The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is proposing to reconstruct and widen FM 407 from Bill Cook Road to FM 1830 in Denton County, Texas. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting an in-person meeting and an online virtual public meeting on the study. **The same information will be available at both the in-person and virtual meetings.**

The in-person meeting will begin at 6 p.m. and will be an open house format where the public may come and go at their convenience. Staff will be available to answer questions and take comments. The virtual meeting can be viewed Monday, March 27, 2023, starting at 6 p.m. through Tuesday, April 11, 2023, at 11:59 p.m. Materials will be posted to the study website at [www.keepitmovingdallas.com/FM407DentonCounty](http://www.keepitmovingdallas.com/FM407DentonCounty) and will consist of a pre-recorded video presentation that includes both audio and video components, along with other exhibits. The virtual public meeting is not a live event and the materials can be viewed at your convenience. If you do not have internet access, you may call (214) 320-4431 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, to ask questions and access study materials. **Please note the materials will not be available until March 27, 2023, at 6 p.m.**

The project proposes to widen the existing 2-lane rural, undivided roadway to a 6-lane, urban divided facility for approximately 11.5 miles along FM 407 in Denton County, TX. The project would include pedestrian and bike accommodations. The existing right-of-way (ROW) varies from 80-feet to 90-feet. The proposed ROW varies along the corridor and is generally 140 feet wide.

The proposed project would, subject to final design considerations, require additional ROW and potentially displace six residences. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information about the TxDOT Relocation Assistance Program and services and benefits for those displaced and other affected property owners, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling (214) 320-6675 or by visiting the project website.

The proposed project would involve construction in wetlands and an action in a floodplain.

Any environmental documentation or studies, maps and drawings showing the study location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the study are on file and available for inspection Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. at the TxDOT Dallas District Office, 4777 East US Highway 80, Mesquite, TX 75150. Project materials are also available online at the project website.

The virtual public meeting and in-person option will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating effectively in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. If you need interpretation or translation services or you are a person with a disability who requires an accommodation to attend and participate in the virtual public meeting or in-person option, please contact the TxDOT Public Information Office at (214) 320-4480 no later than 4 p.m. Wednesday, March 22, 2023. Please be aware that advance notice is required as some services and accommodations may require time for TxDOT to arrange.
