





#### **Project Purpose:**


The purpose of the project is to improve safety and mobility to accommodate for future traffic volumes along US 80/Spur 557 within the project limits.

#### **Right-of-Way**



#### Proposed Right-of-Way (ROW)

- Approximately 17 acres of new ROW would be required for the proposed project.
- No residential, commercial, or public facility displacements are anticipated.
- All ROW acquisition would be completed in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended.

#### **Environmental Review**



A Traffic Noise Analysis was performed in accordance with TxDOT's (and Federal Highway Administration approved) Guidelines for Analysis and Abatement of Roadway Traffic Noise. Based on the analysis, a noise barrier was determined to be reasonable and feasible at one location and a noise workshop will be held for adjacent property owners.

#### **Section 4(f)**

- No impacts to public parks, recreational areas, or wildlife/waterfowl refuges. A
  programmatic Section 4(f) checklist prepared for each of the two NRHP-eligible historic
  bridges and a de minimis checklist for the Landmark Hill property.
- Proposed right of way required from one National Register of Historic Places-eligible historic site, Landmark Hill property. Determined no adverse impact to the site and coordinated with Texas Historical Commission.

#### **Cultural Resources**

 Replacement of two National Register of Historic Places-eligible historic bridges, County Road 217 at US 80 and Windmill Farms Boulevard at US 80.

#### Waters of the U.S.

 Potential impacts to waters of the U.S., including six intermittent streams and two perennial streams. Impacts would be authorized by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers under a Section 404 Nationwide Permit 14.
