#### CONFLANS ROAD From Valley View Lane to State Highway (SH) 161 CSJ: 0918-45-812 Dallas County, Texas

The City of Irving, in conjunction with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) as the lead agency, proposes the extension of existing Conflans Road, on new location, from Valley View Lane to SH 161, in Dallas County, Texas. This notice advises the public that a draft environmental assessment (EA) is available for public review and that TxDOT will be conducting a public hearing on the proposed project. The hearing will be held on **Tuesday, May 15, 2018**, at the **City of Irving City Hall, City Council Chambers, 825 W. Irving Boulevard, Irving, TX 75060**. Displays will be available for viewing at 6:00 p.m. with the formal hearing starting at 7 p.m. The purpose of the hearing is to present the planned improvements and to receive public comment on the proposed project.

The existing Conflans Road is a major collector in the westernmost southwest portion of Irving, which terminates at SH 161. The proposed improvements would extend existing Conflans Road on new location roadway and bridge structure. The total distance of the project is 0.881 mile. The proposed bridge structure would cross over Bear Creek. The proposed roadway would consist of a four-lane divided facility within a variable right-of-way (ROW) width of approximately 116 feet to 310 feet. The westbound section of the roadway would consist of a 12-foot wide inside lane, a 14-foot wide outside shared use lane, and a five-foot wide sidewalk. The eastbound section of the roadway would consist of a 12-foot wide inside lane, a 14-foot wide inside lane, a 14-foot wide outside shared use lane, a five-foot wide buffer, and a 12-foot wide shared use path. A 17-foot wide raised median is proposed. The proposed bridge would consist of a four-lane divided facility within a ROW width of approximately 116 feet with an overall bridge width of approximately 96 feet. The westbound section of the bridge would consist of a 12-foot wide consist of a 12-foot wide travel lane, a 14-foot wide shared use lane, a six-foot wide sidewalk directly behind curb and a one-foot traffic rail. The eastbound section of the bridge would consist of a 12-foot wide railings on each side of the 10-foot wide shared use path. Approximately 16.34 acres of new ROW and 6.49 acres of temporary easements would be required for the proposed project. Although additional ROW and easements are required, no residential or non-residential structures would be displaced. Information concerning services and benefits available to affected property owners and information about the tentative schedule for ROW acquisition may be obtained from the district office at the address listed below.

The proposed project crosses the 100-year floodplain associated with Bear Creek and its tributary. The proposed project would permanently impact 1,085 linear feet (0.24 acre) of the intermittent tributary to Bear Creek and approximately 7.86 acres of Crosstimbers Woodland and Forest and 1.32 acres of Riparian vegetation.

The draft EA, maps showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the project are on file and available for inspection Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at TxDOT Dallas District Office, 4777 E. Highway 80, Mesquite, TX 75150 [(214) 320-6244] and online at <u>www.keepitmovingdallas.com</u> under Upcoming Public Hearing/Meeting. This information also will be available for inspection at the hearing. Verbal and written comments from the public regarding the project are requested and may be presented at the hearing or submitted in person or by mail to Ms. Rakhshanda Mahar, P.E. at 4777 E. Highway 80, Mesquite, TX 75150. **Comments must be received on or before Wednesday, May 30, 2018 to be part of the official hearing record**.

The hearing will be conducted in English. Persons interested in attending the hearing who have special communication or accommodation needs, such as the need for an interpreter, are encouraged to contact the TxDOT Dallas District Public Information Office at (214) 320-4480. Requests should be made at least two days prior to the hearing. Every reasonable effort will be made to accommodate these needs.



La ciudad de Irving, en conjunto con el Departamento de Transporte de Texas (TxDOT) como la agencia principal, propone la extensión de la carretera existente Conflans Road, en una nueva ubicación, desde Valley View Lane hasta SH 161, en el condado de Dallas, Texas. Este aviso informa al público que una preliminar evaluación ambiental (EA) está disponible para revisión pública y que TxDOT ofrece la oportunidad de una audiencia pública sobre el proyecto propuesto. La audiencia se llevará a cabo el **martes 15 de mayo de 2018 en el Ayuntamiento de la Ciudad de Irving, City Council Chambers, 825 W. Irving Boulevard, Irving, TX 75060**. Muestras estarán disponibles para su consulta a las 6 p.m. con la audiencia formal a partir de las 7 p.m. El propósito de la audiencia es presentar las mejoras previstas y para recibir comentarios del público sobre el proyecto propuesto.

La carretera existente Conflans Road es un importante colector en la porción suroeste más occidental de Irving, que termina en SH 161. Las mejoras propuestas ampliarían el existente Conflans Road en la nueva ubicación de la carretera y la estructura del puente. La distancia total del proyecto es de 0.881 millas. La estructura del puente propuesto cruzaría Bear Creek. La carretera propuesta consistiría de una instalación dividida de cuatro carriles dentro el derecho de vía (ROW) de un ancho variable de aproximadamente 116 pies a 310 pies. La sección hacia el oeste de la carretera consistiría en un carril interior de 12 pies de ancho, un carril exterior de uso compartido de 14 pies de ancho y una acera de cinco pies de ancho. La sección de la carretera hacia el este consistiría de un carril interior de 12 pies de ancho, un carril exterior de uso compartido de 14 pies de ancho, un espacio de protección de cinco pies de ancho y un camino de uso compartido de 12 pies de ancho. Se propone una mediana elevada de 17 pies de ancho. El puente propuesto consistiría de una instalación dividida de cuatro carriles dentro de un ancho de vía de aproximadamente 116 pies con un ancho de puente total de aproximadamente 96 pies. La sección hacia el oeste del puente consistiría en un carril de viaje de 12 pies de ancho, un carril de uso compartido de 14 pies de ancho, una acera de seis pies de ancho directamente detrás del bordillo y un carril de tráfico de un pie. La sección hacia el este del puente consistiría en un carril interior de 12 pies de ancho, un carril exterior de uso compartido de 14 pies de ancho y barandillas de un pie de ancho a cada lado del camino de uso compartido de 10 pies de ancho. Aproximadamente 16.34 acres de nuevo ROW y 6.49 acres de servidumbres temporales serían necesarios para el proyecto propuesto. Aunque se requiere un ROW y servidumbres adicionales, no se desplazarían estructuras residenciales o no residenciales. La información sobre los servicios y beneficios disponibles para los propietarios afectados y la información sobre el calendario provisional para la adquisición de ROW se puede obtener en la oficina del distrito en la dirección que figura a continuación.

El proyecto propuesto cruza la llanura de inundación de 100 años asociada con Bear Creek y su afluente. El proyecto propuesto impactaría permanentemente 1,085 pies lineales (0.24 acres) del afluente intermitente a Bear Creek y aproximadamente 7,86 acres de Crosstimbers Woodland and Forest y 1.32 acres de vegetación ribereña.



19	for over half, or 55 percent, of the Area of Potential
20	Effects and moderate for just under half, 40 percent, of
21	the project area; about 5 percent of the area falling in
22	low potential.
23	An intensive archeological survey augmented
24	with mechanical trenching is recommended prior to
25	construction of the proposed extension of Conflans Road

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However, because of the lack of right-of-entry, the recommended intensive archeological survey augmented with mechanical trenching was not conducted. An archeological survey would be conducted when right-of-entry has been obtained to all right-of-way parcels. It is not anticipated that the project would result in direct impacts to known archeological resources.

8 In the unlikely event that cultural 9 resources are discovered during construction of the 10 proposed project, TxDOT would immediately initiate 11 cultural resource discovery procedures. All work in the 12 vicinity of the discovery would cease until a specialist 13 from TxDOT and/or the Texas Historical Commission could 14 arrive on site and assess the discovery's significance 15 and the need, if any, for additional investigation.

16 A hazardous materials initial site 17 assessment was completed for the proposed project. The 18 initial site assessment included a visual survey of the 19 project limits and surrounding area, research of existing 20 and previous land use, and limited review of federal and 21 state regulatory databases/lists. Two sites of concern 22 were identified; an unlabeled vent pipe within the 23 proposed project's right-of-way, and a detention pond 24 adjacent to the proposed project. Through additional TxDOT Environmental Affairs Division investigation, the 25

vent pipe that was identified in the area was further 1 2 assessed as a release valve for the pipeline utility and not part of oil and gas drilling operation. The pond, 3 4 identified as part of the offsite horizontal oil and gas 5 well, is located outside the proposed project's right-of-way. Geotechnical borings performed south of 6 7 the pond area showed no indicators of possible release or 8 contamination from the pond. Both sites have been 9 determined to have a low potential to impact the project. 10 In conclusion, the studies, analyses and 11 evaluations performed thus far indicate the proposed 12 improvements would cause no significant environmental 13 impacts. 14 Approximately 16.34 acres of new 15 right-of-way and 6.49 acres of temporary easements would 16 be required for the proposed project. Although 17 additional ROW and easements are required, no residential 18 or nonresidential structures would be displaced. The 19 proposed project would not displace any households, 20 businesses or other activities or developments. No 21 public facilities such as parks, recreational facilities, 22 churches, schools, or cemeteries would be displaced as a 23 result of the construction of the proposed improvements. 24 Right-of-way acquisition for this project 25 would be purchased by the City of Irving with TxDOT

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1 providing oversight. FHWA policy provides that TxDOT be 2 responsible for monitoring the City of Irving's 3 compliance with the provisions of Title III of the 4 Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property 5 Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 as amended and Federal 6 Regulations pertaining to said act. All right-of-way 7 acquisitions would be completed in accordance with the 8 Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property 9 Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 as amended. 10 There are city representatives here at the 11 right-of-way table at the back of the room to assist you 12 with information on the process that the City of Irving 13 will follow for their right-of-way acquisition. 14 Following this hearing, documentation of 15 this public hearing will be reviewed by TxDOT for final 16 environmental clearance and design approval. If there 17 are no major issues arising from this hearing that cannot 18 be addressed in a reasonable time frame, final 19 environmental clearance is expected by August 2018. 20 As mentioned earlier, construction is 21 expected to begin in 2023 and is expected to open to 22 traffic in 2025. 23 This concludes the environmental evaluation 24 portion of the presentation. I will now return the 25 hearing back to Ms. Clemens.

We live at 901 Olde Towne, 2 3 which is right on the corner of Olde Towne and Conflans. 4 The park is used so very much and it's lovely. It's well 5 kept and people come from nearby. It will possibly need more development. I'm hoping we can save it more as a 6 7 park area and go across -- perhaps across Esters to the 8 south and make a little foot bridge for people to walk 9 Spend time at the park. over. But it's more the traffic, the hotrodders 10 and speeders that bother us more right now. 11 The extra 12 noise will be something. But, anyway, treasure for our 13 neighborhood. Want you to know that. And perhaps 14 partial wall could be put up. I was talking with Mr. 15 Abusaad about that, how we could have partial walls and 16 maintain the greenery there and people coming and still make it safe. I know more warehouses have been 17 18 suggested. We have an awful lot of them and hopefully we 19 can get buyers and encourage them to go and redevelop 20 some of the things that are on down towards Belt Line. 21 I think that's probably all the time I have. 22 I don't know if anyone has any questions beyond that. 23 Just to let you know it's been a nice place to live and 24 we hope to keep it that way and try to live with our 25 growth.

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
