flawed and does not protect the residents along Custer Road from the high level of noise this expansion will produced when completed.

I have attached decibel readings taken recently that are 20% higher than the consultant's readings from the original study. My readings do not include any future increases due to more traffic.

The protocol used by the consultant, TXDOT, etc., to complete the model makes some very unrealistic assumptions to keep the results artificially low. Some of those assumptions include reducing speed limits, eliminating rush hour traffic, limiting heavy equipment impact, extending the distance onto resident's property, not properly accounting for future traffic growth, etc. I am sure if I had a copy of the protocol I could find a lot more reasons for the artificially low readings.

As a result, residents living close to Custer Road are not protected from the noise produced by this new road and will suffer from the full enjoyment of their property and reduced property value.


