1 MR. BARTH: Good evening, ladies and
2 gentlemen. If you'll please be seated, we'll start our
3 public hearing. My name is Brian Barth. I'm the Director
4 of Transportation Planning and Development for the Dallas
5 District of the Texas Department of Transportation. I'm
6 here representing our Dallas District Engineer, Mr. Bill
7 Hale.

8 We appreciate your interest in the proposed
9 State Highway 121 toll facility and welcome each of you
10 here this evening. Later this evening, you'll be invited
11 to directly participate in the opportunity for public
12 comment portion of this hearing. We want to express
13 appreciation to the Legacy Church for the use of this
14 facility this evening.

15 The study area limits for the planned and
16 proposed improvements of State Highway 121 are from the
17 Dallas North Tollway to U.S. 75 with a total length of
18 approximately 12.5 miles within Collin County. A
19 conceptual toll plan has been developed showing proposed
20 toll gantry locations and revised highway signage
21 designating State Highway 121 as a toll facility.

22 Before proceeding further, I'd like to
23 introduce members of the federal, state, or local elected
24 officials who are in attendance tonight or were able to
25 stop by during the Open House. Let's see. First we have

1 from the City of Frisco, Mayor Mike Simpson. Thank you.

2 From Collin County, Commissioner Jack
3 Hatchell. Thanks, Jack. From Congressman Burgess's
4 office, David Laney. From Coppell, Councilwoman Jayne
5 Peters. Thank you. And from the Democratic Party of
6 Collin County, the county -- the county chair, Deborah
7 Angell Smith. Thank you for being here.

8 Are there any other elected officials who
9 would like to be recognized? Seeing none, now I'd like to
10 introduce several members of the Texas Department of
11 Transportation, the consulting team, the Cities of Plano,
12 Frisco, McKinney, and Collin County officials who are
13 present tonight to assist you and answer questions.

14 Let's see. From Collin County, Director of
15 Engineering, Ruben Delgado. Thanks for being here, Ruben.
16 From the City of Frisco, City Manager, George Purefoy.
17 Thank you for being here. The Director of Engineering for
18 Frisco, Cissy Sylo. Also from the City of Frisco, Liz
19 Manning.

20 From the Planning and Zoning -- the Planning
21 and Zoning Commissioner from Frisco, Chris Moss. Thank
22 you. From the City of Plano, Alan Upchurch. Thank you,
23 Alan. From the North Texas Tollway Authority, Director of
24 Engineering, Mark Bouma. From the North Central Texas
25 Council of Governments, the Principal Transportation

1 Planner, Jeff Neal.

2 Let's see. Now our TxDOT folks that are here
3 tonight, first Mr. Bob Brown, our Deputy District Engineer.
4 Bob. From our Advanced Project Development Office,
5 Mr. Stan Hall, our Advanced Project Development Engineer.
6 Also from his office, Mr. Robert Hall and Mr. Dan Purge,
7 who's not here, but will be shortly.

8 From our District Right-of-Way Office,
9 Mr. Travis Henderson and Mr. Cecil Sodano. From our Public
10 Information Office, Angela Austin in the back there. From
11 our Collin County area office, your area engineer, Mr. Ron
12 Johnston. Also from his office, Justin Carlang.

13 Let's see. Also from our Advanced Project
14 Development Office, John Debner. From our District Tollway
15 Office, Mr. John Husbuth. From our division in Austin, our
16 Environmental Affairs Division, Elvia Gonzalez and Margaret
17 Cantu. Thanks for being here.

18 From the Federal Highway Administration,
19 Anita Wilson. Our specific team members, again, John
20 Debner. I introduced him earlier. From our District
21 Tollway Office, Bill Compton, at the door. And from HNTB
22 Corporation, Jennifer Halstead.

23 These individuals will be available during
24 the recess to answer your particular questions regarding
25 the proposed State Highway 121 toll facility.

1 We thank those of you who had an opportunity
2 to attend the Open House earlier this evening. As you
3 arrived, you were given the opportunity to register your
4 attendance for this hearing.

5 Our registration forms are the eight and
6 a-half by eleven inch sheets at the front sign-in table and
7 provide you the opportunity to express your interest in
8 this project and indicate whether you would like too make a
9 verbal statement during tonight's opportunity for public
10 comments portion of the hearing. In the event you did not
11 register and would like to, please do so during our
12 upcoming recess.

13 Many of you may have attended previous public
14 hearings conducted by the Texas Department of
15 Transportation. However, for the benefit of those of you
16 who have never attended one, I would like to explain how
17 the Department conducts a public hearing.

18 Following my initial comments, I will provide
19 information on funding policies for the proposed project,
20 and Miss Jennifer Halstead of HNTB Corporation will give a
21 detailed presentation concerning the location, design
22 features of the project, and the environmental affects of
23 the proposed tolling of State Highway 121.

24 Following Miss Halstead, Mr. Travis Henderson
25 of our District Right-of-Way Office will explain the

1 right-of-way acquisition procedures and the relocation
2 assistance program for displaced persons and businesses.

3 At that time, we will recess the hearing for
4 twenty minutes and allow you the opportunity to view the
5 conceptual toll plan currently on display here tonight.
6 During the recess, you're encouraged to ask any questions,
7 which the Department representatives will address and
8 answer.

9 Following the recess, we'll reconvene the
10 hearing and ask those persons who indicated on the
11 registration form that they would like to make a statement
12 to come forward to our floor microphone, state your name
13 and address for the record, and provide any comments
14 concerning the project. Following the registered speakers,
15 anyone else who did not register will also be given an
16 opportunity for comment.

17 You might be asking, "What is the purpose of
18 a public hearing?" The four essential purposes of a public
19 hearing are, one, to inform the public of the status of
20 planning on the project and present the recommendations
21 based on studies performed to date; two, to describe the
22 recommended location and design so that those attending can
23 determine the project's potential to affect their lives and
24 property; three, to provide the public an opportunity to
25 present information and their views at a stage in the

1 planning process when flexibility to respond to comments
2 still exists and before location and design decisions are
3 finalized; and, finally, to develop a record of public
4 views and participation to accompany recommendations for
5 subsequent decisions.

6 This hearing is being held in compliance with
7 both federal and state laws. The state is required to
8 certify to the Secretary of Transportation that a public
9 hearing was held concerning the proposed State Highway 121
10 toll facility.

11 For the official record, a transcript of this
12 hearing will be made. For this reason, we ask that all
13 comments be made from the floor microphone. Following the
14 hearing, the Department will proceed with the preparation
15 of the final environmental documentation.

16 All verbal and written statements and
17 comments will be addressed in this documentation and will
18 be given full consideration in the preparation of the final
19 recommendation and in the development of the proposed
20 design and tolling of State Highway 121.

21 This public hearing is being convened to
22 discuss the conceptual toll plan features and environmental
23 effects of the proposed State Highway 121 toll facility
24 from the Dallas North Tollway to U.S. 75. The total
25 project length is approximately 12.5 miles.

1 A conceptual toll plan has been developed
2 depicting toll gantry locations and revised highway
3 signage. No additional right-of-way would be required for
4 the project. No residents or businesses would be displaced
5 as a result of the proposed project.

6 An Environmental Re-Evaluation has also been
7 prepared which analyzed the social, economic, and
8 environmental effects of the project. State Highway 121
9 was originally proposed to be constructed in phases due to
10 financial constraints.

11 The construction of mainlanes along State
12 Highway 121 was funded to Hillcrest Road. The tolling of
13 State Highway 121 would allow for the construction schedule
14 to be accelerated for certain key facilities related to
15 State Highway 121, such as the mainlanes from Hillcrest to
16 U.S. 75 and the reconstruction of the U.S. 75 and Dallas
17 North Tollway interchanges.

18 The conceptual toll plan and Re-Evaluation
19 for the proposed State Highway 121 toll facility are
20 available for inspection and reproduction at the Texas
21 Department of Transportation Dallas District Office located
22 at 4777 East Highway 80 in Mesquite, Texas, 75150; at the
23 TxDOT Collin County Area Office located at 2250 South State
24 Highway 5, McKinney, Texas, 75069; at the City of Plano
25 Transportation Engineering Department located at 1520

1 Avenue K, Plano, Texas, 75074; at the City of Frisco
2 Engineering Services Department located at 6101 Frisco
3 Square Boulevard, 3rd Floor, Frisco, Texas, 75034; at the
4 City of McKinney Public Works Department, 222 North
5 Tennessee Street, McKinney, Texas, 75069; at the City of
6 Allen Engineering Department located at 305 Century
7 Parkway, Allen, Texas, 75013; at the Town of Fairview Town
8 Engineer's Office located at 500 South Highway 5, Fairview,
9 Texas, 75069. In addition, the conceptual toll plan and
10 Environmental Re-Evaluation may be viewed on the Internet
11 at www.keepitmovingdallas.com.

12 Highway planning and construction requires
13 close cooperation among all levels of government. The
14 Department has worked closely with local governments and
15 has previously received input regarding the proposed
16 tolling facility.

17 A public meeting for this project was held in
18 the City of Plano in July of 2006. Many of the requests
19 presented by local government officials have been addressed
20 and are reflected in the conceptual toll plan displayed
21 tonight.

22 In summary, the proposed tolling of State
23 Highway 121 is being developed cooperatively by the Cities
24 of Plano, Frisco, Allen, McKinney, the Town of Fairview,
25 and Collin County, the state, the Metropolitan Planning

1 Organization, and the Federal Highway Administration.

2 Texas legislation has recently been amended
3 to introduce new transportation funding tools. House
4 Bill 3588, enacted in the 78th legislative session, and
5 House Bill 2702, enacted in the 79th legislative session,
6 provide additional funding and project delivery tools.

7 These House Bills emphasize the use of
8 tolling to fund transportation improvements in lieu of an
9 increase in gas taxes. Provisions protect the regions that
10 choose the tolling option by guaranteeing that a region's
11 funding allocations under conventional methods would not be
12 shifted to other regions of the state.

13 The Texas Transportation Commission approved
14 a policy instructing the Department to evaluate all
15 controlled-access highways as possible candidates for
16 tolling. This includes all projects, including those under
17 construction and those in the planning stage involving new
18 lane construction.

19 The North Texas Tollway Authority, also known
20 as NTTA, and the Texas Department of Transportation, also
21 known as TxDOT, have an agreement for the protocol and
22 implementation of future regional toll facilities.

23 The agreement will result in seamless
24 planning, funding, construction, and operation of toll and
25 managed lanes in this region. This agreement is the result

1 of a regional partnership requested by the Regional
2 Transportation Council of the North Central Texas Council
3 of Governments.

4 TxDOT acknowledges the convenience for North
5 Texas toll road users to have consistent and seamless toll
6 collection and customer services on all tolled projects on
7 the North Central Texas Council of Governments plan. For
8 that reason, the NTTA and TxDOT have entered into an
9 interoperability agreement to ensure TxDOT -- to ensure
10 NTTA TollTags will always be accepted on any TxDOT toll
11 road.

12 Further, an agreement has been established
13 which allows NTTA to provide the toll collections and
14 customer service for the first five years of operations on
15 TxDOT toll roads. A goal of both parties is that this
16 relationship works well and is effective enough to foster
17 continued utilization of NTTA's customer service abilities
18 in the future on TxDOT toll roads.

19 Should new agreements not be reached for the
20 first -- after the first five years, TxDOT's contractors
21 will be free to seek alternative collection service whether
22 through TxDOT or third parties, but will always be required
23 to accept NTTA TollTags on the roadways as a form of
24 payment.

25 Under the Regional Transportation Council's

1 near neighbor/near timeframe policy, when a previously
2 planned tax supported highway is designated to become a
3 toll facility, those gas tax funds that would have
4 supported the highway are to be reallocated. By partnering
5 together, state and local officials can leverage additional
6 state transportation funds, free and existing allocations
7 for critical, but otherwise unbudgeted safety, capacity,
8 and air quality projects.

9 This shift allows new projects to be built or
10 opened as toll facilities with accelerated construction
11 schedules. This revenue would then be used to build
12 additional transportation facilities with accelerated
13 construction schedules.

14 In addition to State Highway 121, a separate
15 project, State Highway 161, is also proposed to be
16 constructed as a toll facility with funding allocated for
17 associated near neighbor/near timeframe projects. The most
18 important function that this new funding policy provides is
19 the ability to use toll revenue as a source to fund highway
20 projects, and as a result, accelerate future transportation
21 projects.

22 The Texas Transportation Commission may
23 announce later this week a tentative proposed best value
24 proposal. However, it would not be final until it is
25 determined from the result of this Re-evaluation whether we

1 would proceed with this project as a toll facility.

2 If determined as such and environmental and
3 public involvement process, also known as the NEPA process,
4 is approved by the Federal Highway Administration, TxDOT
5 would request the Federal Highway Administration's
6 concurrence to award a developer to this project.

7 At this time, Miss Halstead will discuss the
8 conceptual toll plan features, cost estimates, and the
9 environmental effects of the proposed project.

10 MS. HALSTEAD: Thank you, Mr. Barth. The
11 presentation tonight will cover the proposed implementation
12 of tolling to State Highway 121 from the Dallas North
13 Tollway to U.S. 75. The purpose of the proposed toll
14 facility is to improve system linkage and mobility in the
15 area.

16 The tolling of State Highway 121 would allow
17 for the construction schedule to be accelerated for certain
18 key facilities related to State Highway 121, such as the
19 mainlanes from Hillcrest to 75 in Collin County and the
20 reconstruction of the U.S. 75 and DNT interchanges.

21 Implementation of tolling would allow for
22 mainlane construction to be implemented earlier than
23 previously had been programmed. In addition, tolling would
24 generate revenue for the operation and maintenance of State
25 Highway 121 as well as funding additional projects in

1 comparable timeframes.

2 The proposed improvements are needed to
3 handle the present and future traffic demands for this area
4 and would substantially benefit communities in the project
5 area by providing ease of mobility to vital destinations.
6 State Highway 121 is proposed as an electronic only toll
7 collection system.

8 Although cash would not be accepted at the
9 toll gantries, a video tolling system is proposed to record
10 a photograph of the vehicle's license plate for those users
11 that do not have an active toll account. Based on this
12 video monitoring, an invoice would be mailed monthly to the
13 registered owner of the vehicle for the tolls that were
14 incurred.

15 A premium would then be applied to the
16 invoice for this video billing service. Users of toll
17 facilities are encouraged to open an account to benefit
18 from not having to pay this premium. Through the video
19 billing process or prepaid accounts, drivers could pay
20 their toll -- their toll bill with cash.

21 The State Highway 121 frontage roads are
22 continuous and would remain as a non-toll alternative to
23 the proposed toll facility. Tolling State Highway 121
24 would allow for the mainlanes to open much earlier than
25 they were previously programmed.

1 The mainlanes between DNT, Dallas North
2 Tollway, and Hillcrest Road would be open to traffic by
3 2009, and the mainlanes between Hillcrest Road to U.S. 75
4 would be open to traffic by 2011.

5 A conceptual toll plan has been developed and
6 is displayed at the back of either side of the room
7 tonight. The conceptual toll plan depicts proposed toll
8 gantry locations and revised highway signage denoting State
9 Highway 161 (sic) as a toll facility.

10 Frontage roads are currently open, and it is
11 not anticipated that the proposed tolling of State
12 Highway 121 would substantially change any existing or
13 future land usage in the project area.

14 The proposed improvements include
15 implementing state-of-the-art electronic toll gantries in
16 the current construction of State Highway 121. The
17 proposed improvements also include modifying roadway
18 signage and adding electronic toll collection equipment and
19 gantry lighting.

20 The gantry would support electronic toll
21 collection reader units, video billing system cameras,
22 illumination devices, automatic vehicle identification
23 antennae, communication gear, and other necessary
24 equipment. The proposed electronic tolling gantries would
25 not warrant changes to the footprint of the proposed State

1 Highway 121 pavement design which consists of six mainlanes
2 and three-lane frontage roads in each direction.

3 Frontage roads would provide a non-toll
4 alternative throughout the State Highway 121 corridor.

5 Non-toll alternatives such as these frontage roads, Legacy
6 Drive, Lebanon Drive, Hedgecoxe Road, and Main
7 Street/FM 720/McKinney Ranch Parkway would remain available
8 to users who choose not to pay a toll along State
9 Highway 121.

10 State Highway 121 would be signed with the
11 TxTag logo. The TxTag would have statewide compatibility
12 with other toll transponders across the state such as
13 NTTA's TollTag and Harris and Fort Bend County Toll
14 Authorities' EZ Tag.

15 In the back of the room, the video monitor is
16 displaying a 3-D simulation what the facility would look
17 like when construction is complete. State Highway 121, as
18 proposed tonight, would become an electronic toll
19 collection facility.

20 This means no toll booths and no coin change
21 machines, simply an electronic toll collection system. The
22 toll rates proposed for State Highway 121 would be
23 consistent with other rates in the region which is
24 anticipated to be set by the Regional Transportation
25 Council of the North Central Texas Council of Governments.

1 The existing right-of-way width for State
2 Highway 121 ranges from approximately 445 feet to 620 feet.
3 The proposed project is not expected to require the
4 addition of additional right-of-way -- excuse me -- the
5 acquisition of additional right-of-way.

6 Utilities such as water lines, sewer lines,
7 gas lines, and other underground and overhead utilities may
8 require adjustment. The adjustment and relocation of any
9 utilities will be handled so that there will be no
10 substantial interruptions to take place while the
11 adjustments are being made.

12 The current total estimated cost of the
13 proposed project is approximately \$205 million. This
14 amount includes approximately \$20 million to implement the
15 electronic toll components. Approximately \$150 million of
16 previously approved construction is already under way along
17 State Highway 121.

18 Now I will give you an overview of the
19 environmental evaluation of the project. Ladies and
20 gentlemen, an Environmental Re-Evaluation has been prepared
21 for the proposed project. It involved describing the
22 purpose and need for the project, the project's history,
23 changes to the originally proposed project, issues studied
24 in further detail, and issues eliminated from further
25 study.

1 These issues studied in further detail
2 include: traffic noise, air quality, socioeconomic
3 impacts, lighting and visual impacts, land use, and
4 indirect and cumulative impacts.

5 Issues eliminated from further study
6 included: cultural resources, farmlands, floodplains,
7 hazardous materials, jurisdictional waters of the United
8 States, including wetlands, navigable waters of the United
9 States, public facilities and services, relocations and
10 displacements, Section 4(f) properties, threatened and
11 endangered species, vegetation, water quality, items of a
12 special nature, and evaluation of regulatory changes.

13 These issues were eliminated because no
14 additional right-of-way is required, nor are there any
15 design changes proposed. The previously improved
16 environmental -- approved environmental evaluations of
17 those issues remain unchanged.

18 This document was deemed acceptable for
19 further processing by the Federal Highway Administration to
20 proceed with this public hearing tonight and has been
21 coordinated with other public agencies. The Re-Evaluation
22 for this project is available and here tonight for your
23 review and is on display with the exhibits and the
24 conceptual toll plan at the back of the room.

25 After the close of the comment period, TxDOT

1 will process all comments received and submit these and the
2 Environmental Re-Evaluation to the Federal Highway
3 Administration for approval, to then proceed with final
4 project development and construction.

5 In conclusion, the studies and evaluations
6 performed thus far indicate that the proposed improvements
7 would cause no significant environmental effects. I will
8 now turn the hearing back over to Mr. Barth.

9 MR. BARTH: Thanks, Jennifer. Following this
10 hearing, documentation of this public hearing will be
11 forwarded to our Austin Office and the Federal Highway
12 Administration for their review and consideration. This
13 documentation will include responses to comments and the
14 Re-evaluation.

15 Final decision from Federal Highway
16 Administration for the project's Environmental
17 Re-Evaluation will not occur until all comments received
18 during the public hearing tonight and during the ten-day
19 comment period following this public hearing are addressed
20 and considered.

21 The proposed project as a toll facility is
22 consistent with drafts of the financially constrained
23 long-range plan known as Mobility 2030, the Metropolitan
24 Transportation Plan, and the 2008-2011 Dallas-Fort Worth
25 Metropolitan Planning Area Transportation Improvement

1 Program, also known as the TIP.

2 A U.S. Department of Transportation TIP and
3 long-range conformity determination are expected this
4 spring or summer of 2007. If Mobility 2030 and the
5 2008-2011 TIP are approved as currently proposed, TxDOT
6 will then be in a position to proceed with detailed
7 construction plans for the tollway facilities.

8 Once the conceptual toll plan has been
9 approved and any necessary utility adjustments have been
10 made, we would then expect to be ready for construction of
11 the proposed State Highway 121.

12 As mentioned previously, the total cost of
13 this project on State Highway 121 is estimated to cost \$205
14 million. For the proposed State Highway 121 tolling
15 improvements, TxDOT would fund the project through the sale
16 of bonds or through a public/private partnership.

17 At this time, Mr. Travis Henderson from our
18 District Right-of-Way Office will provide you an overview
19 of our right-of-way acquisition procedures.

20 MR. HENDERSON: Thank you, Mr. Barth. At
21 this time, I would like to take a few moments of your time
22 to present some information about the right-of-way
23 acquisition phase of this project.

24 Although this project does not require
25 additional right-of-way, TxDOT would like to explain our

1 right-of-way acquisition process during this hearing so
2 that if something unexpected occurs later in the design or
3 construction of this facility and additional right-of-way
4 and/or easements are required, you will be adequately
5 informed of your rights and of our right-of-way acquisition
6 procedures.

7 Again, this project, as previously described,
8 would require no additional land at this time to
9 accommodate improvements to State Highway 121 from the
10 Dallas North Tollway to U.S. 75. No commercial, retail, or
11 residential properties would be displaced. No places of
12 worship or cemeteries would be displaced. However,
13 existing utilities may be relocated.

14 The following will help describe our
15 right-of-way procedures. Two booklets are available to you
16 at the right-of-way table in the back of this room. One is
17 titled "The Purchase of Right-of-Way," and the other is
18 titled "Relocation Assistance."

19 If there's a possibility that some of your
20 property may be acquired and you did not pick up one of
21 these booklets, you may secure copies at the right-of-way
22 table during the break. These booklets contain a
23 significant amount of information; and rather than trying
24 to cover all of this material in detail this evening, I
25 would like to acquaint you with answers to the most

1 commonly asked questions.

2 Before the right-of-way process may begin,
3 TxDOT has to obtain environmental clearance, local agency
4 agreements, and approved right-of-way map and funding.

5 With the route approved, maps will be prepared by
6 registered professional land surveyors to show the exact
7 amount of land to be acquired from each affected property
8 owner.

9 All of the land is to be used for roadway
10 purposes and will be acquired in the name of the State of
11 Texas. Standard procedure for many projects is that the
12 local governments will be responsible for land acquisition
13 and utility relocations. However, if requested, it may be
14 done by the State of Texas.

15 Cost associated with the purchase of real
16 property will be the responsibility of the Department of
17 Transportation. In some cases, the adjacent cities may be
18 responsible for increased costs due to more stringent
19 zoning ordinances or building codes than the state law.

20 All acquisitions must be conducted in
21 accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real
22 Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended.
23 After the release is obtained from the Austin Right-of-Way
24 Division, TxDOT will order property title information,
25 five-year sales data, and preliminary title commitments.

1 The acquiring agency, whether TxDOT or a
2 local government, in order to establish land values, may
3 employ independent real estate appraisers to determine
4 their opinions of the fair market value for the part of
5 each owner's property to be acquired. This procedure is
6 explained on Pages 3 and 4 of "The Purchase of
7 Right-of-Way" booklet.

8 The appraisers will contact each owner before
9 proceeding with appraising the properties. Each of you as
10 owners will be given the opportunity to accompany the real
11 estate appraiser on an inspection of your property. Once
12 the property is appraised and submitted to TxDOT for review
13 and approval, a written offer will be made to you, the
14 property owner.

15 TxDOT's acquisition agent presents the offer
16 to the property owner. This offer will be based on the
17 amount of the approved appraised value with any compensable
18 damages to the remaining property. TxDOT will also provide
19 relocation assistance to those who are eligible.

20 The decision of whether the offer is
21 acceptable or not, of course, remains with each owner. An
22 owner may wish to donate land for the project for various
23 reasons. In these cases, the appraisal process will not be
24 necessary provided that the property owner signs a waiver
25 to waive their right to receive fair market value and an

1 appraisal of the property. This does not include donations
2 at less than fair market value or partial donations, which
3 must be appraised.

4 If the property owner chooses to receive
5 compensation for the needed right-of-way, then the
6 following are the options available to the property owner.
7 The owner may accept the offer or submit a counteroffer, if
8 appropriate.

9 Also as another option, the booklet further
10 describes the procedure by which right-of-way is acquired
11 when the property owner does not agree with the acquiring
12 agency's determination of fair market value. This
13 procedure is known as eminent domain and is described on
14 Page 9.

15 When the owner accepts the approved value, a
16 deed and a memorandum of agreement are prepared for the
17 owner's signature. TxDOT will issue a warrant, which is a
18 check, made out to the title company for the owner. The
19 owner would then close at the title company and then be
20 compensated for the newly acquired right-of-way.

21 The owner may submit a counteroffer if the
22 owner believes the offer does not represent fair market
23 value. TxDOT reviews the counteroffer and either accepts
24 or rejects it. If rejected, the owner may still accept the
25 original offer or proceed to eminent domain.

1 In eminent domain, the court appoints three
2 independent commissioners who themselves are landowners in
3 the county to hear the owner and TxDOT's testimony. Based
4 on the evidence presented, the commissioners will decide
5 the award to the owner.

6 TxDOT will deposit the award, which the owner
7 may withdraw, in the registry of the court. And at that
8 point, TxDOT would take possession of the needed
9 right-of-way. If desired, either the owner or TxDOT shall
10 have the right to appeal the award to a jury trial.

11 The state's relocation program for personal
12 property, administered solely by the state with no local
13 government funding required, is also available to those who
14 may qualify for certain benefits as a result of acquisition
15 of properties.

16 Monetary payment for incidental expenses
17 which are the owner's out-of-pocket expenses to convey good
18 title to the state may be eligible for reimbursement and
19 are applicable whether or not a displacement occurs.

20 These benefits are applicable to all
21 individuals, families, businesses, farmers, ranchers, and
22 nonprofit organizations without regard to race, color,
23 religion, sex, or national origin. This information is
24 contained in the "Relocation Assistance" booklet.

25 If you believe a move is to be necessitated

1 by this project, the Department would caution you not to
2 move before negotiations have begun unless you first secure
3 a written notice of intent to acquire from the acquiring
4 agency. This must be done so as to avoid the possibility
5 of your loss of personal property relocation benefits to
6 which you may otherwise be eligible for reimbursement by
7 the state.

8 Should a displacee be dissatisfied with any
9 of the amounts offered for relocation reimbursement, appeal
10 procedures are available. These are discussed on the last
11 page of the "Relocation Assistance" booklet, Page 39.
12 Additional information is available from the TxDOT Dallas
13 District Office should you -- should you have need for
14 relocation assistance.

15 Lastly, regulations governing the relocation
16 of advertising signs which are not purchased by the
17 acquiring agency as real property are discussed on
18 Pages 31 and 32 of the "Relocation Assistance" booklet.

19 This concludes my presentation. Thank you
20 for your attention.

21 MR. BARTH: Thanks, Travis. I would like to
22 mention that we will not attempt to answer your questions
23 while you have the floor during the opportunity for public
24 comment. This procedure is necessary so that everyone is
25 given an opportunity to speak and because your comments

1 will be given due consideration.

2 We would be happy to answer your questions
3 during the recess or even after the hearing. All verbal
4 and written comments and questions presented tonight as
5 well as those received during the ten-day comment period
6 following the hearing will be addressed in and made part of
7 the final environmental document for this project.

8 This document will then be made available for
9 public review and copying at the Dallas District Office,
10 again located at 4777 East Highway 80, Mesquite, Texas,
11 75150, or at the locations listed in the PowerPoint
12 handout.

13 For the benefit of you that may have arrived
14 late, I would ask the members of the Department, consultant
15 team, and local government staff to stand. They are
16 available to answer your questions and discuss your
17 concerns regarding the project.

18 At this time, we'll take a 20-minute recess
19 and reconvene at 8:00. Thank you.

20 (Recess from 7:40 to 8:00)

21 MR. BARTH: Ladies and gentlemen, if you'll
22 please be seated, we'll reconvene our hearing. We have
23 made our presentation on the latest available information
24 on the project. It is now time for us to listen to your
25 comments. Again, please be aware we will not attempt to

1 answer your questions during this comment period.

2 Some of you may not wish to make a statement
3 from the microphone. In that event, your written
4 statements will be equally accepted both tonight and for
5 the next ten calendar days following this hearing. For
6 those of you who wish to submit a written comment tonight,
7 a comment box is located at the registration table.

8 Questions and comments may also be mailed to
9 HNTB Corporation, attention Jennifer Halstead, 5910 West
10 Plano Parkway, Suite 200, Plano, Texas, 75093. All of your
11 statements, comments, and questions will be given careful
12 consideration before final design features are determined.

13 Furthermore, all information developed in
14 regard to the proposed conceptual toll plan and
15 Environmental Re-Evaluation is available for public
16 inspection and copying, and the conceptual toll plan is
17 also posted at www.keepitmovingdallas.com.

18 The final deadline for our acceptance of
19 statements or comments is by a postmarked date of
20 March 8th, 2007. We have a listing of seven people
21 registered who would like to make statements.

22 Please limit your speaking time to three
23 minutes so that everyone who wishes to speak may have an
24 opportunity to do so. For the official transcript, please
25 state your name and address as you take the floor before

1 proceeding with your statements.

2 Let's see. First we have Mayor Mike Simpson.

3 MAYOR SIMPSON: Questions answered.

4 MR. BARTH: Thank you. Let's see. Jeff
5 Neal.

6 MR. NEAL: Good evening. My name is Jeff
7 Neal. I'm here tonight representing Michael Morris,
8 Director of Transportation for the North Central Texas
9 Council of Governments as well as the Regional
10 Transportation Council, which is the designated
11 Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Dallas-Fort
12 Worth metropolitan area.

13 The RTC supports the conceptual toll plan for
14 State Highway 121 in Collin County; and like its companion
15 project in Denton County, this project is -- it reflects a
16 very fine example of the great partnerships that have been
17 built between local, regional, state, and federal entities
18 to bring this project forward.

19 The RTC also supports the comprehensive
20 development agreement process under way for this corridor,
21 as it expects that it will be based on the business terms
22 for -- the business terms for the tolling of TxDOT
23 supported facilities as well as excess toll revenue
24 policies that were approved by the Regional Transportation
25 Council in September of 2006.

1 The RTC has approved and incorporated State
2 Highway 121 as a toll facility into its soon to be -- we
3 anticipate soon to be approved our Mobility 2030
4 Metropolitan Transportation Plan, which we expect approval
5 by the Federal Highway Administration coming up in the
6 spring of this year.

7 The RTC believes that the building of State
8 Highway 121 as a toll road in Collin County will support
9 the expedited construction of other critical transportation
10 facilities in this part of the region; and we expect that
11 thanks to the strong partnerships that were nurtured in
12 this area and continued support of legislation through the
13 Texas Congress, this project will help unlock significant
14 transportation and quality of life benefits for a large
15 portion of this region in a far shorter amount of time than
16 we would have anticipated just a few years ago. Thank you.

17 MR. BARTH: Thank you. Douglas Weiss?

18 MR. WEISS: Good evening. My name is Douglas
19 Weiss, 1089 London Drive, Frisco. I am a concerned citizen
20 here in opposition to the tolling plans for 121. I am a
21 native Texan, born and raised here in Collin County, and I
22 can remember driving on 121 well before there were
23 reputable businesses even taking up shop there.

24 I am baffled by how the Texas legislature has
25 passed these bills that allow this paid for road, this road

1 that is already fully funded, to be sold and retaxed to
2 those of us solely within Collin County to pay for this
3 road a second time. Now, obviously the sections from
4 Hillcrest to Custer and from Custer to 121 aren't funded.

5 I know the local -- the local governments
6 have offered additional plans to fund those themselves
7 rather than go through this tolling debacle, but those
8 attempts have been foiled by apparently greed and contempt
9 for the great State of Texas by those pursuing these.

10 Yes, it is -- it is double taxation, and
11 tonight I've come to question the constitutionality of even
12 the bills as they are.

13 It's been said here, and I've been reassured
14 a couple of times, that the money, the revenue from the
15 tolling will be spent within Collin County, yet legally
16 according to the house bills, this money only has to stay
17 within the TxDOT region which spans quite a few counties
18 around this area and is far-reaching, putting the money of
19 these hardworking Collin County people who drive on this
20 road daily in a -- in places that clearly do not benefit
21 them, having paid gas taxes and property taxes all these
22 years up to this point.

23 The presentation tonight didn't even address
24 many of the problems with tolling, selling this to a
25 foreign company with very little local control, and even

1 the -- even the concept of video tolling doesn't address
2 out-of-state cars or unregistered vehicles, which as you
3 can see with as many transplants as we have here, we have
4 many new vehicles and out-of-state people driving on our
5 roads daily.

6 It seems that the people of Texas are being
7 steam -- steamrolled. In one of the charts as well as back
8 here on the easels, you can see that the State of Texas, in
9 the past twenty-five years, has reallocated \$18 billion of
10 highway funding and is estimated in the next twenty-five
11 years to reallocate another \$21 billion of highway funding.

12 That money comes rather close to covering the
13 shortfall that is predicted for -- and is hoped to be
14 raised by the money raised by tolling. It seems that
15 instead of pursuing the government where the buck stops
16 there, it all seems to roll downhill and land on the
17 shoulders of us taxpayers getting paid -- having to pay
18 this duty again.

19 And it also seems, I must state, that this
20 whole process tonight, this public hearing seems to be
21 nothing more than a sham, smoke and mirrors, since the
22 award is being announced tomorrow and the next day.

23 So tonight -- there's a saying that those who
24 forget history are doomed to repeat it, and it seems
25 that -- tonight I hope I can speak for Texas. Tomorrow if

1 such things go through as planned, I will weep for Texas.

2 But the next day, with Texans, I expect we
3 will rise up and argue this point once again as hard as we
4 can. Thank you for your time.

5 MR. BARTH: Thank you.

6 (Applause)

7 MR. BARTH: Sharon Overall.

8 MS. OVERALL: My name is Sharon Overall,
9 3108 Mason Drive, Plano, Texas. Tolling of State
10 Highway 121 is unconstitutional. When Rosa Parks was asked
11 to move to the back of the bus, she refused because as she
12 recalled, I do not want to be deprived of the seat that I
13 have paid for.

14 The same is true for those of us who pay gas
15 tax. I pay a gas tax to have access to all state highways.
16 All state highways should be equal as possible in capacity
17 and amenities. There is no equality between freeways and
18 tollways.

19 The U.S. District Court ruled that the city
20 code of Montgomery denied and deprived plaintiff's and
21 other Negro citizens similarly situated, of equal
22 protection under the law and due process of law secured by
23 the 14th Amendment.

24 Those who live along 121 are not being
25 treated the same as those who live along 114. One has

1 access to a freeway and one to a service road. Therefore,
2 they have unequal access to transportation corridors.

3 Originally I didn't think the 14th Amendment
4 was a basis for this; but if unequal protection of law for
5 someone to only have access to the back of the bus, then it
6 is definitely unequal for certain segments of the
7 population of Texas to not have access to a freeway while
8 others do.

9 For anyone to argue otherwise, it would be to
10 say that it was legal for the City of Montgomery to limit
11 access to the front of the bus and overturn Rosa Parks'
12 victory. They would be saying that it is legal to treat
13 two segments of the population differently.

14 Those in Frisco and Plano are similarly
15 situated as those in Southlake. It is not equal when I can
16 be fined or jailed for failure to pay an additional tax to
17 use a state highway in Collin County but I can use for free
18 a state highway and even a segment of 121 in Tarrant
19 County.

20 The argument has been that there is just not
21 enough money for new roads. So old roads will be free, and
22 new roads will be tolled, and all gas tax money will be
23 used to maintain the old roads. They say we still have
24 access to the old free roads even if they are forty miles
25 away. Sound familiar?

1 This same argument can be used for schools.
2 We do not have enough money. So all of the old schools are
3 going to be free. A new school is going to have to pay a
4 tuition. If you don't like it, you can move, and -- or you
5 can drive your child thirty miles to a free one. Will this
6 fly? No.

7 Do not try to argue that we'd still have free
8 service roads that are inferior to the freeway. Rosa Parks
9 was told that the back of the bus was equal to the front of
10 the bus. Would you tell a parent that a school that only
11 offered English was equal to a school that offered English,
12 math, science, et cetera? No. You would be sued in a
13 heartbeat.

14 So why can you people not understand that
15 roads are a public entity just like schools that should be
16 as equal as possible across the board? Do not tell me that
17 there is not enough money. That is an excuse.

18 Raise the gas tax or ante up mileage fees.
19 Stop making excuses. So can anyone argue that tollways are
20 equal to free -- freeways? Can anyone argue that just
21 because there's a freeway forty miles away that I'm being
22 treated the same as others living next to State
23 Highway 114?

24 If you cannot argue this, then we must agree
25 that toll roads are unconstitutional, and this ridiculous

1 direction that TxDOT has taken should end. Toll roads are
2 discriminatory, therefore, unconstitutional.

3 MR. BARTH: Thank you.

4 (Applause)

5 MR. BARTH: Bill Baumbach?

6 MR. BAUMBACH: Yeah. Good evening. My name
7 is Bill Baumbach, and I live at 505 Rustic Place in Wylie.
8 I have concerns about this road. I have concerns about the
9 financing, about the tolling, about selling our
10 infrastructure and pawning our roads for immediate cash
11 because we don't have the discipline it takes to raise the
12 money to build our own roads.

13 Over the last two years, I've had the
14 opportunity to talk to a lot of Collin County citizens, and
15 I shared those concerns with them. Many of them had the
16 same concerns. I've got concerns that the road has got ten
17 exit ramps on it. That's not optimum for speed, that every
18 three-quarters of a mile, you'll have people changing
19 lanes.

20 I have lots of concerns, but the main concern
21 I have is the Texas Department of Transportation
22 strong-arming our local governments, strong-arming the
23 North Texas Turnpike Authority, taking over the road,
24 signing a contract, negotiating for thousands of dollars,
25 giving me three minutes after the contract has been signed,

1 and finally now asking us for our public opinion.

2 You don't want our public opinion. I've been
3 to many, many of these different hearings and meetings all
4 over this region having to do with roads, and I've watched
5 the Texas Department of Transportation do its very best to
6 make the public meeting or the public hearing process a
7 joke. Tonight you have succeeded.

8 I'm outraged. I think that every citizen in
9 Collin County should be outraged that you would negotiate,
10 sign a contract, and then hold the public hearing. Thank
11 you.

12 MR. BARTH: Thank you.

13 (Applause)

14 MR. BARTH: Let's turn the clock off. Did
15 y'all have anything else to say? I mean, did the clock
16 limit you? Let's see. Richard Bergeron.

17 MR. BERGERON: I didn't have anything.

18 MR. BARTH: Donna Bening?

19 MS. BENING: No further comments.

20 THE COURT: Thank you. Deborah Angell Smith?

21 MS. SMITH: If you'll excuse me. Hi, I'm
22 Deborah Angell Smith. I'm the county chair of the
23 Democratic Party of Collin County, and first I wanted to
24 acknowledge and recognize that we have people here who are
25 employees, and I think those of us who are -- have a

1 problem with what's being done need to recognize that these
2 people are here doing their job; and I am sure for the most
3 part, they're doing a fabulous job, and we are proud of
4 them.

5 On the other hand, the people who are giving
6 them direction are elected officials, and they are elected
7 by us. Now, I didn't vote for them, and I know some other
8 people here who didn't vote for them. But I know a lot of
9 people are feeling powerless.

10 Many of us recognize, this is a done deal.
11 As Bill said, this is a joke. This is a sham. They are
12 going through this process because they have to. It's
13 bureaucracy at its finest.

14 But those of us who feel powerless need not
15 feel powerless because we have power, and it's on election
16 day. I encourage all of you to be a part of the process.
17 You can make a change, and you can be part of the solution.

18 There is a direction in this state towards
19 privatizing as much as possible. We have gotten horribly
20 out of balance; and that is one thing that I have learned
21 in my work, working in associations, working in nonprofits,
22 that somehow or another, you have to find balance to serve
23 pub -- serve what's truly best for the public interest.

24 And what we have seen as -- I can't recall
25 who came up with the quote, absolute power corrupts

1 absolutely, and I believe we've seen that at our federal
2 level, at our state level, and locally. Right now we are
3 out of balance.

4 We are seeing benefits toward corporations,
5 towards big donors to certain political campaigns, and --
6 but we have the power to change that. We need to vote. We
7 need to get other people to register and vote and bring our
8 government back in balance.

9 Again, you have power. We just need to use
10 it. There's too many people who don't vote, and this is
11 the kind of thing that happens when people don't vote.
12 Thank you.

13 MR. BARTH: Thank you.

14 (Applause)

15 MR. BARTH: That was everybody that signed up
16 to speak. Is there anybody else who would like to make a
17 comment? Miss Overall, would you like to finish your
18 comments, or did you finish them?

19 MS. SMITH: Did I wrap in about three
20 minutes? That was my goal.

21 MS. OVERALL: I'm just going to actually ask
22 a few more questions that really weren't part of the first
23 one. I would ask everyone this: Why is Rick Perry pushing
24 this? One of his main campaign contributors was the
25 Trans-Texas Corridor Project.

1 All of a sudden, he's talking tollways.
2 There are no campaign contributions from a gas tax, but
3 millions of dollars from those who are going to be building
4 these and managing these.

5 If tollways are so lucrative, why is our
6 state willing to sell it? Why isn't the state holding on
7 to this asset? Isn't this asset the property of the
8 people -- asset the property of the people of Texas? This
9 is not an asset to be sold to the highest bidder.

10 Ask yourself, who is profiting. Are we going
11 to put 121 in the same system as the Trans-Texas Corridor
12 so they can use the money from it to pay for unlucrative
13 segments of the corridor? Why is the state so secretive
14 about the bidders?

15 Why is the state just not using NTTA to
16 collect the tolls? Why did they force the NTTA out of the
17 bidding process? Why have there been so many quit the
18 NTTA? Follow the money trail. Our leadership had the
19 answers to all these questions, yet they backed such a plan
20 that makes a profit off the backs of commuters. Tollways
21 are an unethical means for lobby money.

22 MR. BARTH: Thank you.

23 (Applause)

24 MR. BARTH: Is there anybody else who would
25 like to make a comment? Anyone? Seeing none, ladies and

1 gentlemen, we sincerely appreciate your attendance and
2 interest concerning the proposed tolling of State
3 Highway 121.

4 All of your questions, comments, and concerns
5 will receive careful consideration subsequent to tonight's
6 public hearing. Thank you very much for attending. Thank
7 you very much for participating. This hearing is now
8 adjourned.

9 (Hearing adjourned at 8:25 p.m.)

Dear Ms. Halstead:

As a citizen of McKinney, Texas, I wish to submit my comments regarding the SH 121 Collin County Environmental Re-Evaluation (the "Report").

I believe there are significant detrimental impacts to the citizens of Collin County and others if this section of SH 121 becomes the Toll Road. The Report does not appear to address or mitigate those impacts.

It does not appear there has been any study on the effect on large vehicles and lower income drivers as a result of toll rates on SH 121. It appears that the higher toll rates will divert traffic to city roads and city thoroughfares causing more congestion and worsened air quality.

The Report acknowledges that traffic patterns will change as a result of the conversion to the Toll Road. The frontage roads will have a level of service ("LOS") of "F", the worst category. For those citizens of and visitors to Collin County who use the frontage roads, this means heavy traffic, lengthy stop and go traffic resulting in traffic jams and multiple lights sequences occurring before a driver is able to cross intersections. However, there is little or no evaluation of this issue in the Report.

The Report also fails to evaluate the effects of these changed traffic patterns due to the Toll Road on air quality.

The Report apparently ignores the impact of the conversion to the Toll Road on residential areas, some within five hundred feet of SH 121; it fails to address the possible negative effect on commercial development which has allowed the County to keep its taxes low; it fails to evaluate the impact on lower income citizens and others who can't afford the toll; and it fails to address response times of emergency vehicles.


I support the comments made by Ms. Cissy Sylo, Director of Engineering Services for the City of Frisco, Texas, concerning the Report and ask that my support be noted.

I am in TOTAL opposition to the selling of SH 121 to foreign companies and the conversion to a toll road. This toll project has been ramrodded through the process so that TXDOT could have this portion of SH 121 converted to a toll way. TXDOT knows this portion of road is a "cash cow" for new toll roads!

Collin County generates hundreds of new jobs each year for the State of Texas and is home to many Fortune 500 companies as well as smaller companies which create wealth through taxes to the State of Texas. Collin County has an excellent quality of life for our citizens. Why are you placing more burden on the citizens who live and work in this area of Texas?

Tolling SH 121 will make it more difficult to entice through our economic development efforts more companies to the area to continue the job creation and quality of life.

I feel that there are significant environmental issues that have not been addressed as referenced in the City of Frisco letter dated March 6, 2007 and titled "SH 121 Collin County Environmental Re-evaluation" submitted by Cissy Sylo, Director of Engineering Services, City of Frisco.

Also, I do not feel that sufficient time has been allowed to review the proposal and that the wishes of the local communities, their citizens and elected officials have been largely ignored".

All the above entities are selling our Texas roads to the highest bidder for 50 years! These CDA's are all foreign companies who will raise rates as they see fit without any oversight because all the records of the contracts are kept private. (The following are notes from a TXDOT meeting back in Dec. 15, 2005)

“At the commission meeting, Commission Chairman Ric Williamson stated that it is not the state's strategy to hold down the cost of tolls to the consumers, rather he said the consumers (by choosing to use the toll road or not) should decide if the toll rate is “a buck, or ten cents, or 2 bucks a mile (time stamp 12:02:36 p.m. of the meeting).” Chairman Williamson also stated that it is not in the best interest of the state to turn over a toll road to an agency like NTTA because that agency will attempt to keep the toll rates lower to the citizens (time stamp 12:01:49 p.m. of the meeting). Taking the comments from Chairman Williamson, CDA's are favored by TxDOT because they will not be influenced by local political pressure to keep the toll rates down.”

I will be long in my grave and my grandchildren will be bearing the brunt of these tolls because of the attitudes of elected officials who believed that it was best to sell our roads to foreign companies.

Dear Ms. Hutchinson,

I moved to 4311 Sandalwood Lane in August 2005. We had our house professionally cleaned and the cleaners told us there was a strange fine yellow dust coating on all the blinds and surfaces that had no tobacco or smoker odor. After repeated doctor visits and ill health my 8yr old was diagnosed with "impacted feces". I never heard of such a thing, but then I found out that 3 out of 6 cub scouts in his Den had "impacted feces". A condition in which feces gets caked to the intestinal wall and doctors recommended putting them on a toxic daily laxative- Miralax. I never asked the other 3 scout parents so it's possible they all have impacted feces.

Within a year, I felt so sick when the HVAC unit kicked on that I finally called the Frisco fire department last month. They checked for CO leaks. They confirmed that we have no CO leaks and suggested I get my ducts and HVAC unit checked out. It turned out that the air ducts were once again loaded again with particulates and a bit moist. I just had the ducts cleaned out a year earlier. I lived in a house in Ohio for 8 years without EVER having ducts cleaned, so I had no expectation to clean these ducts so soon. The duct cleaner yesterday said that foreign matter (particulates, or even antibacterial sprays) in the condenser, will lead to moisture build up which will lead to mildew and bad air quality.

Another strange development is notable. One of my heels became extremely inflamed over the last year in this house. When I went on vacation, I stopped hobbling. I thought the problem was that these concrete slab floors are hard I started wearing shoes in the house. Last month, I developed an inflammation in my wrist and at one point that I thought it was broken. But after I had the ducts cleaned both heel and wrist inflammations have noticeably subsided.

Both of my children have developed Attention issues. I had a hair analysis done on my youngest (6yr old boy) and according to the results, he has Platinum and high Chromium in his body tissue. According to the lab results, the primary and almost only way to acquire these elements is through inhalation of automobile fumes.


My questions are:

Can inflammation symptoms come from a response to pollutants?

What are the odds of a strange disease like impacted feces affecting such a small group of boys. Is it more likely that the children's bodies are affected from pollutants in the school or home? Is Smith Elementary's HVAC system capable of handling the pollutants of HWY121? Will the system be able to provide good air quality once the toll way invites more traffic? Is it advisable to have elementary school children attend school so close to 121. What are the effects of pollutants on various age children -i.e. elementary vs. middle school? How do those effects compare with adults?

How many children in Smith elementary test positive for Platinum and other elements primarily acquired through automobile exhaust? Are there guidelines of how close a residential facility can be to highways / high traffic areas? What is typical distance for residences by most cities in Dallas? What amounts of pollutants come off a road during construction? What specific type and qty of pollutants are attributed to automobiles/gasoline vs. trucks/deisel? Is there a difference in the amount of pollutants expected at different speeds, ie. cars idling at a stoplight vs. 65MPH? What is the current tons/concentration given off for specifically the 500M impact radius in Frisco and what is the increase of tons released expected. What # of cars is that number (increase in pollutant tons) based on? Does the radius of impact change with the speed of cars? What is the radius of impact now – 500meters or miles? Will it change with the addition of traffic? What streets will be impacted? Does orientation of the house make a difference in home air quality? Do particulates going into the streams nearby change the composition of the stream? Do these particulates create a hostile environment for the life in the streams? Are the streams more likely to get moldy due to pollutants? What factors influence whether dangerous fungi in streams blow into homes? How much impact does the South to North wind direction have on the radius of homes polluted off 121? How much impact does S to N wind have on directing pollution into different orientation of homes? How can each pollutant element affect our health? Do any of these pollutants cause night awakenings? Are the installed residential HVAC units capable of handling the amount of particulates in the air now? What frequency would residences within impact zone be suggested to clean their ducts to Guarantee no ill effects from sick building/home syndrome? What are the unique particulates to construction that we can expect – Diesel fuel equipment, tar going down? What are the unique particulates to automobile exhaust can we expect and what are their potential health hazards?



Is there any funding to make our homes less hazardous to pay for duct cleaning or get special air scrubbing units? What are special steps we can take to protect our indoor air quality? Considering there are times in the summer that there are red Ozone days where we are recommended not to leave the house, would the air quality really be any better if we were to hole up in a house on 121?

What will happen to our homes resale value when 121 is tolled? What will happen to my home resale value if there are reports of ill health effects due to 121? Will the corporations that profit from the increased traffic be required to compensate homeowners for any loss of resale, for their loss of health, for their medical bills?

There was yellowish soot in this house and the air was “crunchy” when we moved in. Can you assess what the yellow soot composition is? Can you guarantee against or predict when this soot/particulate influx will not overcome the house interior again. What measures can we a homeowner take to minimize soot in the house and are there specific times and patterns for these measures? i.e. more wind/traffic in the day so don't run fan in the daytime.

Is there really a “Mexican garbage burnoff” in July/August timeframe that carries soot up to Dallas with the S to North wind?

It occurs to me that the houses on our street have had an extremely high turnover rate. We are the 3rd or 4th owner in a home that was built in 1999. What is the average turnover rate of a home in Frisco and can you do a study to identify the houses/areas with higher than average turnover? Maybe that would be indicative of people moving out for health reasons.

I am very concerned about my children's health and that of my neighbors. I would very much appreciate your help in addressing my concerns. I am very upset to have been unwarned / educated about health hazards of moving here. I would not wish our experience on any other family, therefore rather than just cut and run like it appears everyone else did, I am trying to fix the situation. Is my experience just typical of all Texas homes (lots of particulate poor indoor air quality) or is it a 121 pollution radius issue?






Since 1990, I have been a Collin County Commissioner representing Precinct 1. The precinct covers a significant portion of SH 121. If this section of SH 121 becomes the toll road, I believe there are serious detrimental impacts to the citizens of Collin County and others. The Report does not appear to address or mitigate those impacts. Because the apparent adverse impacts of the conversion of the Toll Road are not addressed in the Report, I submit my general concerns in this letter.

My concerns are as follows:

1. The Report acknowledges that traffic patterns will change as a result of the conversion to the Toll Road. The frontage roads will have a level of service ("LOS") of "F", the worst category. For those citizens of and visitors to Collin County who use the frontage roads, this means heavy traffic, lengthy stop and go traffic and multiple lights sequences occurring before a driver is able to cross intersections. However, there is little or no evaluation of this issue in the Report.
2. The Report also fails to evaluate the effects of these changed traffic patterns due to the Toll Road on air quality.
3. The Report ignores the impact of the conversion to the Toll Road on residential areas, some within 500 feet of SH121. In addition, it fails to address the possible negative effect on commercial development which has allowed the County to keep its taxes low; it fails to evaluate the impact on lower income citizens and others who can't afford the toll; and it fails to address response times of emergency vehicles.

Because there does not seem to be any intentional effort to address these issues, all of which adversely affect the citizens of my precinct and the county, I bring them to your attention.

I strongly oppose the selling of our SH 121 to private (foreign or domestic) companies and the conversion to a toll road. I feel that there are significant environmental issues that have not been addressed as referenced in the City of Frisco letter dated March 6, 2007 and titled "SH 121 Collin County Environmental Re-evaluation" submitted by Cissy Sylo, P.O. Also, I do not feel that sufficient time has been allowed to review the proposal and that the wishes of the local communities and elected officials have been largely ignored". We have been expressing these opinions on deaf ears for several years.

Listed below are some comments regarding the SH 121 Collin County Environmental Re-evaluation dated January 2007. I am taking this opportunity to review to review and provide comments on this document. I've listed several bullet points of errors, exclusions, etc. found in the EA:

- *Inconsistent construction time frames
- *Revenue amounts, sources, distribution, etc.
- *Peak hour tolling
- *Emergency response times due to congestion
- *Traffic diversion to arterial roads and the impact of said traffic on finances, congestion, safety, air quality, etc.
- *Right of way issues with land owned by the City of Frisco.
- *The City of Frisco should **NOT** be listed as being in support of tolling SH 121.

More specifically, the following are just a few of the major issues not addressed, unclear or just plain wrong.

1. Typically TxDOT has provided at least 30 days notice of Public Hearings. Why wasn't the typical 30 day notice provided in this February 2nd Public Hearing?
2. There are several errors in the assessment, including the fact that there is little to distinguish it as an individual project separate from the Denton County project. Many of the references are more accurate to the Denton County project than the Collin County project for the majority of the document. Shouldn't each Environmental Assessment be unique to the corridor and not a regional "catch all?"

3. According to NCTCOG Memorial Drive analysis received by the City of Frisco on March 1, 2007, NCTCOG used 15 cents per mile for the toll analysis to generate the 2030 volumes on the toll road. If the same analysis was used for this Environmental Assessment for the 2025 traffic volumes and the Comprehensive Development Agreement with Cintra escalating the tolls every 2 years, then the volumes shown in the EA are incorrect. It is highly unlikely that no increases will occur in the approximate 20 years until 2030 and it is stated in the EA that traffic diverts from the toll road as tolls increase over time. Therefore the volumes will decrease on the main lanes as stated in the EA as toll rise and increase on the adjacent frontage roads and other arterial street system.

4. It is this source of funding that will fund projects as agreed upon by a cooperative TxDOT-RTC selection process which considers the desires of the cities and counties in which the revenue-generating project is located, (as per the NCTCOG RTC Business Terms for the State Highway 121 in Collin and Denton Counties) not the "elected officials in Collin County" as stated in the EA5. You state that overall the minority population of the project area represent 23.3 percent of the total population. This is a significant portion of the population. How is environmental justice served if these people are required to travel on the "free" frontage roads since they cannot afford the toll road? This will also increase congestion and reduce air quality as additional motorists are forced onto the service roads, which contain many traffic signals and lower speed limits. These individuals also typically have the oldest, highest polluting vehicles which will further now pollute the air at each signal they must stop. There are dozens of other errors and misstatements in the EA, making fairly obvious that this document was written not to inform but to persuade.

I have heard some proponents of tolling SH 121 describe the building of toll roads in general as a "fair tax" because only those using the roads supposedly pay for them. However, when your community becomes surrounded by toll roads and the majority of growing highways in the entire region are becoming toll roads, there is **no** choice. We are unfairly "taxed" in order to commute to work, travel to shop, drive to church, etc. I appreciate your time and thank you in advance for considering all that must be done before our future infrastructure is sold without forethought.

On behalf of the City of Frisco, we would like to submit the following additional comments on the Environmental Re-Evaluation performed for SH 121 from Dallas North Tollway to US 75, Collin County, Texas.

We believe that there are significant impacts associated with the change of this section of SH 121 from freeway to toll road. Furthermore, we believe that the re-evaluation contains significant errors and omissions. Attached to this letter is a copy of the detailed comments of Cissy Sylo, P.E., Director of Engineering Services for the City of Frisco, which identify the numerous errors and omissions. Ms. Sylo's comments have also been submitted separately.

The City of Frisco has identified several areas of concern. These include the effect of the conversion to tollway upon traffic patterns, and the associated impacts upon noise, congestion and air quality, and the environmental justice impacts on low-income/minority communities.

The increase of traffic on the frontage roads will result in greater congestion and have significant impacts

The re-evaluation describes how traffic patterns will change as a result of the conversion to a tollway. Drivers unable or unwilling to pay the toll will instead use the frontage roads and the local arterial streets. As identified by Cissy Sylo in her comments, the total volume of traffic diverted to alternative routes ranges from 25,000 to 45,000 vehicles per day, depending on the particular section of SH 121. A portion of this volume will be diverted to frontage roads, and a portion will be diverted to arterial streets.

Incredibly, the level of service ("LOS") for the frontage roads is predicted to be "F" which is the worst category. LOS of F means stop-and-go traffic, and even worse during periods of peak demand. There is absolutely no attempt to analyze the impacts upon air quality of this type of stop and go traffic. Instead, the re-evaluation merely states, "Increased congestion [on the frontage roads] may result in air quality implications..." (p.37). It is impossible to know what is meant by the term 'implications,' because there is no further analysis or discussion of them anywhere in the document.

One is left to guess that the stop-and-go traffic flow, or rush hour traffic jams will negatively impact air quality, in terms of increased levels of particulate matter and air toxics, and greater impact upon ozone levels. These negative impacts will be further worsened because the low income populations that use the frontage roads to avoid tolls, generally have older, higher polluting vehicles. Increased levels of particulate matter and air toxics will have a particularly high impact on areas closest to the frontage road. There are residential areas in the City of Frisco that are within 500 m of SH 121.

After avoiding any discussion of these ‘implications,’ Table 5-11 contains a summary of direct and indirect impacts (p.44). The *only* direct/indirect impact to air quality listed in this table is the “Decrease in congestion on the tolled mainlanes would likely benefit air quality.” To say this is disingenuous is an understatement. It is a material misrepresentation of both the information in the document itself, and the reality of the situation. It is true that when fewer cars use the tolled mainlanes, there will be fewer emissions from those cars. But these other cars and their emissions do not simply disappear. Instead, they travel at slower speeds on the frontage roads and arterial streets, and thereby produce even higher emissions than if they had traveled on the mainlanes.

The increase of traffic on the frontage roads will also negatively impact emergency vehicle response times, and have a potential impact on the desirability of the adjacent areas for commercial development, particularly for retail or businesses seeking easy access for customers and employees.

Environmental Justice

The re-evaluation states that, “low-income individuals may be impacted as a result of the difference in travel time associated with utilizing non-toll alternatives.” (Table 5-11, p.44). The re-evaluation correctly identifies that low-income individuals will be more likely to avoid the tolls and thus will constitute a large portion of those who chose alternative routes. As identified, the non-toll alternatives are the frontage roads and the arterial streets, and the frontage roads will have a LOS of F. There is no serious analysis or attempt to identify the LOS impact on the arterial streets.

The tollway *will* result in an increase in frontage road traffic, and *will* result in a corresponding increase in congestion and wait times at the intersections and traffic lights. It is low income individuals that will disproportionately suffer from these impacts. Therefore, it is clear that low income individuals *will* be impacted. The re-valuation’s use of the term “may” is not supported by the facts in the document, and appears to be an attempt to understate the impact and avoid addressing environmental justice issues.


Conclusion

I am opposed to the SH 121 Collin County Toll Road Project. I am opposed to it for several reasons; the key reasons are:

- The City of Frisco will be bordered by toll roads on the west and south. The cost for commuting is too high now and the proposed toll road would increase the cost for commuting even more.
- The proposed toll road will be constructed based on minimum standards. The NTTA has spent considerable funds to make the DNT an urban corridor built with esthetics in mind. There are some sections of Central Expressway (US 75) that are true urban corridors with nice esthetics. A project built for maximizing return on investment, as Cintra will do, means very little for citizens to be proud of as it relates to a major roadway on their southern city boundary. As pointed out in the letter from the City of Frisco dated March 7, 2007, the EA does not adequately address landscaping, or even noise abatement.
- I do support TxDOT and NCTCOG in their efforts to address growing traffic congestion in our region. The balance between traffic demand and capital funds to build and maintain roadway infrastructure is delicate, at best. However, SH 121 is a major cross-cutting regional roadway with no reasonable alternative roadways – SH380 and the PGBT are too far north and south for linking the cities of McKinney, Allen, Frisco, and The Colony to major regional destinations, such as DFW airport. Cintra will be bound by contract to provisions (terms of agreement) to share toll revenues (“*Excess Toll Revenue Sharing.*”), but they will not do anything beyond the contract. It is only reasonable to assume a very utilitarian roadway built for the sole purpose of maximizing toll revenue. The revenues received by the City of Frisco will likely be used to offset the negative impact of SH 121 Collin County. The true winner is Cintra.
- Our traffic problems will increase, our noise levels will increase, our pollution will increase. The Cintra contract only provides the mechanism to meet air quality standards, and noise standards marginally. The EA does a poor job at addressing these project details.

For the above reasons, and more like them, I expect the EA to adequately address ALL project details with accurate data. I have put my full faith in my governmental officials

at the City of Frisco Engineering Department to provide sound engineering judgment on such issues at the SH 121 Collin County tollroad. I have read their draft letter dated March 6, 2007 on Environmental Re-Evaluation. They have certainly done a fantastic job in critically reviewing the EA on behalf of the City of Frisco and North Texas. By way of their review, I find the EA un-acceptable. It is in-accurate in too many ways to serve as a key document to clearing the SH 121 tollroad for construction/conversion. The EA should address all comments made by the City of Frisco in their letter to you. Adequate time (minimum of 30 days) should be given to all communities to provide sufficient time to review all assumptions, calculations, references, and sources of data.

It is clear in my mind that either Cintra or TxDOT is trying to strong-arm the public and our communities in pursuing tollroads in our state as demonstrated in this project and the TTC-35. There are significant and irreversible ramifications to pushing such projects through too fast and without proper or adequate public involvement and time to review key documents, such as the Environmental Assessment.



After careful consideration of the outstanding environmental and other issues concerning S.H. 121, I respectfully submit that too many major questions and too many inaccuracies exist in what TxDOT has submitted to move forward as evidenced by Mrs. Cissy Sylo's letter dated March 6, 2007. I am in full support and concurrence with the comments made by Mrs. Sylo in her response to the Environmental Assessment.

The Due Diligence, Environmental assessment and time allowed for public input are not adequate and I cannot see how the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) can move forward on a project that has such major implications to our region. As stated in Mrs. Sylo's letter, the unanswered questions are numerous. It is very clear to me that this process has been rushed and requirements of State and Federal laws have not been met.

I have also received hundreds of contacts from citizens, both in Frisco and from nearby Cities. Well over 98% of the responses I have received have voiced their opinion that

they do not feel that they have been given the opportunity to express their views and that their views have been largely ignored. I oppose the process which has basically ignored the local citizens and local elected officials by forcing this Tollway on them to solve a problem that is state-wide in nature. The recent public hearing is a prime example of how the voters have been ignored. The time for public input is still not expired yet the press conference and awarding of the CDA has been announced.

Also, I have a major concern that the City of Frisco with a population of approximately 95,000 and the City of Allen with an approximate population of 80,000 do not have a representative on the RTC. The RTC is making a decision that directly impacts our cities and a major portion of SH121 are located in the City of Frisco and City of Allen. When statements are made that the regional is supporting this; those statements should say that the region except the cities most affected by this are supporting it.

Specifically, my opposition to tolling S.H. 121 include:

- Toll rates set at an amount higher than needed to build the road.
- High annual escalation rates that cannot be sustained.
- Creating an environment where those can't afford it will not be able to freely travel in North Texas. Environmental Justice Issues have not been addressed by TxDOT.
- Creating a situation where local roads are heavily impacted by the diversion of traffic from those that can't use the Tollway. The sale/lease of Texas assets to foreign companies
- The band-aid approach to the State Highway Transportation Problems cannot be supported. The CDA process is a short-term solution with long-term negative ramifications.
- The lack of transparency to the CDA process – We don't know what we don't know. We can't answer our Citizens questions because TxDOT cannot answer the local official's questions.
- The lack of local control.
- The lack of local input,
- The obvious arm twisting of local officials by regional and State authorities.
- The double and triple taxation that is being created.
- The lack of re-imbursement of donated right-of-way that was given under the assumption that S.H. 121 was a freeway. All landowners who donated ROW should be contacted and given the opportunity to re-dedicate their land with the new proposed CDA process.
- The conversion of the section from DNT to Hillcrest Road in Frisco from tax funded, engineered and constructed to a Tollroad is, again, double taxation.
- Lack of public and official input on configuration of interchanges and ramps.
- Use of Roadway funds by TxDOT in marketing efforts to convince citizens that this is a good idea
- Use of Roadway funds by TxDOT to take photographs of vehicles on a free road to simply give to foreign companies.

- Use of Roadway funds to create marketing videos and virtual tours of the new “Tollway” long before it was confirmed to be a Tollway.
- Lack of open records and roadblocks presented to citizens trying to gather needed information
- Market driven rates. Transportation is critical to Texas Commerce; it should not be based on “user” fees and the needs of a few.
- The complete disregard for local resolutions. Frisco passed Resolution No. 06-04-75R on April 4, 2006 opposing Tolling S.H. 121. Also, other Collin County Cities have opposed the method of tolling S.H. 121. They are being largely ignored.
- The complete disregard to the hundreds of comments made by Citizens regarding this process. NCTCOG, TxDOT and RTC have all received these comments and yet they are not discussed or presented to the press and/or public.



The proposed tolling of State Highway 121 is unconstitutional. (QUESTIONS IN CAPITAL LETTERS OR LOOK AT FILE ATTACHMENT)

1. WHERE IS THE ECONOMIC JUSTICE if two co-workers make the same salary and work at DFW airport and one lives in Frisco and one in Westlake and one has to pay a "toll" to travel to work on a freeway while the other has a "free" freeway? One has access to a new State Highway 114, which is a freeway and is free. One only has access to State Highway 121, which could cost him over \$1000 a year depending on the rate established. Over a 30-year period, one has put \$30,000 dollars, which has been compounded and is worth over \$75,000 into retirement and the other has spent \$30,000 dollars on tolls and has nothing in retirement. The only alternative for the Frisco man is to have wasted hours and hours traveling the service road, which is not equal to a freeway, stopping at red lights. SO, WHERE IS THE ECONOMIC JUSTICE?

2. WHERE IS THE ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY ON THE IMPACT ON THE OTHER EAST-WEST ROADS AND THE AIR QUALITY IN THESE NEIGHBORHOODS? At the meeting in Plano

on February 26, 2007, a TX Dot official told the audience that we still had McDermott and Hedgecoxe as alternate routes. These roads pass neighborhoods. Has there been a study on the added exhaust that will be on these roads and in these neighborhoods as people use these roads as the tolls increase to where no one can afford them? I have not seen an environmental report as to the impact on the neighborhoods if the traffic stays on SH 121 or moves to McDermott and Hedgecoxe. WHERE IS THE ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY ON AIR QUALITY?

3. HOW CAN MONEY FROM THE TOLLS FROM SH 121 BE USED LEGALLY ON OTHER ROADS - MAKING THE TOLL NOT A USER FEE? The state passed bills for this, but at the Federal level, isn't this just stealing from those who use SH121 and giving it to those elsewhere in the region. The city of Plano sold us out who live near SH 121 for the portion west of the DNT and are going to use the money for a new overpass at US 75 and Parker. 90% of those who use SH121 do not use this overpass or vice-versa, so it is just stealing. SO HOW DOES THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT JUSTIFY STEALING FROM THE USEERS OF ONE ROAD FOR THE BENEFIT OF A DIFFERENT GROUP OF PEOPLE ON ANOTHER ROAD?

4. In the environmental study they had at the meeting on February 26, it stated that there were not enough minorities that would be affected so they were not going to a further study (paraphrase). So, the low income, minorities and poor people of Collin County are not considered in this evaluation because there is not a significant number? So, the economic impact on these families is not an issue – I bet it is to them – this may mean that the father loses 20-30 minutes a day, if he uses the service road, with his family or whether or not they can afford dinner if he uses the tollway. The number of minority or low income is not an issue; the effect on these people is the issue. WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF THE TOLLWAY ON MINORITIES AND LOW-INCOME PEOPLE? They cannot brush it aside because of a low number of people affected. Will it affect their health if they pay the toll and eat fewer vegetables, or will their children lose time with their parents and end up in jail?

5. HAS THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DONE AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS TO RICK PERRY FROM CINTRA AND ZACHARY CONSTRUCTION? Have all of the deals and money been investigated to make sure that there have not

been any behind the scene deals. Has the Federal Government investigated to make sure that the cities and counties have not been coerced into this plan? Frisco pulled out, yet they said at the meeting that all of the cities are on board. Cities are being told that they will not receive money for other roads if they do not go along with the plan.

6. WHY ARE OTHER METHODS OF RAISING FUNDS FOR ROADS NOT BEING UTILIZED?

Raise the gas tax. This is a method that affects all users of our roads and is fairly equal (except that some cars get better gas mileage than others, but those who benefit from better gas mileage are doing us all a favor by not making us more dependent on terrorists for our oil). A mileage fee would work the same as a tollroad in that you would pay for each mile driven on any road. We would not need foreigners to run it and all of the money could be used on the roads. This would make all roads tollroads and create equality. A mileage fee could be paid each year when your car is inspected. The lack of sufficient funds is not a reason to treat people unequally. Deny the tollroads based on unequal economic justice and force the legislature to come up with a plan that treats all Texans equitably.

7. IF THE STATE SAYS THAT IT IS "CONSTITUTIONAL" TO TREAT DIFFERENT SEGMENTS OF THE POPULATION "UNEQUALLY", THEN WILL WE SEE A REVERSAL IN THE DECISION

BY THE If the U.S. District Court that ruled in favor of Rosa Parks (7a)? They ruled that the City code of Montgomery “deny[ied] and deprive [d] plaintiffs and other Negro citizens similarly situated of the equal protection of the laws and due process of law secured by the Fourteenth Amendment.” They stated that it was illegal to charge her the same fee as the white person and then only give her access to the back of the bus. I state that it is illegal to charge me a plaintiff a gas tax and only give me access to a service road when others who pay the gas tax are given access to free state highways which are freeways (example SH 114 and SH 121 in Tarrant County). If some transportation corridors are free and others are tollroads, then there is unequal access to transportation corridors. I could be jailed, as she was if I refuse to pay the toll based on the fact that I have paid my gas tax. A person using SH 121 in Tarrant County does not face that threat of jail. I am similarly situated to SH 121 as one who lives near SH 114. SO, WHERE IS MY EQUAL PROTECTION UNDER THE LAW AS SECURED BY THE FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT (7b)?

Note: Do not state that I still have access to State Highway 114. Then this argument could be used for new schools because there is not enough

money for all of our needs without raising taxes. The scenario would be that all of existing schools will remain free and all of the school taxes that is collected will be used for the existing schools and new schools that only provide English – no math, science, etc. Any new school that provides English, history, math, science, etc. will be built as a tuition only school. A person who lives near an existing school will pay nothing to use their school. If you live near a new school, then you may have to travel 10 to 20 miles in order to attend a school with all of the subjects that is free (State Highway 114) or you may choose to pay a tuition at the school located in your neighborhood (tollroad), or use a school near you that only offers English (service road). Please justify – Would this be constitutional (8)? This is the same argument used for tollways. Roads like schools are public entities and are subject to the same constitutional requirements.

Tolling of SH 121 is unconstitutional per the 14th amendment.

When Rosa Parks was asked to move to the back of the bus, she refused because as she recalled, "I did not want to be deprived of a seat that I had paid for." The same is true for those of us who pay a gas tax. I paid a gas tax to have access to ALL STATE HIGHWAYS. ALL State Highways should be as equal as possible in capacity and amenities. It is fairly equal for there to be red lights on SH 114 in West Texas when the red lights are about 30 miles apart and there isn't any traffic and a freeway in Collin County when there are thousands of cars an hour.

The U.S. District Court ruled that the City code of Montgomery "deny [ied] and deprive [d] plaintiffs and other Negro citizens similarly situated of the equal protection of the laws and due process of law secured by the Fourteenth Amendment." Those who live along State Highway 121 are NOT being treated the same as those who live along State Highway 114. One has access to a free freeway and one only has access to a service road. We have paid for the right to use 121 as a freeway with our gas tax. The portion from the DNT to I- 35 was funded. That money is being diverted to I -35 to widen it in Lewisville. So while some have improvements to their freeway. We are left with a tollway. If some transportation corridors are free and others are tollroads, then there is unequal access to transportation corridors. If all of the states highways had two free lanes and one toll lane, that would be legal, but this is inefficient. Tollways are inefficient. They are proposing that a foreign company be allowed to make a 20% profit off the back of commuters!!

Originally I did not think that the 14th amendment could be used as a basis, but if it could be used to say that it was unequal protection of the law for someone to only have access to the back of the bus, then it is definitely the basis for a lawsuit when certain segments of the population of Texas do not have access to a freeway and others do. For anyone to argue otherwise, then, would be to say that it was legal for the city of Montgomery to limit those who have access to the front of the bus and overturn Rosa Park's victory. They would be saying that it is legal to treat two segments of the population differently. Those in Frisco and Northern Plano are similarly situated as those in South Lake. It is not equal when I could be fined or jailed for failure to pay an additional tax to use a State Highway in Collin County, but I could use for free a State Highway, even another segment of 121, in Tarrant County. The state is saying that some who live along some transportation corridors will have access to freeways and others in the state will only have service roads!

The argument has been that there is just not enough money for new roads, so old roads will be free and new roads will be tolled and all of the gas tax will be used to maintain the old roads. You still have access to the old free roads, albeit they may be 40 miles away. Sound familiar?

This same argument could be used for schools. We do not have enough money, so all of the old schools will be free and we will use all school taxes on the existing campuses and any new school will be built by charging tuition. If you do not like it, then you can move or drive your child 30 miles to a free school. Would this fly? NO

Do not try to argue that we will still have free service roads. They are inferior to a freeway. Rosa Parks was told that the back of the bus was equal to the front of the bus! Would you tell a parent that their school that only offered English was equal to a school that offered English, math, science, art, etc., NO! You would be sued so fast that your head would spin.

So why can you people not understand that roads are a public entity just like schools that should be as equal as possible across the board?

You cannot even argue that it is a user fee, because they are going to take revenue from this road and use it on other roads.

Do not tell me that there is not enough money. That is an excuse. Raise the gas tax or implement a mileage fee. Stop making excuses.

Ask yourself, why is Rick Perry pushing this? There are no campaign contributions from a gas tax, but companies that can make money off a tollway will contribute millions of dollars. I do not want to pay for Rick Perry's bid for Vice-President with tolls.

So, can anyone argue that tollways are equal to free freeways? Can anyone argue that just because there is a freeway 40 miles away that I am being treated the same as others living next to State Highway 114? If you cannot argue this, then you must agree that tollroads are unconstitutional and this ridiculous direction that TX Dot has taken should end! Tollroads are discriminatory - therefore, unconstitutional!



Please accept this letter as support for the comments made by Ms. Cissy Sylo, Frisco's director of engineering services, concerning the Environmental Re-evaluation for converting SH 121 from a free road to a toll road in Collin County.

In addition, I want to identify the magnitude of the proposed toll rates on the public and the unintended consequences which will be borne by the adjoining cities. For comparison purposes, I have used the existing NTTA rates to compare the rates currently published for the Denton County section of SH 121 operating as a toll road. I compared a section of the DNT in which the base rate is \$.30 for toll tag users and \$.40 for cash customers. The section of SH 121 I used for comparison purposes has a rate of \$.45 for electronic toll customers and \$.60 for cash customers. Obviously, these sections compare at a 50% differential which is the approximate per mile differential between existing rates for the NTTA system as compared to the initial rates set for SH 121. While the first tier for small passenger vehicles starts out at a 50% differential, in general, the bigger the vehicle the bigger the differential in rates all the way up to a 173% percentage difference.

It seems to me that the effect of the above rates for SH 121, if they are reflective of the rates to be charged by Cintras, will not only drive the lower income drivers off of the tollroad, but the large vehicles as well. The effect of these toll rates on the traffic diverted to the service roads and city thoroughfares will be to worsen congestion and air quality.

I had a breakfast meeting the other day with approximately 20 maintenance workers from our parks and recreation department. I asked them how many would drive SH 121 explaining that it will be all electronic tolled and for anyone not using a toll tag, the costs will be even greater than the initial \$.145 per mile. Every one of the workers said that they would not use the tollroad, rather they would use the service roads and city thoroughfares.

A few weeks ago, I was in Austin to visit our state legislators during Collin County day in Austin. While waiting to see Representative Ken Paxton, a young lady also waiting to see Representative Paxton told me that she lived in Dallas and knew Frisco had some great places to shop, but that she would not come to Frisco because she would have to use the Dallas North Tollway and pay tolls – and to think that NTTA's toll rates today are approximately 50% less than the initial toll rates for SH 121.

The Frisco city council passed Resolution No. 06-04-75R on April 4, 2006, withdrawing Frisco's support for a tollroad (I have attached a copy of the resolution). Also, to the best of my knowledge, the resolutions passed by the cities of Plano and Allen for tolling the Collin County section of SH 121 were contingent upon SH 121 being constructed and operated by NTTA along with other conditions.

There has been a large number of public comments made to the North Central Texas Council of Governments, the Texas Department of Transportation, and to private consultants overwhelmingly against the proposed SH 121 tollroad project since 2004. I request that all of these comments be gathered by you and made a part of your report.

In summary, the current proposal to toll SH 121 has many significant environmental issues which have either not been addressed in your report, or, at best, inadequately or inaccurately addressed. There also are environmental justice issues which have not been adequately researched and studied. The diversion of traffic from the tollroad onto the service roads and city arterial streets are a major concern as well.

WHEREAS, certain members of the RTC have indicated that excess revenue generated by SH 121 tolls should be shared by the entire region in direct conflict with the RTC policy adopted for the Denton County section of SH 121; and

WHEREAS, certain TxDOT associated officials and RTC members have indicated that toll rates on the Collin County Section of SH 121 should be set higher than needed to pay for SH 121 construction and associated costs in order to yield more excess revenues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRISCO, TEXAS:


Section I. The Council of the City of Frisco, Texas hereby rescinds Resolution No 06-02-29R.

I'm against tolling 121 from the Tollway to 75 primarily because it places an unfair and outrageous financial burden on people who live in this part of the state and is due to the complete lack of courage by our state legislators to do the correct action which is raise the state gas tax. The state gas tax favors conservation because it is based on amount of gas consumed not by the miles driven so if you have a more fuel efficient vehicle or drive less (which are good things) then you are rewarded. A toll road only favors driving less as it treats every vehicle regardless of fuel efficiency the same. Some math:

1. Gas tax (state) is \$0.18 per gallon unchanged in about ~15 years and only 2/3 of this

goes to fund roads, the remainder schools. No increase for inflation or cost of construction. I'm not against tax increases when they are justified. It seems to me the state has been lax in not explaining and campaigning for a state gas tax increase. The Dallas Morning News did a study a few years back which showed the most efficient way to raise money for new roads was to increase the state gas tax.

2. Assuming one has a car that drives 18 miles to the gallon, then their state gas tax is only \$0.01 per mile vs. ~\$0.15 per mile on the proposed 121 toll road. A whopping 1500% increase. Put another way, assuming gas is \$2.50/gallon, that would be equivalent to paying \$5.20 per gallon of gas for driving 18 miles on the toll road. Even a doubling of the gas tax to \$0.36 would be a bargain.

Finally, this is too long a time to be locked into an agreement.



I offer an additional comment to my original letter based on some comments from the RTC meeting today.

1. Bill Hale stated that if improvements were made to US 75 and or I-35 then TXDOT would be required to compensate Cintra as part of the noncompete clause requirement. How will this affect the revenue for either the "excess revenue upfront or out yrs"?
2. What level of service is required for the CDA to be established before capacity improvements must be made? Does this apply to both the main lanes and the frorage roads? Parallel arterials?
3. The analysis of a "Starbucks" lease was used by. Txdot to refer to the CDA. I don't think you make the Starbucks customer pay for a lighting fee each time he comes in the door plus pay again for the lighting fee that is absorbed into the cost of his cup of coffee. Why then does TxDOT expect the cities to pay for high mast lighting and not the "Starbucks" who is leasing the facility?
4. The toll signs at the Denton S:H 121 gantries do not match the website charges. What is really being charged there and what therefore will be charged in Collin County? The issue relates to truck axles. Only 3 vehicle types are shown on the signs however there are multiple toll rates listed on the website.

Thanks for taking my additional comments. Jessica told us yesterday that email was also acceptable for public input and comment.

Listed below are my comments regarding the SH 121 Collin County Environmental Re-evaluation dated January 2007 which I received on January 26, 2007. I appreciate the opportunity to review and provide comments on this document due to the magnitude of impact this proposed toll road will have on the City of Frisco, its citizens and the rest of the region.

1. The City of Frisco received the notice of the Public Hearing on February 2, three weeks prior to the Public Hearing. Attached (Attachment #1) is a copy of the stamped notification received by the City. Typically TxDOT has provided at least 30 days notice of other Public Hearings. Why wasn't the typical 30 day notice provided in this Public Hearing?
2. This entire document is in many cases an exact word for word copy of the SH 121 Denton County Environmental Assessment which accounts for many of the errors in the document. There is little to distinguish it as an individual project or Environmental Assessment separate from the Denton County project. Many of the references are more accurate to the Denton County project than the Collin County project for the majority of the document. Shouldn't each Environmental Assessment be unique to the corridor and not a boiler plate document?
3. According to NCTCOG Memorial Drive analysis received by the City of Frisco on March 1, 2007, NCTCOG used 15 cents per mile for the toll analysis to generate the 2030 volumes on the toll road. (See attachment #2) If the same analysis was used for this Environmental Assessment for the 2025 traffic volumes and the Comprehensive Development Agreement with Cintra escalating the tolls every 2 years, then the volumes shown in the EA are incorrect. It is highly unlikely that no increases will occur in the approximate 20 years until 2030. It is stated in the EA that traffic diverts from the toll road as tolls increase over time.

Therefore the volumes will decrease on the main lanes as stated in the EA as toll rise and increase on the adjacent frontage roads and other arterial street system.

4. Did the modeling take into account the Business Terms for State Highway 121 in Collin and Denton Counties which were included in the Appendix which state under item #1 that the “*maximum weekday peak period toll rate in 2010 is 17 cents/mile. The weekday peak period is currently defined as 6:30 am to 9:00 am and 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm. The RTC would need to approve any changes to this definition.*”? If peak toll rates are proposed by Cintra and were not modeled, then the traffic volumes during the peak hours would not be correctly reflected. NCTCOG is greatly interested in implementing peak hour tolling. Does the Cintra contract anticipate peak hour tolling? If so, shouldn't the modeling account for this diversion of traffic?
5. There are a significant number of abbreviations in this document. A glossary of abbreviations and their definition would be helpful for the lay person to read. I have had several citizens ask me questions about all of the terminology used for the abbreviations throughout the document.
6. Emergency response times are established by national standards. It is anticipated that due to these standards that the City of Frisco will be required to build additional Fire Stations in order to meet the 5 minute emergency response time (1 minute to dispatch and 4 minutes to drive) as a result of the congestion created by the toll road diversion.
7. Page 1 – “*near neighbor/near timeframe projects*” is terminology that was specifically used by the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) during the SH 121 Denton County Toll Road Environmental process due to the gasoline sales tax funding that was already funding the construction of this segment of SH 121. Since there is minimal “gasoline sales tax funding” of SH 121 main lanes in the Collin County portion, (only from DNT to Hillcrest) it is not the correct terminology to use “near neighbor/near timeframe” for projects that would be agreed upon. The Regional Transportation Council (RTC) does not intend to use “near neighbor/near timeframe” funding for SH 121 Collin County. The correct or more accurate terminology would be “*Excess Toll Revenue Sharing.*” The funding will be 75% up front and 25% over time in accordance with the NCTCOG Regional Transportation Council (RTC) “Business Terms for the State Highway 121 in Collin and Denton Counties”.
8. Page 1 - It is this source of funding that will fund projects as agreed upon by a cooperative TxDOT-RTC selection process which considers the desires of the cities and counties in which the revenue-generating project is located, (as per the NCTCOG RTC Business Terms for the State Highway 121 in Collin and Denton Counties) not the “*elected officials in Collin County*” as stated in the second paragraph.
9. Since the rates on the SH 121 toll road will be higher than the rates on the DNT/PGBT over time, was this differential modeled? Since the rates will be higher on the SH 121 toll road, traffic is likely to divert to the DNT/PGBT. What is the impact to these toll

roads and other facilities? Will air quality decrease in these corridors as a result of the differential in tolls?

10. The rates of the non-single vehicles on SH 121 versus the NTTA system are significantly different. The toll rates for SH 121 trucks and other large vehicles will divert even further traffic to the frontage road and arterials. Was this differential in price between systems analyzed? It is often viewed in pavement design/analysis that the typical 18-wheeler does the same damage as 5,000 cars to a street. The percentage of trucks is typically what will accelerate the end of life of a pavement. The diversion of these heavy vehicles to our local arterial streets due to the high toll rates will further burden the local communities. What analysis was done regarding truck traffic and its diversion? What air quality analysis of these vehicles diverting to the local streets and frontage roads was performed?
11. What analysis was done to the existing frontage road pavement section due to the higher truck volume (diversion) and the Eagle Ford Shale issue? Can the frontage roads withstand this additional truck load? Although this may not necessarily be an EA issue this issue will definitely impact the local communities as the truck loads and the Eagle Ford shale issue will accelerate their deterioration.
12. What safety issues will occur as a result of this diversion of truck traffic to the frontage roads? There have been several fatalities along the SH 121 frontage roads in the past several years. Many of these involve truck traffic and single occupant vehicles. If the truck traffic diverts to the frontage roads and arterials, it is anticipated the fatality rates will not to decrease but increase over time. How was this safety issue studied? What will be done to correct this issue?
13. Page 1 – Footnote 2 – There will not be any “near neighbor/near timeframe” projects for SH 121 Collin County. There will be “Excess Toll Revenue Sharing Up Front projects.”
14. Page 2- The tolling of SH 121 is stated to accelerate the construction of SH 121 from Hillcrest to US 75 approximately 10 years earlier. However, TxDOT has used in its News Release dated February 28, 2007 on its Website <http://www.dot.state.tx.us/news/003-2007.htm> that the construction by tolling has accelerated it 25 years earlier. Which is the correct definition of when the project would have been built? 10 years earlier or 25 years earlier? The *Two Futures for Collin County: Incremental Versus Leveraged (SH 121 Feasibility Study Report)*, April 2005, on page 1 states that no funding is available for at least the next ten years to construct the rest of the corridor, including the freeway-to-freeway interchanges. However, in the press release awarding the project to Cintra, TxDOT claims it would be 25 years before it would be built. Given the high demand for this corridor, congestion in the region, it seems unlikely that the region would delay building this corridor for 25 years. However, it is important to provide non-conflicting facts.

15. Page 2 – In the second paragraph change the title of “near neighbor/near time frame” to “Excess Toll Revenue – Up Front Payment Projects.”
16. Page 3 – Second Paragraph. The RTC only voted to change the Denton County portion of SH 121 to a toll road in October 2004. The Collin County portion of SH 121 was not voted to be modified at this time. The correct date is January 2007 when the Mobility 2030 Plan was adopted by the RTC.
17. Page 3 – Second Paragraph. The City of Frisco is **not** in support of the SH 121 as a toll road. See attached Resolution 06-04-75R. (Attachment # 2A) Please modify this paragraph and all other paragraphs as necessary to accurately reflect each city’s support of this toll road. Each city had a specific resolution and specific type of support or non-support regarding SH 121 as a toll road. It would be helpful to include these in the EA in the Appendix in order to accurately reflect the cities’ official position on this proposed toll road.
18. Page 3 – Second Paragraph. There have been several large public meetings and public comment periods regarding this project. None of the comments regarding the support/opposition of this toll road is included in the EA. NCTCOG and TxDOT both participated in this process. Please include this information to accurately reflect the support/opposition of the public regarding the toll road.
19. Page 3 – Third Paragraph. The small amount of gasoline funds for the main lanes is not planned on being reallocated in this project. Only “Excess toll revenue funds up front and over time” are planned to be utilized. Please modify this paragraph accordingly.
20. Page 3 – Third Paragraph. This paragraph needs to be rewritten. It does not match the RTC “Texas Metropolitan Mobility Plan – Excess Toll Revenue Sharing Policy” which states that “*Excess revenue from individual toll project shall be placed in county-specific accounts and prorated based on the residential county of all toll payers on all toll roads. Revenue from eastern and western subregion toll users will result in an adjusted split of Category funds. This adjustment will be made to the eastern and western category funding allocation at the time of its implementation. These funds can be used to fund future projects either on or off the State system.*” These funds will not be used solely to fund the projects for the same transportation system users as on SH 121 in Collin County as stated in the document. They will also be used to fund projects in Denton, Tarrant, and Dallas County since there are toll roads that extend currently across the region and toll road users from each of those counties.
21. Page 4 – Under the Objectives of the project, it states that one of the primary objectives of the proposed toll facility is to create a revenue source to fund future capacity improvements along the corridor. What capacity improvements are planned as part of the Cintra contract? Since the project is LOS F in 2030 is Cintra required to add capacity to the main lanes prior to this time frame? Since this is a 50 year agreement, what thresholds are established to remove congestion such as was immediately evident along the

President George Bush Turnpike (PGBT) when it opened recently and it was not widened? With air quality conformity issues in the region, how would any widening occur? It is my understanding, that this is one of the reasons PGBT has not been allowed to widen their single occupancy lanes. If this similar situation would occur in the SH 121 corridor, how can this statement be an objective of the project?

22. Page 4 – Under the Objective – I strongly concur with the statement that the excess toll revenue should stay in the local area. However, I do not believe this is the direction the RTC and TxDOT are currently going with the policies that are in place. It is also not “near neighbor” by definition.
23. Page 4 - I did not see evidence of “*acceleration of local tax-base growth due to the construction of this project*” included in the Environmental Assessment. Please provide information on how you are making this assumption.
24. Page 5 – How long will it take to get a FONSI for this project?
25. Page 7 – Third Paragraph. “Near Neighbor/Near timeframe” is not being used by TxDOT or the RTC in the SH 121 Collin County project. This paragraph is inaccurate. Projects miles away which have no relevance to the SH 121 traffic patterns could be funded with excess revenue from this toll road since the projects can be located anywhere the four counties and are not limited to the nearness to SH 121 or serving the same transportation users.
26. Page 7 – Fourth Paragraph. Delete the reference to “*near neighbor/near timeframe.*”
27. Page 8 – Paragraph Two. Since NTTA is only guaranteed to be a provider for the first 5 years of the CDA contract, this could lead to problems with between toll providers in the near future if NTTA does not successfully negotiate as the toll collection services after the first 5 years. This is not in the best interest of the motorist using the facility and could lead to higher charges being paid by the user of the toll road.
28. Page 8 – Paragraph Three. Spell out “ETC”.
29. Page 8 – Paragraph Three. Right of way is not 100% complete. The City of Frisco still owns land along that is not in TxDOT’s name. Please contact the City of Frisco Engineering Department Right of Way Agent, John Manganilla, for further information on how to acquire this land from the City of Frisco.
30. Page 8 – Last Paragraph. Update the costs of the project. You only list the electronic toll components of the project and neglected to list any costs for the construction of the main lanes from Hillcrest to US 75 or the costs of the existing construction from DNT to Hillcrest and/or the service roads from DNT to US 75. This is a significant error in this Environmental Assessment to assume that there is no cost associated with the construction of the main lanes or the interchange at US 75.

31. Page 11 – Last Paragraph. Does anything need to be added about the additional charge for the invoice to this paragraph for the cash transactions? The TxDOT web page lists the charges for these cash transactions. These “post-cash” transactions will also adversely affect the 25% low income population living in the corridor since they will be the most effected. This is the population that does not have electronic toll tags and will be charged a premium for using the proposed toll road. Isn’t this an Environmental Justice issue?
32. Page 11 – Last Paragraph. Does this section need to describe the police/fire/emergency response policy with other agencies using the SH 121 Collin County Toll Road? This will be different than has been historically used on the NTTA facilities and has been a concern raised in the Denton County portion that is already being tolled. A paragraph regarding TxDOT’s operation may be appropriate.
33. Page 12 – First Paragraph. Section 4.3 A more appropriate title may be “Excess Toll Revenue Projects” instead of “Near Neighbor/Near timeframe Projects”
34. Page 12 – Figure 4-2. This figure indicates that the braided ramp for the Stonebriar Mall between Preston and Parkwood will not be built with this project but be “future”. This ramp was committed to be built by the Dallas District Engineer with this project but now is shown in the EA as “future”. When will this ramp be constructed and by whom? This delay will mean the mall traffic will travel through several additional signals and increase congestion and reduce air quality. Were these air quality effect considered with and without the ramp construction?
35. Page 12 – Second Paragraph. The statement about gasoline sales tax is incorrect. The majority of the main lanes costs are being funded from the CDA. Please provide a cost comparison of the CDA costs versus the gasoline sales tax funding in Collin County if you are going to use this analysis.
36. Page 13 – First Paragraph. Clarify the second sentence to state \$700 million in “today’s dollars” or “present value” if you are referencing the Footnote.
37. Page 13 – Second Paragraph. The first sentence is incorrect. The projects would be “Excess Revenue Up Front Payment Projects”. The projects would be identified by the cities and the counties in which the revenue-generating project is located. NCTCOG held the first series of meetings the weeks of February 19 and February 26 with Tarrant, Collin, Denton and Dallas Counties. Each of the CDA Task Forces was provided a summary of the planning elements and RTC Toll Policies. Representatives from cities, counties and other agencies attended each of these meeting to learn about the selection process for these projects. Projects are anticipated to be selected this summer for the “up front funding”. Delete the reference to “near neighbor/near timeframe”.
38. Page 14 – Describe the Public Hearing process in Detail which occurred on February 26th and the comments which were received.

39. Page 15 – Second Paragraph. The Future Land Use Plan/zoning in any city can be modified at any time at the request of a property owner and the approval of the City Council. With all of the non-residential zoning along SH 121, it will be a very long time before it can be absorbed, therefore it may be likely that property owners will be requesting that they be allowed to meet the property demands at that time, which is most likely residential. This is similar to what has occurred in Coppell and Carrollton along the SH 121 corridor.
40. Page 16 – Second Paragraph – the second sentence states that the SH 121 toll is “not” consistent with the areas financially constrained long-range plan known as Mobility 2025. However, it will be in the Mobility 2030 Plan but this document is not anticipated to receive air quality conformity until Spring/Summer 2007. How can TxDOT award the contract to Cintra without air quality conformity? How can work proceed without this? No other City, County or TxDOT project with federal dollars has been allowed to proceed by TxDOT or NCTCOG without completing these two processes.
41. Page 16- Third Paragraph – the long range conformity determination and US DOT TIP are not expected to be approved until the April/May timeframe. How can this Environmental Assessment be approved prior to these documents being approved?
42. Page 16 – Third Paragraph. Has the STIP been approved yet? If not how can the projects proceed to construction?
43. Page 16 – Fourth Paragraph. Where is the location for the highest CO emissions readings in 2011 that you recorded?
44. Page 17 – Congestion Management System. Why are no other improvements other than the grade separations listed for this section? There are numerous CMAQ, ITS, vanpooling, signal hardware upgrades, intersection improvements, deceleration lanes, left turn lanes, signal retiming, new signal installations, sustainable development & transit oriented development is extremely strong in Frisco and Plano as well as these programs are almost all listed in the TIP. New signal timing is being implemented along the SH 121 corridor which is not listed in the EA. Why was all of this information not listed in the Environmental Assessment?
45. Page 18 – Table 5-2. The year the grade separation was constructed/implemented at Preston & SH 289 was 2006.
46. Page 18 – Table 5-2. The year the Hillcrest grade separation should be verified with TxDOT but it hasn't been construction to date, therefore it will be at least a 2007 date.
47. Page 18- Table 5-2. The year of implementation of the McKinney system should be verified with McKinney. The implementation year you list may be from the TIP and not necessarily the year of construction.

48. Page 19 – Chart is illegible to the left side of the graph.
49. Page 20 – Last paragraph. You state that there were no MSATs found to have elevated levels within Dallas County during 2005. What about Collin County?
50. Page 20 – Table 5-3. Should this data be updated to 2006 information?
51. Page 21 – Second Paragraph. According to your information, populations living near major roadways had generally lower income and education levels. However, you did not study residential housing within the 500 m corridor. However, there are residential areas within these boundaries. Since you state that the wind direction and speed affects this, what studies were done to see what increase effect would the toll road have on the residents of Frisco (and the other communities) along Snowhill Drive near the vicinity of SH 121 between Independence and Custer? Were any specific locations studied regarding elevated pollution levels due to this issue? There are residents in the vicinity and due to the wind speed and direction that should be affected by this construction. What other residential locations should be studied if any?
52. Page 22 – You state that you used the same area used in the Major Investment Transportation Study (MIS) or alternatives analysis. You state you used three scenarios all for the year 2030. However, all of your traffic volumes were generated for 2025. Shouldn't these traffic volumes match to compare emissions? Otherwise you are comparing 2030 numbers versus 2025 numbers.
53. Page 23 – First paragraph – same comment as above regarding 2025 and 2030 years. The years should be consistent.
54. Page 23 – Table 5-6. Are any of these MSAT produced from any of the factories or businesses in existence along SH 121 today? If so, were they taken into account in these calculations?
55. Page 24 – Second Paragraph. Define CEQ.
56. Page 26 – First Paragraph – Define PM10 and PM2.5.
57. Page 27 – Table 5-7. What air toxics were studied as part of this re-assessment? What air toxics exist in the corridor? What air toxics will increase as a result of the SH 121 toll road?
58. Page 28 – Second Paragraph. Define RFG.
59. Page 28 – Second Paragraph. Define CAA.
60. Page 28 – Second Paragraph. Define PM.

61. Page 28 – Last paragraph. You state that overall the minority population of the project area represent 23.3 percent of the total population. This is a significant portion of the population. How is environmental justice served if these people are required to travel on the “free” frontage roads since they can not afford the toll road? This will also increase congestion and reduce air quality as additional motorists are forced onto the service roads which contain many traffic signals and lower speed limits. These individuals also typically have the oldest, highest polluting vehicles which will now further pollute the air at each signal they must stop. As you state on the top of page 31, the economic impact to these low-income residents would represent a higher percentage of household income than for non-low income households. The service roads are also at LOS F which is gridlock.
62. Page 32. Paragraph Five. You state that the toll rates for SH 121 would be consistent with the other toll rates in the region. This is not correct. The toll rate for SH 121 is set at 14.5 cents (avg) with permitted 17 cents for peak hour while toll tag users on DNT currently pay around 10.5 cents. Also with the increases projected by the CDA, it is unlikely the NTTA rates will also escalate at the same rate as the CDA. Therefore this statement is not correct.
63. Page 33. First Paragraph. You state that the SH 121 frontage roads as well as the local arterial roadways like Legacy, Lebanon, Hedgecoxe, Main/FM 720, McKinney etc are available to provide non-tolled alternatives. At the public hearing these were also stated as alternatives to not paying the tolls. However, no analysis exists in the Environmental Assessment that indicates the impact to these local roads and the impact to the local governments as a result of the conversion of this freeway from a “free road” to a “toll road”. The public was not provided this information. The travel time is stated to be greatest at peak hours of travel when traffic congestion within the SH 121 corridor would be greatest. This amount of time is also not provided. Please quantify these times.
64. Page 33 – First Paragraph. The travel time is stated to be greatest at peak hours of travel when traffic congestion within the SH 121 corridor would be greatest. This amount of time is also not provided. Please provide this information in time and cost per person for this travel time. Since the low income resident is most affected environmental justice issues should be considered. NCTCOG recently provided as part of the CDA Task Force the “Unmet 2030 Peak Hour Demand” which indicates a number of roadways that are in the vicinity have high “unmet peak hour demands.” See Attachment # 3. These unmet demands create the need for extra many lanes of arterial streets to be built in already constrained areas. The additional lanes are not physically possible. However, the EA does not address this need and the environmental justice issues it creates.
65. Page 33 - Second Paragraph. How did TxDOT intend to achieve the visitor, rental car, and out-of-state person that aren't familiar with the system that has been discussed for the past two years? There is nothing in this section of the EA discussing this issue.

66. Page 34 – Third Paragraph. What is the maximum additional percent premium charge allowed by the CDA? What is the maximum processing fee allowed? Is interest charged on the monthly bill if unpaid? What is the minimum threshold for a bill to be sent for a “cash” person that travels SH 121 without a toll tag?
67. Page 34 – Fifth Paragraph. Since many low-income residents do not have credit cards, may not have bank accounts, and are reluctant to have prepaid accounts due to a variety of reasons such as illegal immigrant status etc. this higher toll rate negatively affect their socioeconomic class. Since 25% of the population living in the vicinity of SH 121 are low-income and the tolls are expected to rise with inflation each year, this will over time become even more pronounced. How was this analyzed? Please quantify this effect over time as tolls are increased and as the peak hour tolling is implemented. Explain the adverse impact to the low-income and how this is not an Environmental Justice issue since these people are most affected by this issue.
68. Page 34 – Sixth Paragraph. At the time this EA was printed, the statement about CCART not having regularly scheduled trips in the service area was incorrect. Frisco has contracted with them for the past several years to provide a fixed route throughout the City. This service was recently voted on to be discontinued in May 2007. A transit study will be performed to determine future needs of transit throughout the City. Plano is a member of DART. According to the DART website, bus service exists currently just south of SH 121 in the Legacy Business Park.
69. Page 35 – First Paragraph. What is the policy for fire/police/emergency vehicles on the proposed toll road? Since issues have arisen on the Denton County portion of the SH 121 toll road, shouldn't the TxDOT policy/practice be noted and its effect on these local agencies in the EA?
70. Page 35 – Second Paragraph. Should the fact that the impact to the local cities to pay for the construction and maintenance of the high mast lighting on the toll road be mentioned in the EA since this cost is being required to be paid for by the local agencies instead of Cintra? This is a double taxation to the motorists.
71. Page 35 – Third Paragraph. You state that the existing commercial and industrial land uses are likely to continue developing more densely adjacent to the proposed toll facility. State your rationale for this statement. Frisco has no plans to change its zoning due to the toll road adoption. Have you discussed this with other city planning departments in order to come to this determination?
72. Page 36 – Third Paragraph. The third sentence states that “*It is anticipated that development opportunities along the SH 121 facility would be facilitated by the proposed implementation of tolling.*” However the remainder of the paragraph states that the implementation of the tolling does not influence the development and that development would occur whether or not SH 121 toll road occurred and it does not effect the population density nor growth rate. Therefore, the “*italics*” sentence above contradicts

the remainder of the paragraph and should be eliminated. The proposed SH 121 toll road will not negatively nor positively affect the development in the corridor.

73. Page 36 – Fourth Paragraph. The first sentence needs to be rewritten. There are no “near neighbor/near timeframe” projects for the Collin County SH 121 Project. Since it is unknown at this time, where these projects will be located, it is unclear whether these projects will influence the cities immediately adjacent to the SH 121 area.
74. Page 36 – Fourth Paragraph. The Mobility 2030 Plan contains the SH 121 Collin County toll road; however, the traffic model used for this Environmental Assessment was the Mobility 2025. This is inconsistent with the Financially Constrained Plan. The Collin County portion of SH 121 is not in the 2025 Plan, it is only in the 2030 Plan.
75. Page 37 – First Paragraph. There are no Near Neighbor/Near Timeframe projects. All projects are “Excess Toll Revenue” with 75% up front funding and 25% over time as determined by the RTC.
76. Page 37 – Second Paragraph. *“A potential indirect impact of tolling could be an increase of traffic through neighborhoods as a result of motorists trying to avoid the toll.”* I concur with your statement. The NCTCOG 2030 “Unmet Peak Hour Demand” on the arterial street systems demonstrates that the traffic is attempting to cut through arterial streets since the SH 121 main lanes are also over capacity. What solution for the main lanes of SH121 and the local cities do you propose to avoid this congestion and air quality issue? If the roadway is a “free” roadway it is more likely that the motorist will stay on SH 121, however, since it is proposed to be a “toll” road, people are more likely to exit the “toll road” and divert to another “free road” rather than sit in gridlock and pay for that service.
77. Page 37 – Fourth Paragraph. Since SH 121 is diagonal and the arterials are primarily north and south, there exists inefficiency for motorists to avoid the SH 121 and travel parallel routes. However, they are traveling parallel routes as predicted from the 2025 Mobility modeling in Appendix C. The frontage road with diamond interchanges which have long cycle lengths with long delays and unmet demands as well lead motorists also to use arterials in the adjacent cities. What analysis was done to determine how TxDOT will address the needs of the local communities as a result of the impact of this toll road diversion? Please quantify this delay and cost to the motorists. What is the impact to air quality?
78. Page 37 – Fourth Paragraph. What toll increase scenarios were considered and modeled as part of this Environmental Assessment? Was only 15 cents per mile analyzed for 2025? You state that *“the potential for increased congestion along the frontage roads (and I believe also the other arterials) over time as the traffic demand for the non-toll option increase is also an indirect impact of tolling.”* If you only considered 15 cents per mile in 2025, then all of the traffic volumes would not be correct for 2025 since your statement about traffic demand would drive motorists to seek non-toll options as the tolls

increase. By 2025, the toll rates would be higher than 15 cents under the Cintra contract. Therefore shouldn't all of the traffic volumes be recalculated with Mobility 2030 numbers and the correct escalation of toll rate assumptions in the Cintra contract?

79. Page 37 – Fourth Paragraph. You state that *“Increased congestion may result in air quality implications as the proposed project is located in Collin County, which is part of the EPA’s designated eight-hour, nine county non-attainment area for pollutant ozone.”* What implications? If this is correct, then what air quality implications exist as a result of the proposed Cintra toll rates in year 2030? At the end of the proposed Cintra 50 year contract? Shouldn't all of these issues been addressed as part of the Environmental Assessment given the EPA's concern and the non-attainment area in Collin County?
80. Page 38 – First Paragraph. You state that a family living at or under the poverty level would still make 250 round-trips per year and spend \$455 per year or 2.2% of their household income on the proposed SH 121 toll road. Is this assumption correct? If you are living on poverty with your family, would you spend 2.2% of your family's gross income on toll fees? Most City of Frisco employees who are lower income, but not at poverty levels, have already stated that they can not afford the proposed toll road. How is this assumption relevant if the poverty person can not afford the luxury of spending \$455 of his gross income on tolls?
81. Page 38 – First Paragraph. In order for Frisco and other cities in the corridor to attract businesses, they must hire employees for the service sector and support staff. This sector employment market is greatest effected by the toll road and its cost to use it. Businesses may choose to locate to other cities or states due to the negative transportation cost. How was the economic impact to the adjacent communities as the toll costs continue to rise analyzed? Also, given that Plano & Frisco will be surrounded by toll roads, this should also be considered as a factor.
82. Page 38 - First Paragraph. According to the FHWA website, on February 11, 1994, President Clinton signed Executive Order 12898: Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations. The Executive Order requires that each Federal agency shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, administer and implement its programs, policies, and activities that affect human health or the environment so as to identify and avoid "disproportionately high and adverse" effects on minority and low-income populations. **Adverse Effects** as defined by the FHWA website means *“the totality of significant individual or cumulative human health or environmental effects, including interrelated social and economic effects, which may include, but are not limited to: bodily impairment, infirmity, illness or death; air, noise, and water pollution and soil contamination; destruction or disruption of man-made or natural resources; destruction or diminution of aesthetic values; destruction or disruption of community cohesion or a community's economic vitality; destruction or disruption of the availability of public and private facilities and services; vibration; adverse employment effects; displacement of persons, businesses, farms, or nonprofit organizations; increased traffic congestion, isolation, exclusion or separation of minority*

or low-income individuals within a given community or from the broader community; and the denial of, reduction in, or significant delay in the receipt of, benefits of FHWA programs, policies, or activities.” **Don’t the toll costs with the allowed escalation factors, plus peak hour tolling, with ALL electronic tolling and no ability to pay cash, and NO true parallel route without traveling the frontage road with a LOS F during the peak hour adversely affect the low-income population living in the corridor? Please explain how this does not meet the definition of Adverse Effect.**

83. Page 38 - The Business Terms for State Highway 121 in Collin and Denton Counties which were included in the Appendix which state under item #1 that the “*maximum weekday peak period toll rate in 2010 is 17 cents/mile. The weekday peak period is currently defined as 6:30 am to 9:00 am and 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm. The RTC would need to approve any changes to this definition.*” Were the traffic volumes simulated during peak hours with this rate since the rate directly affects the poverty and low income decision to use this road? With peak hour increase in the toll directly negatively influences their ability to have access to this road with the higher toll rates during peak hours during the same time the 25% of the population in the area desires to use the roadway. Since the frontage roads are at LOS F, they are not a viable alternative. Is this not creating an Environmental Justice issue?
84. Page 38 – Second Paragraph. The Cities of McKinney, Allen and Frisco are capped at the maximum sales tax and cannot join a transit provider without the cap being raised on the sales tax. The City of Plano is a member of DART.
85. Page 38 – Third Paragraph. You state that “*potential for increased congestion along the frontage roads may also have an impact on commercial properties in terms of access to commercial services and places of employment.*” How was this determined? From reviewing the traffic volumes on the frontage roads they are over capacity in many locations and will be affected especially during peak hours which are the same as the peak hours of many commercial/retail developments. Since the majority of the cities have already developed and/or have zoned the land surrounding SH 121 as commercial/retail, what solutions were studied as part of this environmental assessment? You state that the LOS for the frontage roads is F in 2025. This is gridlock and will have a significant negative impact on the development and/or redevelopment of the surrounding land uses. However, you do not address any solutions to the impact of diverting traffic from the main lanes to the frontage roads which contributes to this decline.
86. Page 40 – Second Paragraph. Define RSA. Resource Study Area?
87. Page 43 – What future developments are anticipated that would likely remove woodland areas within the main lane construction? The majority of the vacant land adjacent to the proposed corridor is agricultural in nature or has already been cleared due to the frontage road construction.

88. Page 44 – Table 5-11. Change the “near neighbor/near time frame” to “Excess Toll Revenue” in each category.
89. Page 44 – Table 5-11. Under Air Quality you state “*Decrease in congestion on tolled mainlanes would likely benefit air quality.*” However, in the traffic volumes provided in Appendix C, the volumes exceed the capacity in peak hours; therefore this statement is not true since this is the time of day that typically the region exceeds ozone and other air quality measures. This statement should be eliminated.
90. Page 44 – Table 5-11. Under Environmental Justice you state that low income individuals “may” be impacted. Shouldn’t the terminology be “will” instead of “may” given the impact on an average family of \$20,000? For example if they lived in McKinney and worked at DFW Airport as a custodian at one of the hotels, there are few routes for them to go to their place of employment. What would be their total cost as a “cash” payer to work a normal work-year versus the typical “toll tag” person? The ETC system detrimentally affects this type of person and also affects where this person can obtain a job. Many of the jobs at the DFW Airport are low-income jobs but there are few ways to attract these types of lower income jobs and low-income residents/employees. The implementation of the ETC without any cash option will adversely impact this population and these minority businesses. Please clearly explain how you can use the word “may” instead of “will” or change the word to “will”.
91. Page 44 – Table 5-11. Until the funding for the “Excess Toll Revenue” is determined to be located, this is not a true statement. From reviewing the NCTCOG’s Mobility 2030 Unmet Peak Hour Demand, to make this statement true, the funding from the Excess Revenue will need to be assigned to relieve these overburdened roadways and then the model “rerun” to determine if this statement can be made in the Environmental Assessment. Until then, it is not a true statement.
92. Page 46 – First Paragraph. Change the “near neighbor/near timeframe” to “Excess Toll Revenue”
93. Page 46 – Second Paragraph. Land development has developed slower according to our Planning Department than when it is freeway. A comparison would be the DNT compared to US 75.
94. Page 47 – Third Paragraph. Change the “near neighbor/near timeframe” to “Excess Toll Revenue”
95. Page 48 – First Paragraph. TxDOT eliminated the STEP funding. The Frisco Planning Department requests additional funding for hike/bike trails to continue in the corridor.
96. Page 48/49 – I do not see any specifics on air quality mentioned regarding SH 121. These are merely boiler plate pages. With the volume of traffic predicted, please explain the air quality issues of SH 121 in 2030.

97. Page 50/51 – I do not see anything specific regarding Environmental Justice. These are merely boiler plate pages. You state that NCTCOG does not have information available at this time regarding environmental justice. Shouldn't TxDOT have performed this study since the toll rates will escalate each year and start 50% higher than NTTA's current toll rate?
98. Page 51 – The statement regarding the frontage roads is incorrect. The frontage roads are not part of this environmental assessment. All of the frontage roads between US 75 and the DNT are currently open to traffic. If you are discussing "wealthy" income then this is a true statement, they can drive the main lanes. However, isn't the purpose of this section of the EA to discuss Environmental Justice not the wealthy?
99. Page 52 – Under Cumulative Impacts you site the US Census Bureau as this Study Area having "*some of the high median household income and lower poverty rates in the state of Texas, if not the nation.*" However, 25% of the population is low income as you state on Page 34. This population will not be able to afford the toll road. The SH 121 frontage roads are also over capacity during peak hours (and beyond) according to NCTCOG's 2030 model of Unmet Peak Hour Demand therefore this will not be a viable solution as you proposed. The frontage roads can not be expanded. What other solutions do you propose?
100. Page 53 – Third Paragraph. Why did you assume 14.5 cent toll for 2030? Doesn't the Cintra contract state that toll rates will increase each year with inflation? Are no toll rates assumed by TxDOT or Cintra until 2030? Isn't the amount \$60.75 unlikely given this fact? If normal inflation factors were used, that would this amount be in 2030? Please quantify this amount.
101. Page 53 – Fourth Paragraph. While SH 121 is only one of many proposed new toll roads, you note that 30 percent of the proposed transportation network will be toll roads in the metroplex. How will this large percentage of toll roads affect the low income population and environmental justice cumulative? This is a significant shift in transportation availability to the low income and poverty percentage in the metroplex. How will this affect their ability to obtain jobs and get to and from work? Please quantify this impact.
102. Page 54 – Origin/Designation analysis were performed by TxDOT as part of the CDA process. The City of Frisco participated in allowing TxDOT consultants perform surveys on Frisco roadways as part of these studies. Why were these studies now not included in the EA?
103. What other studies were done to assist the CDA processes that are not included in this EA that would benefit the Environmental Assessment analysis and conclusions?

104. Page 55 – You do not discuss the net affect of tolling versus non-tolling on the adjacent city roadways and their LOS. Please provide this information. Please quantify the LOS impact to local arterials.
105. Page 55 – Second paragraph. Please verify your numbers in this paragraph. They seem to be off from my calculations.
106. Page 55 – Fifth Paragraph. The LOS is F for the frontage roads which are unacceptable. The right of way is fixed and cannot be expanded. What solutions do you propose as solutions to this congestion and air quality issue?
107. Page 55 – Fifth Paragraph. You state that LOS F is for the main lanes of SH 121. What solutions do you propose for this congestion and air quality issue?
108. Page 55 – Modify the “Near neighbor/Near Timeframe” to “Excess Toll Revenue”. It is unknown whether these projects will be in the immediate area as stated in the EA. Selection of these projects will not be determined until summer 2007 unlike the Denton County projects which were selected during the EA process. They may or may not be added capacity according to NCTCOG CDA Task Force meetings held recently.
109. Page 56 – First Paragraph. Modify the “Near neighbor/Near Timeframe” to “Excess Toll Revenue”.
110. Page 56 – Second Paragraph. The EA states that “*those who do not use the mainlanes would experience some decline in LOS.*” Define “some decline”. Little factual analysis appears to have been performed as part of this EA. Please quantify this information. From reviewing NCTCOG’s recent 2030 Unmet Peak Hour Demand and looking at some Highway Capacity Manual calculations, it is apparent that this is not “some” but “significant”.
111. Page 59 – Why is the heading “From FM 423 to US 75” if this project is “DNT to US 75”? This is part of the Denton County Project (FM 423 – DNT)
112. Page 62 - Why is the heading “From FM 423 to US 75” if this project is “DNT to US 75”? This is part of the Denton County Project (FM 423 – DNT)
113. Page 66 – No information is provided which answers the environmental justice, noise, air quality, congestion and other quantifiable issues that are created by tolling SH 121. Please provide this information.
114. Appendix A – Why is the map labeled “SH 121 Toll Re-Evaluation from FM 423 to DNT? It was my understanding this Environmental Reassessment was from the DNT to US 75. Only a small portion of the EA discusses anything west of the DNT.

115. Appendix A – Figure 4. What established the boundaries of the MSAT Buffer Study Areas?
116. Appendix B – The first FONSI included is from 1991 – Please state the relevance this FONSI in the Appendix for ease of the reader. I don't believe it is for the construction of the six lane freeway and six lane frontage road projects.
117. Appendix B – The second FONSI included is from 1999 – isn't this from when the asphalt service roads were constructed in the same vicinity as the main lanes? It would be helpful to identify why these documents are pertinent to the Environmental Re-assessment that is being considered today. Please state the relevance of this FONSI in the Appendix for the ease of the reader.
118. Appendix B – The third FONSI included is from 2002 – This appears to be a re-assessment from when the asphalt service roads were constructed in the same vicinity as the main lanes? Please state the relevance of this FONSI in the Appendix for the ease of the reader.
119. Appendix B – The fourth FONSI. Please state the relevance of this FONSI in the Appendix for the ease of the reader.
120. Appendix B – Texas Metropolitan Mobility Plan Excess Toll Revenue Sharing Policy – Does the Policy Item #4 agree with state law regarding how revenue will be split between the Eastern and Western subregions?
121. Appendix B – Texas Metropolitan Mobility Plan Excess Toll Revenue Sharing Policy – Policy Item #5 – Shouldn't projects go to fund to reduce the congestion created by the toll road? For example the up front funding (75%) may not fund projects in the immediate vicinity of the SH 121 toll road. However, from reviewing the EA, the LOS is F for both the main lanes and the frontage roads. Shouldn't the funding be spent on the roads where the traffic is diverted? See NCTCOG "Unmet 2030 Peak Hour Demand" information attached.
122. Appendix B – Where are the trees identified as part of the woodland mitigation planned to be planted? Where were they removed from the main lanes of the project?
123. Appendix C – what is the purpose of including only selected pages of the Mobility 2030 Plan in this Appendix? Pages 9, 13, 14 are the only pages included.
124. Appendix C - What is the purpose of including only selected pages of the Mobility 2025 Plan in this Appendix? Pages XVI-78; XVI-85 and XVI-81 are the only pages included.

125. Appendix C – Gantry Locations. The *future ramp and toll gantry was proposed to be built as part of this construction project in order to serve the Stonebriar Mall. Why is it now not part of this project?
126. Appendix C – the volumes are based on 2025 NCTCOG financially constrained traffic model but the roadway can't be built under this scenario due to air quality conformity. Shouldn't the volumes have been based on the 2030?
127. Appendix C – The total daily volumes on proposed SH 121 main lanes for various locations comparing non-toll 2025 versus toll 2025 there are significant differences in traffic volumes. It is evident from this analysis that traffic is diverting from the toll road to alternative routes, yet no analysis of the impact to the local street systems and the needs of those communities is provided in this Environmental Assessment. **The diverted volume ranges from approximately 25,000-45,000 vehicles per day depending on the section of SH 121. This is the basic need for another 4-6 lane parallel arterial route.**

128. Appendix C – The total daily volumes on proposed SH 121 frontage roads for various locations comparing toll versus non-toll from the 2025 NCTCOG Financially Constrained Traffic Model are provided in Appendix C. It is evident from this numbers that traffic is diverting from the toll road to the frontage roads as well as other alternative routes as stated in the Environmental Assessment document and during the Public Hearing. However, no traffic analysis of the delay caused by this diversion to the frontage road traffic and the air quality issues which will be created is analyzed in the

EA. No parallel routes that are listed in the Environmental Assessment are studied for their effect for the congestion, air quality, increased delays and travel times, as well as cost to the motorist due to this travel time delay if the road would have remained as a freeway versus a toll road. The lack of analysis of these parallel routes creates a burden of additional traffic on local city streets and the frontage road which may cause the streets to be reconstructed earlier than anticipated and higher congestion on these facilities than otherwise anticipated. **The diverted volume ranges from approximately 25,000-45,000 vehicles per day depending on the section of SH 121. This is the basic need for another 4-6 lane parallel arterial route.**

From comparing the volume differentials of toll versus non-toll only some of the traffic is diverted to the service roads. Therefore the remainder of the traffic has chosen an alternate route as suggested in your Environmental Analysis. Some of the volumes between non-toll and toll are significant and the order of magnitude of another parallel arterial need. Since the majority of Plano is already built out as shown in the NCTCOG 2030 model and few other cities in the surrounding area can accommodate this additional traffic on their parallel system, what is TxDOT's proposed solution to this diversion of traffic?

129. Appendix C – There is a number of traffic volumes that are incorrect by comparison from today’s traffic volumes to proposed traffic volumes and/or ultimate capacity. It appears that no validation was done on some of the arterial streets and other roadways from today’s traffic volumes. The basis of my conclusions is from the City of Frisco traffic counts which are available to the public and are attached for your review. (Attachment #4) The Ohio traffic volume is almost 50% less from the non-toll to toll scenario. Why is this volume so much lower? Is the Preston Overpass coded correctly as a 4 lane overpass? Why is the Parkwood volume so low? Today’s counts are significantly higher and all of the development and roadway system has not been completed yet so the traffic will continue to grow over time. I did not verify the other cities traffic counts and volumes for the future but would recommend that these also be validated to insure that there are not miscoding of links for speed or number of lanes that could be affecting the assignment of trips in the vicinity.

130. Appendix C – the ramp configurations for some of the Denton County 2025 modeling for the EA Re-Evaluation between Spring Creek Parkway and Plano Parkway was incorrect. Please see the attached Attachment #3 Pages 3 and 4 obtained from the “Keep it Moving” TxDOT Website regarding the schematic for this project. The model in Denton County EA indicated for westbound traffic an entrance ramp, then an exit ramp. However, the schematic shows an exit ramp then two entrance ramps between Spring Creek Parkway and Plano Parkway. If this mistake was also used in the Collin County EA Re-Assessment, the traffic volumes should change in the western end of the Collin County portion of this EA.



Appendix C – The unmet demand during the peak hour was not analyzed as part of the Environmental Assessment but during the CDA Excess Revenue Task Force meetings NCTCOG held during the weeks of February 19th and 26th, NCTCOG provided the attached “Unmet peak hour 2030 demands in the SH 121 corridor”. This analysis

indicates that the diversion from the freeway to toll road has a detrimental effect on the adjacent roadway system that was not studied as part of the EA and will result in delay, congestion and air quality issues. For example during the peak hour on SH 121 in 2030 (I'm not sure what toll rate was assumed to get these volumes by NCTCOG) the unmet demand on SH 121 near Parkwood is 5091 vehicles in the Eastbound direction and 5131 vehicles in the Westbound direction which is equivalent to needing 3 additional lanes in the eastbound direction and 3 additional lanes in the westbound direction for the peak hour traffic for a total of 12 lanes of traffic if you assume a lane capacity is 2100 during the peak hour for a toll road. I don't believe you can add the necessary capacity to the toll road to meet this demand and therefore additional vehicles will divert to the local arterial roadways to avoid the gridlock of SH 121.

I hope that I have addressed the majority of the points in the Environmental Assessment document you have provided. Given the short time period after the public hearing to provide this information to you, I hope that my comments are helpful in insuring that the process meets all the federal and state requirements. 


NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will conduct a Public Hearing for the proposed tolling of State Highway (SH) 121 main lanes from the Dallas North Tollway (DNT) to United States (U.S.) 75 for a length of approximately 12.5 miles in Collin County. The project is adjacent to the Cities of Plano, Frisco, Allen, McKinney and the Town of Fairview. The purpose of this Public Hearing is to discuss the proposed tolling of the SH 121 main lanes within the project corridor that are currently in various stages of construction. The Public Hearing will be held on Monday, February 26, 2007 at Legacy Church, 4501 Legacy Drive, Plano, Texas 75024. Prior to the Public Hearing, an Open House will be held from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m., to allow for questions and review of project exhibits. TxDOT staff will be available to answer questions during the Open House. The Public Hearing will begin with a formal presentation at 7 p.m., followed by the public comment period.

There are no proposed changes to the footprint, locations or sizes of the previously designed ramps and main lanes. The proposed tolling of SH 121 would not require additional right-of-way, displacements or relocations. As proposed, the toll facility would consist of a six lane controlled access facility with three lane continuous frontage roads. Although the mainlanes of SH 121 are proposed for tolling, the frontage roads would remain as a non-toll alternative to the proposed toll facility. The proposed project would encroach in to the 100-year floodplain; however the improvements would not increase the base flood elevation to a level that would violate applicable floodplain regulations and ordinances.

An environmental re-evaluation has been prepared to research and identify potential changes to the natural, social, and economic environment that could occur as a result of implementing the proposed toll facility. The environmental re-evaluation, maps, and other drawings depicting the proposed project location and geometric design will be displayed at the Public Hearing. This and other information about the project are on file and available for inspection and copying at the TxDOT Dallas District Office located at 4777 East Highway 80, Mesquite, Texas 75150. Other locations where this information is located include: The TxDOT Collin County Area Office, 2250 South State Highway 5, McKinney, Texas 75069; City of Plano, Transportation Engineering Department, 1520 Avenue K, Plano, Texas, 75074; City of Frisco, Engineering Services Department, 6101 Frisco Square Boulevard, 3rd Floor, Frisco, Texas, 75034; City of McKinney, Public Works Department, 222 North Tennessee Street, McKinney, Texas, 75069; City of Allen, Engineering Department, 305 Century Parkway, Allen, Texas, 75013; Town of Fairview, Town Engineer, 500 South Highway 5, Fairview, Texas 75069.

All,

Good afternoon. As promised below, I wanted to give ample time for us all to study any additional model run information prior to our meeting on Friday, March 9th regarding the proposed Memorial Drive extension. Attached are two PDF plots which display year 2030 daily volumes for the area surrounding The Colony, west Frisco, and west Plano. One plot simulates a "Build" condition for the Memorial Drive extension, and the other indicates a "No-Build" condition. The network assumed in the "Build" condition is our year 2030 air quality conformity network developed for Mobility 2030: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan, which was approved by the Regional Transportation Council in January. This network indicates State Highway (SH) 121 as a toll road from US 75 in McKinney to the west end of Business SH 121 in Lewisville, and all mainlane links are tolled at 15 cents per mile (except between Parkwood Boulevard and Legacy Drive, and between Hebron Parkway and Interstate Highway 35E). The only difference between the "Build" and the "No-Build" network is the removal of the one link for Memorial Drive connecting Morningstar Drive to Spring Creek Parkway (at its intersection with Town and Country Boulevard). I've also attached an Excel spreadsheet with this e-mail that indicates the differences in volume on affected north-south and east-west roadway corridors in the area, including the SH 121 frontage roads and mainlanes. To make calculations easier, I've rounded volumes on all roadways to the nearest hundred.

In our previous meeting, a question was raised in regards to the volumes displayed on the turning movement diagram I had prepared. Indeed, the volumes on the diagram were different than the volumes NCTCOG provided to TxDOT for the schematics prepared in the SH 121 Denton County Environmental Re-Evaluation. The SH 121 document used 2025 volumes from the model run prepared for Mobility 2025: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan – 2004 Update. The model run was developed using our old Texas A&M Mainframe model, and the network only assumed tolls for the Denton County portion of SH 121. The model runs used to create the turning movement diagrams in our last meeting were based on conformity networks developed for Mobility 2025: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan – Amended April 2005. Those model runs were performed in TransCAD and they were the baseline runs NCTCOG used in early 2005 preparing for the initial toll feasibility study on SH 121 in Collin County. Those model runs also assumed tolls only for the Denton County portion of SH 121 because no formal decision had been made to implement tolls in Collin County. Since Federal funds were indicated in the TIP for the Memorial Drive extension, by protocol I had to use "Amended April 2005" conformity models to forecast traffic for the project.

Again, the model results I'm sending today are now based on Mobility 2030. The model includes updates that were made to the network in 2005 and 2006, including additional background arterial links and further input from TxDOT regarding ramp locations and tolls on SH 121. The volumes from the "Build" model run would be consistent with the volumes given to TxDOT for the SH 121 Collin County Environmental Re-Evaluation.

Please let me know if you have any questions or comments regarding the volume plots, the spreadsheet, or any other information. I hope the volumes shown in this format will be easier to digest compared to the turning movement diagrams from our last meeting. I also hope that I can answer a majority of your questions or concerns






WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Frisco, Texas previously approved Resolution No. 06-02-29R which supports SH 121 being constructed as a toll road by the North Texas Tollway Authority with any excess revenues following the Denton County SH 121 model by being shared by the cities adjoining SH 121 and the county for transportation projects;

WHEREAS, the Regional Transportation Council (RTC) and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) have gone forward with seeking a Comprehensive Development Agreement (CDA) for SH 121;

WHEREAS, certain members of the RTC have indicated that excess revenue generated by SH 121 tolls should be shared by the entire region in direct conflict with the RTC policy adopted for the Denton County section of SH 121; and

WHEREAS, certain TxDOT associated officials and RTC members have indicated that toll rates on the Collin County Section of SH 121 should be set higher than needed to pay for SH 121 construction and associated costs in order to yield more excess revenues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRISCO, TEXAS:

Section I. The Council of the City of Frisco, Texas hereby rescinds Resolution No 06-02-29R.

Section II. The City Council does not support the construction of SH 121 as a toll road at the present time.

Section III. The City Council remains open to discuss the future of SH 121 with the Regional Transportation Council and the Texas Department of Transportation.

Section IV. This Resolution shall become effectively immediately upon its passage.






Denton County 2030 Unmet Peak Hour Demand



Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Re-Evaluation for Proposed Toll Facility SH 121: From Dallas North Tollway To US 75, and the schematic. It is important to keep this project moving forward for the benefit of the region. The City of Allen is in support of the schematic with the following recommended refinements:

1. Move the SH 121 north/eastbound exit ramp to Stacy Road to the west to maximize access to the frontage road properties on the south side of the frontage road.
2. Exchange Parkway is planned to cross SH 121 at the following coordinates N532751.30, E2238849.38. There will be jug handle connections between the north/eastbound SH 121 frontage road and Exchange Parkway. The City of Allen has a schematic available for HNTB and TxDOT to review. Attached is the general layout of the intersections. Contact the City of McKinney for the layout of the connection between the south/westbound SH 121 frontage road and Exchange Parkway. Add guide signs to the mainlanes for Exchange Parkway.
3. The Arts Park (aka Arts of Collin County, a governmental agency) driveway is planned for north/eastbound frontage road (see attached). Add cultural guide signs to the mainlanes and frontage roads for the Arts Park (aka Arts of Collin County) using the Custer Road exits and the future Exchange Parkway exits. The text on the guide signs should be "ARTS PARK".
4. The City of Allen has a collector roadway connecting to the north/eastbound frontage road at a point 429 feet northeast along the right of way from the following point: N7099924.114, E2515029.1260 (see attached).
5. Watters Road has been moved to align with Lake Forest Drive. Watters Road in the City of Allen is currently a six-lane divided roadway and will be widened to eight lanes in the future. Add Watters Road to all mainlane guide signage.

6. Chelsea Boulevard is aligned with Hardin Boulevard. Chelsea Boulevard in the City of Allen is currently a two-lane roadway, and it will be widened to six lanes in the future. Add Chelsea Boulevard to all mainlane guide signage.
7. Move the SH 121 north/eastbound exit ramp to Hardin/Chelsea to the west to maximize access to the frontage road properties on the south side of the frontage road.
8. Move the SH 121 north/eastbound entrance ramp from Lake Forest/Watters to the east to maximize access to the frontage road properties on the south side of the frontage road.
9. Relocate the southbound US 75 exit to Ridgeview Drive north to US 75 Station 660+00. There may be some geometric challenges threading this relocated ramp through the bridge columns. Overcoming these challenges will be offset by relieving the congestion allowing commercial traffic to turn on Shelby Drive in lieu of going through the box at US 75/SH 121 interchange or going through the Ridgeview interchange and doubling back. In addition, the additional cost (if any) associated with the relocation of the ramp may not be as substantial as first anticipated. The retaining wall shown in the schematic near US 75 Station 660+00 may not be necessary giving the wide separation between the southbound US 75 mainlanes and the southbound frontage road. Continue to work through the engineering process to adjust the bent locations to accommodate the relocation of the ramp, to minimize congestion at the frontage road box at the US 75/SH 121 interchange, Ridgeview/US 75 interchange, and improve access to the commercial property at the southwest quadrant of the US 75/SH 121 interchange.

By means of this letter TxDOT is respectfully requested to continue working through the engineering process.

Your continued support of transportation projects in the Allen area is appreciated.







I am a private citizen of Frisco. I attended the city council meeting over 1.5 years ago that was addressed by a representative from TXDOT. The information that he gave on how tolling and funding would be handled is radically different from what is being proposed by the state agency at this time. I also wrote a letter to Governor Rick Perry about my concerns about tolling the already funded 121 corridor. The response that I got back that it was a local matter that his office had no authority over. Well based on current proposals and future proposals, both the information from the TX Dot representative and the Governor have amounted to poppy cock. That means they did not stand up to the information they gave at the time. I have lost complete confidence that citizens of local communities have a say in how they spend their tax dollars and can not even trust what is being proposed today. Some high level commissioner may decide down the road that the money will be diverted for some other state needs. This can not be disputed as we were told that all excess revenues would go to accelerate funding for unfunded county projects such as widening roads such as 423 from the Colony to HWY 380. Other roads in Collin county as well. This is desperately needed as it took me 65 minutes to travel 3.8 miles from frontage road 121 to Lebanon road at 5:30 PM. This is today, not 2025 2030 whatever. So what good does it do to make a freeway or toll road that does not allow for you to have mobility north or south due to the constraints of those roads? I bring this up repeatedly because I told my city council to vote for the toll road for the financial impact to leverage building where I live and with my money that I spend to sit in gridlock.
