

Municipalities

Crossed: Ennis, Grand Prairie, Mansfield, Midlothian, and Waxahachie



Feasibility Study Purpose

- Evaluate the potential installation of continuous One-Way Frontage Roads along US 287 to improve travel within the corridor:
 - Safety;
 - Access; and
 - Mobility.
- Frontage Road access will adhere to TxDOT <u>Access</u>

 <u>Management Manual</u> guidelines.

Identify, evaluate and compare various US 287 Frontage Road Build Alternatives





Present the No Build and Build Alternative Concepts at a Series of US 287 Public Meetings



Review Public Meeting comments and continue coordination with Municipalities. Develop a Recommended Alternative.

Development of the Alternatives

- Compare the No Build vs. Build Alternatives
- ▶ Evaluate the forecasted Design Year (2045) Traffic Volumes (Travel Demand) within the corridor
- Evaluate Traffic Safety aspects
- Minimize the Near-term and Long-term impacts associated with the Build Alternatives
- Coordinate with local agencies

Evaluate the Alternatives



Alternative Descriptions



Do Nothing

US 287 frontage roads are not installed.



Build Alternative 1

Rural frontage roads with wide medians and shoulders with roadside ditches that accommodate future widening. The US 67 interchange is fully reconstructed.




Build Alternative 2

Mixture of rural and urban frontage roads within minimal right-of-way (ROW) footprint. Future widening would require additional ROW and partial reconstruction of the frontage roads. The US 67 interchange is partially reconstructed.
